# Pastor's Page "General Conference is Coming"

Usually, United Methodists from around the globe get together every

four years for a major denominational event that involves worship, prayer, global sharing, and legislation. This month we as UM's are having a General Conference after only three years. Almost a thousand delegates will gather February 23-26 in St. Louis, MO. This is a special conference with a special focus: human sexuality.

As a denomination we have been in heated discussion since 1972 on issues of human sexuality. This conference seeks to find a way forward so that we can better enter into ministry together around the globe without arguing so much about it. This is really tricky, because we are a global church. We here in the United States have a difficult time agreeing about sexuality: Same-sex marriage? Ordination of homosexual persons? The role of the church in environments of changing sexual attitudes?

Now expand that conversation to an entire globe and things get even more complicated even more quickly. We here in the US don't spend any time talking about polygamy in our churches, but in Africa this is a huge issue. We here in the US are pretty open in our discussions of sexuality, but as one 2016 General Conference delegate from Africa said, "We do not talk like this in our culture. We do not even talk about sexual issues with our wives." There are similar attitude differences from many other areas of the globe.

This is really tricky to talk about. This is really difficult to find our way through all these discussions and arrive at a place where we are the Body of Christ doing the will and work of God in our local communities and around the globe.

So, in February we will be in prayer for our denomination as the General Conference delegates gather. I hope to be giving you more information about what's happening, but also draw you in to a deeper sense of who we are here in Spearfish. As we look at the global church, we also begin to see more clearly who we are as a

local church.

Why are we here? "The Spearfish United Methodist Church is here to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." We do this when we "Know God. Love God. Serve Others."

It's who we are. It's what we do. We are the Body of Christ



### Council Highlights January 16, 2019

Treasurer's Report: Total General Fund income for December was \$68,403.02 and expenses were \$48,053.87, leaving a surplus for the month of \$20,349.15. All apportionments have been paid. As of the end of December, the General Fund balance is \$17,871.57. UMCOC income for December was \$3,330.00 and expenses were \$6,369.99, leaving a difference for the month of negative \$3, 039.99. UMCOC year to date balance is negative \$2,206.13. Children First income was \$29,181.80 and total expenses were \$29,089.61 leaving the month ahead \$92.19 and \$15,549.63 for the fiscal year. Capital Needs income for December was \$930.90. Previously approved expenses totaled \$6,476.42, leaving the Capital Needs Fund behind \$5,545.52 for December and finishing the year with a balance of \$22,863.52.

- ➤ The Parsonage Loan repayment income was \$1782.17. There were no expenses in December, leaving a year to date balance of \$15,803.63. A quarterly payment of \$4,000 was due January 1<sup>st</sup> and an \$8,000.00 previously approved balloon payment also paid at that time.
- ➤ **Mission Giving** began the month with a balance of \$25,656.35 with revenue of \$13,616.86 and expenses of \$15,854.79, leaving an ending balance of \$23,418.42.
- ➤ <u>Staff-Parish</u>: The committee welcomed the following new members: Michelle Watson, Ross English, Josie Pearson, and Jacky Easton. Discussion items included staff evaluations; the 2019 Budget; a Children's First Overview—Buddy System with Staff Members; and goals for 2019.
- ➤ Health Ministries: The AED (Automated External Defibrillator) was installed on the east side of the Fellowship Hall. A 45 minute training is being planned. This will not be a certification, but the goal is to have several people trained. A policy is written and in the church office. Orvette or Barry will check it monthly to make sure the battery is charged. They reported that there were 17 Home Visits/Grief Follow-up as well as 13 meals delivered in November/December by the Caring Meal Ministry. Cancer-Now What Books are now available
- ➤ <u>Historian</u>: Beth Bentley is meeting with Janelle Jones every Monday afternoon to start the process of organizing the history files. These files include pictures, bulletins, newspaper articles, committee minutes, special occasion documents, etc. The United Methodist Church has guidelines to follow which will help guide our decisions about what to keep and how to store everything.
- > <u>Trustees:</u> Foltz Electric started installing security lighting on January 16. Gene's Lock Shop will install a new security locking system with key fobs on January 17-18. Haggerty's will install two large television projection screens in the sanctuary on January 17 or 18 as well.
- <u>United Methodist Women:</u> Officer Installation took place on January 16. The work is almost done for the local program book.
- ➤ Discussion Items...Pastor Scott, with help from some members of the congregation, is creating an evaluation to chart the progress made over 5 years with MCCI. His deadline is next council meeting. It will be an archival document to see what we accomplished and where we still need to go. A copy will be given to Annual Conference as well. The Church Council Retreat will be held on Saturday, March 2, 2019 from 8:00 am-12:00 pm to work on how we can better nurture, provide outreach, and witness to our church, community, and the world. John Kissack brought a mission idea with a former professional saddle bronc rider from Eagle Butte who puts on free rodeo schools for children in South Dakota and other states in impoverished communities. He plans to share it with Missions.
- ➤ Action Items...Approved: Transfer \$5,239.31 from Trustee Emergency Reserve Fund to UMCOC as reimbursement for replacement of the key card system at UMCOC due to lightning.
- ➤ Learning/Planning Exercise...Work tabled to the Council Retreat on March 2.
- > Next Meeting: Wednesday, February 20 at 7:30 p.m. These meetings are open to everyone.


