"Seeking Balance: Bowling Balls"

Imagine yourself carrying a bowling ball. Either you hold it with

both hands and brace yourself as you balance, or you hold it in one hand and balance it by your side. Any way you hold that ball, you have to adjust your balance in a major



way. Now imagine yourself holding two bowling balls – one in each hand. You are now balanced, but the awkwardness of the weight is much more difficult. OK, now

imagine THREE bowling balls, four blowing balls, five! Ready for this image? Now imagine yourself juggling all five of these balls simultaneously! I know, it sounds impossible, and for most of us it IS impossible.

Now translate the word "bowling ball" in your real life. We are trying to balance and juggle "bowling balls" all the time! One "bowling ball" is your family. Another is your job.

Another is your spouse's / significant other's job. Another is your schooling or your children's schooling. Maybe another is your faith, or your finances, or your spare time. Go ahead and name all of your own "bowling balls". Whew! This is really hard work.

Just when you have finally figured out how to keep all of those balls up in the air with your masterful juggling technique, let's add tensions of any sort into this precarious balancing act. What happens to your delicate balance of bowling ball juggling when someone n your




family gets sick? When unexpected financial disaster hits – even a little one? When there's a fight with your parents, your spouse, your boyfriend/girlfriend, your parents, your

Instead of increasing your tolerance of stress "I can do one more thing...and one thing...and one more thing."), lower your tolerance! Instead of forcing yourself to deal with an ever-increasing load of stress, creatively find

ways to let go of your stress. You do not have to schedule every minute of every day full of stuff. Try this – intentionally schedule in some fun and relaxing moments for both you and your family this



summer. Try this – take time off on a regular basis so you can have time to handle what is already on your plate. Try this- just say "no" to those events / meetings / activities that are slowly killing your joy for life. Try this – live more simply and buy less. Requirements for being a Welcome Host

- A desire to serve
- · The ability to smile and say "Hello"
- Make guests feel at home.

Job Description for Welcome Host

- 1. Arrive 20 minutes before the worship service begins.
- 2. Make sure that you are wearing your name tag.
- Remain within sight of the door and welcome area throughout the worship service. Some people arrive late and some leave early. Guests may come at any time.
- 4. Be ready to greet everyone coming and going.
- 5. Make sure that new guests receive a coffee mug!
- Be at the doors at the end of the service to thank people for attending.
- 7. Further instructions are posted in both welcome centers.

Job Description for Sound Technicians

- Arrive at church 45 minutes before the worship service begins (Sat. evening and early service, Sun. morning. For second Sunday service, arrive 20 minutes before service begins.)
- Saturday evening and Early service Sunday, do a sound check with the praise teams.
- 3. 15 minutes before service begins, play either a CD or use Spotify.
- Be very aware of what is happening in the service so that adjustments can be made as necessary.
- Make sure that you are in the tech booth at all times during the service. Just the time that you leave is just the time something needs your attention. (Feedback happens!)
- 6. During the 10:30 service, make sure that you record the service on the CD recorder.
- All training will be given by John Elving, both beginning and advanced. Please make arrangements for that with him.

Requirements for being a Slide Operator

- · How to push the "Go" button on the computer
- . How to use the (+) and (-) keys on the computer keyboard
- · Make guests feel at home.

Job Description for Slide Operators

- 1. Arrive 15 minutes before the worship service begins.
- Turn on the computer in the tech booth. (Instructions will be given to you.)
- Open the SongShow Plus (SSP) program and wait for it to fully load.
- 4. Open the program for the appropriate service.
- 5. Start the announcement slides using the mouse.
- At the beginning of the service, use the mouse to open the beginning slide. (For the 10:30 service, this will be the beginning bells.)
- From then on, pay close attention to the service and advance the slides accordingly using the (+) key. In the case of having to go back to the previous slide, use the (-) key on the keyboard.
- This is a very user friendly program and a 10-15 minute training session will teach you all you need to know to run the slide shows.

Job Description for Lay Readers

- 1. A copy of the Scripture readings will be sent to you ahead of time.
- Practice the readings. Call John Elving if you need help pronouncing difficult names.
- Sit near the front of the church. Check with John Elving to see when the readings are read.
- 4. The microphone will be on!

Council Highlights

May 16, 2018

- Treasurer's Report... General fund income for April was \$42,616.99, but expenses were nearly as high. We purchased the server for \$5396 and paid insurance for the church and parsonage totaling \$3169. March apportionments of \$5050.18 were paid, making our April General Fund expenses \$41,463.34. Apportionments for April were not paid. UMCOC income was \$4510.00 and expenses were \$5079.56, which included \$1651 in upkeep/repairs and \$1587 for insurance. Children First income was \$32,830.93 and total expenses were \$30,264.23. Dreams had an income of \$1542.28 with no expenses. The Dreams balance is \$84,604.14. Parsonage Loan repayment fund income was \$1675.54. Expenses were a loan payment (principle and interest) of \$4000 plus the property tax payment of \$1353.23. The tax payment will be reimbursed and go back into this fund. Mission Giving revenue was \$3540.36 and expenses were \$4158.84. \$1615 was given in camp scholarships.
- > Stewardship & Finance... The requests presented during the April council meeting were approved. These included funding for: church lawnmower, Twice Forty luncheon, Benevolence Fund for a co-op tuition, and new office computer. There was much discussion on the expenses for the Day of Service and how those will be covered. As Care & Outreach is not a functioning committee, but still has a budget assigned to certain expenses, Stewardship & Finance will oversee the finances for the remainder of 2018.
- ➤ Health Ministry... Diabetic Screening planned after the 3 church services on May 19 and May 20. B/P will be taken, also. Will be providing information on NEW Shingles vaccine-Shingrix. Communion Prayer Station Information time- May 22-6:30 P.M. to 7:30 P.M. Health Forum planned Sept. 23, 2018- "Medication Management/Mismanagement." Cancer-Now What? We have given out 11 books in the past 8 months! We ordered 10 more. Caring Meal Ministry provided 14 meals in April.
- Staff Parish... Natasha Letcher will be our Elisha Intern this summer. She will arrive in June. We will be interviewing for the Organist position in the next two weeks and we are planning a celebration on June 3rd, to honor Donna for her years of service to the church. We are currently advertising for the position of Financial Assistant and will be accepting applications until June 1st.
- Worship & Music... Discussed the recent Fifth Sunday Fellowship, including successes and ways to improve it for

the next time. Our next Fifth Sunday Fellowship will be Sunday, July 28 and will be held in Spearfish Park at 9:30 a.m. with a potluck to follow. Discussion of revitalizing a planning team approach to unifying the focus of all three worship services. The need for three people to assume the responsibilities of assigning lay readers for each service (one person in charge of each service).

- Trustees... Getting new quotes for new tables to replace the old damaged ones. We will ask the Dreams Committee for the funds. Quotes for new outside wireless door locks that will be wireless and security lighting around the outside of our church for security team and reasons have been received. These steps are based on a recent after-hours visit with Spearfish Police Department after hours and their recommendations. Purchased new lawn mower for the church.
- <u>Children First...</u> Graduation is 6 pm Thursday, May 24.
 Cleaning is planned prior to the summer program which starts June 4. Enrollment and finances are stable. Thank you for service day contributions to Children First—painting, sand, wood chips, and garden areas.
- Mission... Pastor's Discretionary \$259, Benevolence Fund \$300, Service Sunday \$539, Native Amer. Awareness \$683, Solar Ovens \$250, St. Andrew \$200, UMCOR \$75, Campus Ministries \$899, Artemis House \$100, Food Pantry \$235. The mission focus for May is collecting items for the Tree of Life Ministry in Mission, SD. Linda Garriott, Director, came to speak on the weekend of May 5-6.

> Discussion Items:

<u>Church security update</u> – John Kissack shared the bids he has received on external lighting and door locks. Council requested that John bring these bids back to Trustees for discussion and prioritizing. Stewardship & Finance will be involved with future discussion for available funds. Regarding the locks, we need to be mindful of how we remain a "welcoming" church, while keeping our church secure and minimizing how many keys/fobs are distributed.

<u>Summer schedule</u> – The choir will continue to sing through Sunday, June 3, which is the last day for Donna Golliher to play as church organist. After this date, Summer Choir will begin. Vacation Bible School will be held June 25-29. Sidewalk Sonday School is being discussed. The next 5th Sunday will be celebrated on July 29 in the Spearfish city park at 9:30am.

<u>Elisha Intern</u> – Natasha Lechter will arrive in Spearfish on June 1. She will attend Annual Conference and begin her 10-week schedule on June 10.

<u>Greeters</u> – Karen followed up on last month's offer to recruit and schedule greeters. Response to recruitment was very poor. Suggestion to go back to using the sign-up sheets on clipboards and fill in with the volunteer names.

- Action Items: Service Day expenses Karen Hahn requested that MCCI monies be used to cover the expenses of Service Day. Motion made by Stewardship & Finance. Motion passed.
- Learning/Planning Exercise: Kirk requested that we go back to our committees/teams and ask questions, "What

do we need to work on as a church?", "What are opportunities for improvement?" Suggested we pick three items to work on.

Next meeting: Wednesday, June 20 at 6:30pm. These meetings are open to everyone.

Mission Focus for June: Solar Oven Partners

Partners (SOP) is a
United Methodist
Volunteers in
Mission project that
works to place solar
ovens in the hands
of the poor in
deforested lands.
SOP partners with
the indigenous
church and relief

organizations to help alleviate human suffering and environmental destruction, following the UMVIM motto of *Christian Love in Action!* Your donation will help purchase the oven parts and subsidize the cost for those who buy the ovens. For example, Dominicans can buy an oven for 1000 pesos (about \$20), but the cost of manufacturing the ovens is much greater. Anything you can give will be a huge help!

Currently, SOP is working in the countries of Dominican Republic and Sierra Leone by sending teams who assemble the ovens and instruct workshop participants in how to cook with them. Two or three teams are sent every year, so if you are one who is interested in going, please contact Pastor Scott for more information.

After a planning time, the second SOP team will be working on the Navajo reservation this summer. To fill this growing demand, the "new" main workshop for producing ovens is up and running in Raymond, South Dakota. Teams are needed to help produce ovens in either Raymond or Zeeland, North Dakota. Please consider making a difference by joining a future team, helping to build oven components, or donating to help provide ovens to the poorest families in poor, deforested nations.
