"I have learned to be content in whatever state I am in." Apostle Paul in Philippians 4: 11

It's October! First frost. Pumpkins. Harvest. School in full swing. Homecoming parades. Leaves falling. And Halloween.

We typically don't think of Halloween as a time for sharing, but I do love one of the old sharing stories I grew up with. In East River South Dakota, just 16 miles past the Missouri River, is the town of Gettysburg. I don't know if you are aware of it, but back in the 1950's Gettysburg was a booming town...with an incredible sense of humor. That sense of humor translated into a huge amount of pranks being pulled each year on Halloween.

The county sheriff and his deputies would put in long hours each year night patrolling and trying to stop as many of the pranks as possible. Well, one of the deputies lived out on a farm a few miles out of town. Besides being in law enforcement, he was also a grain farmer. That particular year, the grain harvest had just been completed. His grain truck was loaded and ready to head to the elevator the next day. Not a surprise in a small town, people knew about this. He had probably shared that particular piece of information in the coffee shop on Halloween morning.

So, while he was in town that whole evening and night watching for the teenage pranksters, those same boys had driven out to his farm. Using one of his own tractors, they maneuvered a grain auger over to his house.



Nobody's doors were ever locked in those days, so the boys let themselves into his house, opened a window (You know, the TOP of one of those old double-hung windows),

backing up the loaded grain truck, and putting the auger through the now-open window emptied the entire load of grain into the deputy's living room!

They were all about sharing the abundance and plenty of that year's harvest!

We are also focusing on sharing our abundance all through October! We as a church and community have been incredibly blessed. Stop and think about the mission and ministry that we are about right now: Children First Preschool; medical mission teams to Honduras; worship every week; weddings in our congregation as we surround new couples in prayer, new babies being born as we surround these families with love and support; funerals in our church and community as we walk with



each other through every stage of life; school kits being sent; working at and supporting the food pantry; providing food through our commodities program; helping Artemis house; AA

and NA support groups; yoga for the community; helping folks find food, clothing, and shelter; music ministry through worship teams, choir, bell choir; middle and high school youth programming; children's fun and education; Bible studies; college outreach; Congregational Care Ministry; our meal ministry,....and there's still more!

This is our church version of somebody backing up the grain truck and auguring an entire load into our sanctuary!

In October one of the important things that we will be talking about is our stewardship. We are all involved in the life of this church together, and it's up to all of us together to help it happen. We are giving of our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service, and our witness. All through October we are focusing on "More or Less?" in worship. Each week we will be talking about how contentment is a response to God. We learn "in whatever state we are in" to be content. This is what Paul teaches. Stuff is NOT what keeps us happy inside our church, but working together for God does. Wanting what others have just makes us miserable, but working together with God opens up whole new doors.

The weekend of October 27-28 is our Stewardship Weekend. We will be sharing so much about the joy of our church's presence here in the Northern Hills. We will be sharing pledge cards for our 2019 ministries. We will

Worship Notes

I recently came across an article by Chuck Lawless, professor and associate dean of the Billy Graham School

of Missions, Evangelism and Church Growth. Because of the title, it naturally piqued my interest. It also brought forward some ideas I had not previously thought of about singing in church.

We are told so often in the Bible that we are "to sing a new song to the Lord" (Psalm 149:1) and "Sing Praises to God, sing praises; sing praises to our King, sing praises"



(Psalm 47:6). A friend of mine in California even admonished people via his personalized license plate that said **"Sing 4th"**.

Now, read what Chuck has to say in his article, **"Why We Need to Sing in Worship Even When We Do Not Know or Like the Song"** and then think about how it fits your life of praise to God.

"I've been there, and you likely have, also. You've never heard the song your church is singing. Or, you've heard it but don't like it. The temptation is to silently mimic the words or not to sing at all. Here's why we need to sing anyway:

- 1. It's right to sing God's praises. Even if it's not our favorite song, it's right to join the people of God in singing God's praises (Psalm 96). He delights in the singing of His people.
- 2. Not singing sends the wrong signal. Here's what it could look like... anger... burden... distraction... Worse yet, it comes across as arrogance. And, if you're not singing just because you don't like the song, that really does border on arrogance.
- 3. Some songs you don't like are quite Biblical. Most of us choose songs we like on the basis of the style and the melody, not on the words. Sometimes the songs we don't like are straight out of the Bible—so not singing them takes on more significance.
- 4. We can learn a song best by singing it. I now love some songs I didn't like when I first heard them, and I'm glad I at least tried to sing them. The same can happen for you.
- 5. We model worship for others as we sing. All of us model something by the way we worship. Some show the joy of encountering God. Others make worshiping God look boring and disconnected. Singing helps others to worship Him well.
- 6. Singing with the rest of the congregation promotes and reflects unity. Churches already struggle enough with internal conflict. Sometimes, in fact, members who don't sing are intentionally sending a signal of disapproval and division. Don't play that game.
- 7. Singing encourages the ones leading the singing. Few things are as discouraging for

worship leaders as looking at a congregation with non-singers—and, from what I understand from worship leaders, they seldom miss seeing them. We don't really hide our silence."

Did you realize that science has proven that singing (especially praises to God) every day will lengthen your lifespan significantly? It's true! I look forward to singing God's praises with you each and every Saturday and Sunday!

The Annual Flu Shot Saves Lives



Influenza is a respiratory infection that can cause serious complications. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that everyone 6 months of age or older be vaccinated annually against the flu. They also are urging people to act NOW, just

before the October start of the 2018-2019 flu season, and get vaccinated. Vaccination is especially important for people of high risk complications, including: pregnant women, older adults, and children.

Of the 180 children who died in the past year, 80 percent had not been vaccinated during the flu season. Research shows that the annual flu shot saves lives. "Getting a flu vaccine does not mean you will not get the flu, but if you do get sick it could be less severe," experts say. The Health Ministry Team recommends that you get a flu vaccination EACH year!

Council Highlights September 19, 2018

Treasurer's Report... Total General Fund income for August was \$32,265.88 and expenses were \$38,751.84, leaving a deficit for the month of \$6,485.96. We have not paid July apportionments of \$5901.92 or August of \$5162.54. UMCOC income for August was \$4500.00 and expenses of \$5120.13 leaving a difference for the month of negative \$620.13. Year to date balance for UMCOC is \$4857.88. Children First income was \$22,185.40 and total expenses were \$37,753.23 leaving a monthly difference of negative \$15,567.83. Children First fiscal year began on September 1st. Dreams Funds have been transferred into Capital Needs and Mission Opportunity, with \$50,000.00 held in reserve for the NHSOS for up to 3 years. Capital Needs income for August \$39,144.04. This includes \$24,000 approved funds from Dreams, \$10,000 emergency reserve fund, and \$982.14 given in August through pledges. Parsonage Loan repayment income was \$1396.19 and no expenses leaving a fund balance of \$13,781.64. Mission Opportunities beginning balance for August was \$21,233.13 with revenue of \$1660.00 and expenses of \$3320.76, leaving an ending balance of \$19,572.37. Additionally, \$2000 was transferred from Dreams to Mission Opportunity for start-up.

- Stewardship & Finance...Committees/teams will receive their worksheets of past budgets for 2019. Stewardship Sunday is scheduled for October 28 and Charge Conference will be held on November 18. As there is no functioning Care & Outreach Committee, it is recommended to move that budget under Stewardship & Finance. The balance of the foundation distribution, \$64.95, will be applied to the expenses of the September 8 Fall Kick-off, with the balance of expenses paid from MCCI funds. Approved the Children First budget.
- Staff Parish... Search has begun for a new Financial Assistant. Staff Evaluations will be completed before the end of the year. Children First has completed their budget and will receive a 3 to 4 percent salary increases.
- Memorials...The undesignated balance is \$2,494.34. The committee plans to use some of the Undesignated Memorials to support the cost of the sound system after it has been installed.
- Children First...All Children First staff and families were invited to Fall Kickoff Sat, Sept 8 for play, worship, meal, and CF open house. The first mac and cheese was held Tues, Sept 11. CF is at full enrollment and has waiting lists in several areas.
- Worship & Music... Fifth Sunday Fellowship and the service weekend will be held on Sunday, September 30. The joint service will be the 10:30 service, followed by a potluck dinner and then service projects. More tech people are needed on Saturdays and Sundays. We are scheduled to have the new presentation screens installed sometime toward the end of September, and help will be needed running cables to electric units in the attic. Watched a video from Planning Center University to see how we can make better use of that program and of our time and resources.
- Trustees...Will make a request to council for \$3,566.25 to complete funding for security lighting and lock system. Denied Children First request to continue one free room rent. Getting quotes on screens for rain gutters on the church.

Health Ministry...Health Ministry Committee will sponsor a Health Forum on Sept. 23, 2018-"Pain Management-Alternatives to Medication." A proposal for an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) has been draft, and funding will be sought. Thirteen meals were provided by the Caring Meal Ministry in August.

Discussion Items

Budget Process...Committees will begin the process of their budgets for 2019. Pledge letters and cards will be mailed to the congregation by October 14, with Stewardship Sunday scheduled for October 28. Stewardship & Finance will work on budget in November and present a draft to council on November 14.

Nomination Process...Committees are asked to start thinking of their membership for 2019; who will remain and who should be invited to serve on the committee. Health Ministry AED....Linda presented the proposal for purchase of an AED. Chris will research grants and funding of \$1500.00.

Fall Kick-Off...The Children First Fall Kick-off held on September 8 went well, although numbers were lower than anticipated.

Action Items

Children First budget...approved budget as presented by Children First committee.

Trustees request...approved request of \$3566.225 for lights and locks, to be paid from Capital Needs fund.

Learning Exercise...Kirk diagramed the UMC organizational chart, starting from the global UMC to Spearfish UMC and our committees. Mission statements need to be submitted from Missions, Worship & Music, CYFM, Staff Parish, UMM, UMW, Memorials, and Nominations.

Scott encouraged everyone to read next week's GPS and prayer in anticipation of the special global conference, scheduled for February, during which time the Commission on the Way Forward will present options regarding homosexuality within our denomination.

Next meeting: Wednesday, October 17 at 7:30 p.m. These meetings are open to everyone.
