Pastor's Page

"We Didn't Know We Were Rich"

My mother grew up in the Great Depression. Born in 1927, she lived in East Grand Forks, Minnesota. As I grew up, she...and my grandmother, her mom...told me stories about the 1930's: the hard work, the complete lack of money, the shortage of resources, the things they did to make ends meet.

My father grew up in Gladstone, North Dakota. Born in 1929, he lost his mother at the age of five in 1934 AND still had to deal with the Dust Bowl and Great Depression. My favorite picture of him as a little kid in the background shows the dryness...extreme dryness...of the prairie in those years. And he told me stories about those years: no shoes, a big family in a tiny house, creating things to do that cost no money, working hard and playing hard.

I have talked with hundreds of people in the communities in which I have lived who lived through the Great Depression and Dust Bowl. I have listened to my aunts and uncles. I have laughed with my friends who were a generation or two generations older than I. The stories of 1936 are to this day stunning to me: dust storms, clouds of locusts, record heat, record cold, delivering babies in the middle of blizzards, crying in the middle of the night, working through the middle of the day, family, poverty, the richness of community.

One of the things that has always struck me through the decades...and even generations...of these conversations is that ONE sentence remains common through a huge percentage of the people I have talked to:

"It was the same for everyone. We didn't know we were poor."

Hmmm....

"We didn't know we were poor."

We have come so far beyond this. Today, we have moved from "We didn't know we were poor."

Our power and wealth as Americans is deep and huge as a culture, but most of us never really think about it. We compare ourselves to our next door neighbors, not our neighbors across the globe. We aren't really aware of the resources at our fingertips that are marks of wealth. Today it may be helpful...and really important...to step back and say, "We didn't know we were rich."

Cars. Houses. Carpet. Food on the table. Jobs. Cell phones. Computers. Clothes. Social Security. Bank accounts...large or small. Heat. Air conditioning. Safety. Quality schools. College or technical educations. Community. Clean water. Political stability.

"We didn't know we were rich."

Every single one of these items listed is a blessing, a blessing that is not experienced...ever...by others in our world. There are two billion people today who do not have access to clean drinking water. Only 1% of the world's population own computers. We have so much stuff that we have to rent storage units...and build extra garages...and figure out where to put the stuff on our Christmas lists.

Rich. Yup, in so many ways we are rich.

So, what do I want you to do with this? At this moment,...nothing. I just want you to be aware of the fact. We are not all rich; some live deeply below the poverty line. Some of us are unbelievably rich. I just want you to know. I just want you to realize. I just want you to remember.

Oh, there is one thing...I just want you to be listening for God's whisper in your life.

"We didn't know we were rich."

And God has blessed us, asking us to bless others.

Council Highlights

From the December 13th meeting.

Treasurer's Report... Income was up in October, and apportionments were made up for the month of September. The approximate amount due for November was \$5100.00 which was not paid. We have not contributed to THRIVE for seven months, including November. The current year to date general fund balance is negative (\$71.27). UMCOC finished November in the positive \$137.36 and \$469.90 for the year. Children First began the fiscal year in September and up \$5141.22 in November and \$8048.42 for the year. Dreams income for November was \$2234.70 bringing the balance to \$78,118.29. Mission revenue was \$13, 240.34 in November with the large portion being for Honduras travel.

- Stewardship & Finance...The following were approved: revised UMCOC budget reflecting the Sign Reimbursement from UMC to UMCOC; Investment Disbursement requests to Health Ministry for support books and "Books for Kids" project at Children First. Denied request to Trustees for money towards a new slide. After hearing a report on the church safety training, attended by two committee members, discussed topics to be considered for church safety, to include: background checks, offering collection/counting/transportation, front office safety. Will request approval from council to move some of the remaining MCCI money to Parsonage Fund with intent to make a balloon payment in January 2018.
- Pastor... Nominations: The process has been really slow this year, but it looks like we are going to have a very strong slate of nominations for 2018. <u>Help Fund</u>: December is always a busy time for Safeway cards. We are now beginning the process for figuring out a different way to distribute the cards. Perhaps we will restrict distribution to specific days and times. The creation of December worship has been a fascinating process as I have released more of this planning to a core of planners. Less of my planning is now meaning that new input is resulting in some very creative and beautiful worship options we have not seen before.

We are seeing really solid participation in all three of the addiction recovery groups meeting here at the UMC. There are two Alcoholics Anonymous and one Narcotics Anonymous groups. Although we have no part in their functioning, we are really proud to be the facility where they meet. We are really excited about how healthy the three groups are right now.

- Staff Parish... A presentation was given by representatives from Children, Youth, and Family Ministry with a proposal for a Christian Education Director position to be developed in 2019. Reviewed the lists of completed and uncompleted staff evaluations.
- Memorials.... The Undesignated Memorials have an account balance of \$672.64.
- Health Ministry... Our committee was approved to receive, \$196.44, from the Investment Fund, for a new project. We have purchased 10 books to give to people with cancer, or their family, to help them navigate the medical, emotional, relational, and spiritual challenges that cancer brings. We have given out 3 books already and will put one in the church library.
- Trustees... Discussion on 12 five foot round tables for Fellowship Hall and 3 rectangular ones for Library and 1 rectangular for just outside Library door. These will be ordered after the end of the year.

Discussion on Security for Church Services the Congregation and Pastor. We are suggesting north door kept locked. We are also looking at card system to open north door.

- Missions... 2018 projects: Send Hope (Honduras), Heifer Project, UMCOR Disaster Response, Dakotas Camping, Tree of Life, Solar Oven Partners, Spearfish Food Pantry, Church World Service Kits, Children First Scholarships, Cornerstone Mission, Bishop's Thanksgiving Offering, Hope Center, United Methodist Special Offerings: Human Relations Day, UMCOR, Native American Day, Peace With Justice Day, World Communion Day, Student Day. In November, these were the offerings given: Pastor's Discretionary Fund \$715, UM Student Day \$112, Solar Oven Project \$100, Bishop's Thanksgiving \$770, Hope Center \$40, Campus Ministries \$208.34, UMCOR Hurricane Relief \$1,095, Food Pantry \$150, VIM Honduras \$10,050.
- Dreams... Continue to discuss how to prioritize and balance tangible and intangible requests.
- Discussion Items... A report on the two-day church safety training that was recently attended by two members was given. The Stewardship & Finance Committee reported that they approved special project requests of \$200 and \$500 for a Health Ministry support book and Children First book project, respectively. These expenses will be paid from the Investment Disbursement fund. A request for a new playground slide was denied.
- Action Items... To complete the requirements of our annual Charge Conference, the following were approved: 2018 General Fund budget, Membership Report, Lay Leadership Development (Nominations) Report. A revised UMCOC budget was approved. Approval was given to transfer \$10,000 from the MCCI Fund to the Parsonage Fund, with intent to make a balloon payment towards our loan. A request from Dreams to provide funding for a new playground slide was approved. This approval included much discussion on how to fund a request for new visual equipment (projectors and screens or TVs) in the sanctuary.
- Learning exercise... The responses to the four Vision Casting questions were approved. Based on priority and similar responses, committees will focus on the following in 2019: Northern Hills Sources of Support, Welcoming/Hospitality, Small Groups.
- Next council meeting is tentatively scheduled for January 17, 2018 at 7:30pm. At this time we are still looking for a council chair and council secretary. Any suggestions can be directed to Pastor Scott or Chris Davis (218-340-5610).


Off to Honduras X 2!
