### "The Power of Learning The Art of Growing"

There is a saying I love: "You do not grow old. You become old when you stop growing."

I had one grandparent as I grew up. The other three had passed away years before my birth. Grandma Manda was fascinating. As the second of twenty children, she had experienced the death of three of her siblings in her arms as she assisted her mother in childbirth. She was raised in deep poverty out on the farm in rural Saskatchewan up in Canada and had only a sixth grade education. She came down to the US as an illegal alien in 1920 at the age of 17. Life was really hard. And she figured out how to get through it.

Although her formal education was very limited, Grandma kept learning and growing through much of her life. She learned how to work...hard. She grew in her friendships...lifelong. She learned how to garden...one year there were twenty-nine rows each fifty feet long of just green beans. She grew in her faith...she knew Jesus very personally. She learned how to better can vegetables...thousands of quart jars through the decades. She grew in her parenting relationships. She learned. She grew.

There is a power of learning. There is an art of growing.

"You do not grow old. You become old when you stop growing."

If you are wise, you will allow yourself to be challenged all through the days of your life. For you, my friend, are not done yet.

You are invite to LEARN this year. Whether you are young or old, one of the things that our church specializes in is learning. It is crucial for children to learn the stories of our faith. It is really important for you as an adult to keep learning about how to live in faith. ## Dreams Fund Changes

In October 2013, our church was fortunate enough to go “debt free” as we paid off the debt on the United Methodist Community Outreach Center (UMCOC) property. With that retirement, the Stewardship and Finance Committee created the Capital Needs & Mission Fund, as a way for church members to continue giving towards the needs within AND outside our church.

We wanted to DREAM and see what new opportunities awaited us. Over time, the name of the Capital Needs & Mission Fund changed to the Dreams Fund. Since the creation of this fund, we have been able to: improve our sound system, carpet the sanctuary and Sunday School area, purchase new pew cushions, install an elevator and internal/external signage, support Children First and youth mission trips, and MUCH more.

Most of the above items are “capital needs” items, but the Dreams Fund Committee felt a need for more “community mission” related projects. Keeping in mind the discussion of a community forum, held in 2013, the concept of the Northern Hills Sources of Support (NHSOS) was created; a centrally-located resource center for Spearfish and surrounding communities. The NHSOS requested \$50,000 from the Dreams Fund for start-up fees.

The question of how to decide which requests to the Dreams Fund should be granted based on “capital needs” and “mission” has often been hard to answer. After many lengthy discussions at recent administrative council meetings, a task force was formed to develop a proposal as to how best use the Dreams Fund...how can we take care of our church and needs as well as reach out into the community?

During the August 15 council meeting, the following proposal was presented and approved: As of July 31, the current balance of the Dreams Fund is \$66,161.90. This will be split between “Capital Needs” and “Mission Opportunities”.

1. *Capital Needs* will be overseen by the Trustees and will receive \$10,000 for Emergency Reserve and \$4,161.90, to be used as needed. Trustees will bring requests to council for final approval.
2. *Mission Opportunities* will be overseen by a “revamped” Mission Committee. Northern Hills Sources of Support will receive a \$50,000 pledge (per their request in July), which will be held for up to three years. Missions will receive \$2,000 as

start up money. This money is for mission requests and not part of the Mission-of-the-Month. Missions will bring requests to council for final approval.

3. Distribution of Dreams Fund received between August 1-December 31, 2018:
  - 70% Capital Needs
  - 30% Mission Opportunities

With this separation of the Dreams Fund, the Dreams Committee will dissolve. Those committee members who have time remaining on their terms at the end of the year, will be invited to sit on either the Capital Needs (Trustees) or Mission Opportunities (Mission) Committees. Because the Emergency Fund of \$10,000 had been replenished through the Dreams Fund, a new mechanism will need to be developed to maintain the \$10,000.

Thank you to those of you who have contributed to the Dreams Fund and the work of our church. Your contributions are important and appreciated, and we hope that you will continue to support these new areas of giving.

You've all seen this on our t-shirts. Nice catchy phrase isn't it—"God's Work, Our Hands".

We used it for our service weekend in April of this year.

However, it is something that should have meaning to all of us all the time. How are we serving? Specifically, how are we serving within our body? How are we serving our own church?

We have come to a crossroads in what we can do with sound and video for our services. Tanner Hansen, who served so faithfully for so many years, has gone away to college. He was the only "tech booth" person on Sunday. Unfortunately, he never had a chance to worship himself, always being in the booth for both services on Sunday. Now who will replace him?

We have one person who has stepped up to the plate to learn the intricacies of making the pastor, praise team, lay reader, and others sound good for all worshippers. Here's the rub. We don't want that person to be in the booth all the time. It's not fair to them, their family, and quite frankly, to God if they don't have the

opportunity to worship with the rest of us.

We also have one person who has begun learning how to program the projection system so that we can all see the words to the songs, view the announcements each week, and even see specific things our pastor wants to use for his messages. That still leaves a void for running the program for our services. Is this where you could come in?

Ideally, we need two people in the booth for each service. That amounts to six people per weekend. Could you be one of the many who can help out in this ministry?

We promise that no one will get "stuck" back there and become another Tanner, not having a chance to worship with the corporate body. What we can promise is that when (not if) enough people answer the call to serve, they will be put on a rotation and not be there more than once a month, every three weeks at the most.

All the training you need is available, and free! All it takes is some of your time, a willingness to admit you can learn new things, and most importantly, a willingness to follow the urgings that God puts in your heart to serve. Ephesians 6:7 tells us that we are to "render service with a good will as to the Lord."

If, having prayed about it, God is placing it on your heart to serve Him and the church in this way, please talk to John Elving. He has been praying for you already. As with Abraham and his son Isaac, we know and trust that God will provide.

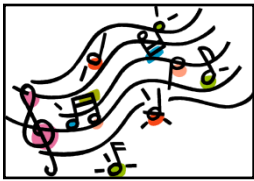
## Lydia Project Get Together

## Council Highlights August 15, 2018

- **Treasurer’s Report...** Total General Fund income for July was \$44,750.97 and expenses were \$44,366.26, leaving a difference for the month of \$384.71. We paid apportionments for May and June from the rebate income, but did not pay July apportionments of \$5901.92. UMCOC income for July was \$4535.00 and expenses of \$6111.50 leaving a difference for the month of negative \$1576.50. Year to date balance for UMCOC is \$5478.01. Children First income was \$32,581.62 and total expenses were \$26,527.24 leaving a monthly difference of \$6,054.38. Children First fiscal year begins on September 1<sup>st</sup>. Dreams had income of \$2527.13 with no expenses bringing the Dreams balance to \$90,161.90. Parsonage Loan repayment income was \$2137.20 and expenses of \$2610.79 leaving the fund balance at \$12,385.45. Mission Giving beginning balance for July was \$22,998.91 with revenue of \$3928.00 and expenses of \$5693.78, leaving an ending balance of \$21,233.13. Under the direction of church council, a committee consisting of Pastor Scott, Colleen McKirdy, Joann Follette, Ron Borgman and Karen Hahn met to discuss the separation of the Dream Fund balance into two accounts, and the approval structure for each. We will present our proposal at the council meeting, along with a second proposal with the fund amounts. These are starting points for council discussion.
- **Stewardship & Finance...** The S & F will present a request for disbursements from the Benevolence Funds.
- **Trustees...** Children First asked the Trustees for a room “rent free” again. The committee voted no. Trustees received partial funds from Dreams for the security lighting and for updated locking system for UMC, but we are short on money so not sure where to get remainder.

Trustees received funds for new tables for Fellowship Hall and are in the process of ordering.

- **Children First...** Recent actions by the CF Board include having specific child care sign up (with a fee for no-show) for Rally Week this year and next plus July 1-3, 2019. Approved use of prior fund balance to supplement budget, with a goal to increase wages annually. A request was made to Trustees for a continuation of one room rent-free annually in order to improve salaries and work toward an outdoor classroom. Planning is in process for fall kick-off event on September 8.
  - **Pastor...** Fall and winter preaching series are being laid out. All worship planning is being coordinated with the Children’s Church curriculum so that what the kids experience in worship is what they will simultaneously experience in Children’s Church together. We are coordinating our monthly mission, “That One Thing”, with Children’s Church and adult worship. Confirmation is being planned for the whole year as a planning team has been working with me.
  - **Health Ministry...** On September 23, at 4:00 p.m., a Health Forum titled “Medication and Pain Management”, will be presented by Michelle Jennings and Linda Hoxie. Plan to do a proposal to have an AED (Artificial External Defibrillator) in the church.
  - **Missions...** Pastor’s Discretionary \$337, Benevolence Fund \$100, Solar Ovens \$155, Kits \$651, Clothe-a-Kid \$2,525, Food Pantry \$110, Honduras VIM \$50
- Discussion Items...** A proposal from the task force appointed to determine the separation of Dreams Fund into capital needs and missions was presented. This proposal was approved. More details are included in a separate article in this issue of the Trumpeter
- Action Items...** Benevolence Fund approved \$750 donation to a family experiencing unemployment and health issues. MCCI Fund approved request for up to \$1,470.71 for a Children First kick-off event on September 8.

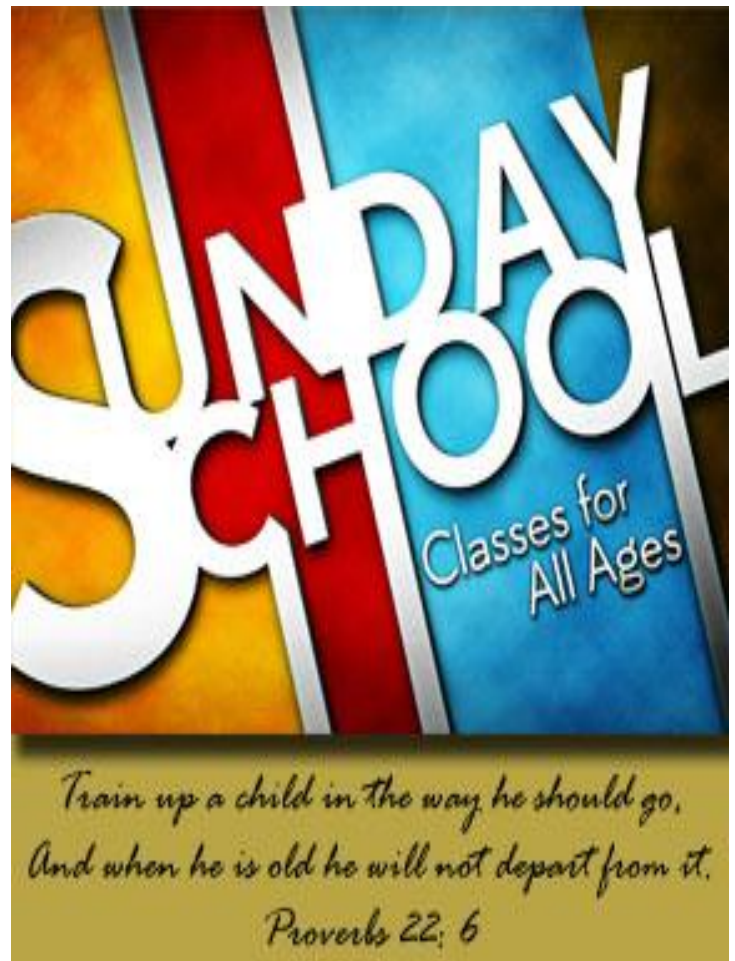
