"Becoming"

In his book *Mere Christianity*, C.S. Lewis said this:

"Taking your life as a whole, with all your innumerable choices, all your life long you are slowly turning this central thing either into a Heaven creature or into a hellish creature: either into a creature that is in harmony with God, and with other creatures, and with itself, or else into one that is in a state of war and hatred with God, and with its fellow creatures, and with itself. To be the one kind of creature is Heaven: that is, it is joy, and peace, and knowledge, and power. To be the other means madness, horror, idiocy, rage, impotence, and eternal loneliness. Each of us at each moment is progressing to the one state or the other."

Let me say this another way: An old Cherokee was teaching his grandson about life: "A fight is going on inside me," he said to the boy. "It is a terrible fight and it is between two wolves. One is evil – he is anger, envy, sorrow, regret, greed, arrogance, self-pity, guilt, resentment, inferiority, lies, false pride, superiority, and ego." He continued, "The other is good – he is joy, peace, love, hope, serenity, humility, kindness, benevolence, empathy, generosity, truth, compassion, and faith. The same fight is going on inside you–and inside every other person, too." The grandson thought about it for a minute and then asked his grandfather: "Which wolf will win?"

The old Cherokee simply replied, "The one you feed."

actions that we live. We are becoming our inaction. We are becoming our deepest, joyful truth. We are becoming our darkest, ugly prejudices. We are becoming work. We are becoming our play.

Automated External Defibrillator (AED)

Our church has an AED mounted in the Fellowship Hall. It is a device that evaluates the Sudden Cardiac Arrest Victim's heart rhythm with AED electrodes. It delivers an electrical shock to the heart to restore the electrical activity so it can pump blood again.

It is the goal of the Health Ministry Committee to get as many people as possible, in the congregation, trained on using the AED. When AED's are used in conjunction with CPR, they can increase survival rates between 50-80%.

Children's Coordinator & Technology Director Positions Now Open

We are really excited to tell you about two brand new additions to our church's staffing: a new Children's Coordinator and a new Technology Coordinator.

Our new Children's Coordinator is a 1/4 – time position at 10 hours per week. We have never had a children's worker on our staff before; previously it has been 100% volunteer. This Children's Coordinator is going to work very closely with our Children's Church program in coordinating volunteers and guiding us in focused directions of children's ministry. This will include developing Sidewalk Sonday School and Vacation Bible School. This person will be deeply involved with dreaming new directions for the families of our congregation and community. She/he will work very closely with a fantastic Children, Youth, and Family Ministry Team as well as with the pastor. Our goal is that this position is going to include a lot of hard work, energy, and laughter as we she/he guides us in focused children's ministry.

Our new Technology Director is also a 1/4 - time position at 10 hours per week. We have had this position in years past, but under a different name. This Technology Director will work with our computer set-up (especially in worship-related tasks), with our sound system, and with our online presence. She/he will help create our PowerPoint for worship each week while simultaneously coordinating volunteers to do the same. She/he will understand and teach others how to run the sound system. She/he will be in charge of our webpage and Facebook page. All of this is done in coordination with the Worship & Music Committee and with the pastor.

Do you know of someone interested in either of these two positions? Or maybe you are yourself! Application forms and job descriptions are now available in the church office. Interviews will be set up with our Staff-Parish Relations Committee.

WHY heat at the United Methodist Community Outreach Center (UMCOC) is so important. There are over 200 people using services

Youth and Family Services workers go out into our community to work. Community members receive essential food through the Commodities program.

Free Diabetic Screening April 13 & 14

More than 8 million people in the United States are living with diabetes but are unaware they have it. An additional 86 million people—or nearly one in three American adults--have pre diabetes. This means they are at much higher risk of developing Type 2 Diabetes.

People with Diabetes can have some of the following symptoms:

- Frequent urination
- Excessive thirst
- Unexplained weight loss
- Extreme hunger
- Tingling or numbness in hands or feet
- Feeling tired much of the time
- Sores that are slow to heal
- More infections than usual.


• Nausea, vomiting, or stomach pains may accompany some of these symptoms in the abrupt onset of insulin-dependent diabetes, now called Type 1 Diabetes.

Screenings will be offered the following dates/times:

- <u>April 13-</u> 6:30 P.M. Following the Saturday service
- <u>April 14</u> 9:15 A.M. Following the 8:15 A.M. service
- <u>April 14--</u> 11:30 A.M. Following the 10:30 A.M. service.

People 45 years of age or older should consider being tested for Diabetes at least every three years. We will also be doing a blood pressure screening.

The Health Ministry Committee encourages you to participate in the annual Diabetic Screening. Many people have Diabetes and do not even know it; often times there are no symptoms. Even children can get Diabetes. We are seeing an increase in teenagers. Early diagnosis and early treatment are keys in preventing long term complications from Diabetes!



Council Highlights March 20, 2019

<u>TREASURER'S REPORT:</u> The UMCOC Heating

Upgrade Fund has been added. Stewardship and Finance voted last month to award this fund the \$1,189.36 from the **Foundation Investment Fund** distribution for 2018. That money had not been received as of February 28; however, Ron had been told to proceed with some preliminary evaluations on the current heating system which is why the

Fund is in the negative as of the end of February. The Foundation money has now been received and deposited in the Fund. General Fund total income for the month of February was \$32,314.14, and expenses were \$29,804.15. The General Fund ended the month \$2,509.99 in the black with apportionments paid, and \$2,338.19 in the red YTD balance. Apportionments will continue to be paid unless the YTD negative balance exceeds the prior year General Fund Balance of \$21,625.48. For the first two months of 2018, budgeted General Fund income was nearly \$10,000 more than for 2019. Fortunately, expenses are down as well. UMCOC Fund had an income of \$6,455.00 which included an early payment for March from Summit Church. Expenses were \$2,769.72, leaving the UMCOC Fund in the black \$3,685.28 for February, and in the black \$4,653.66 for the YTD balance. Children First income for February was \$35,022.22, and expenses were \$29,609.20. Children First is \$29,123.82 in the black six months into their fiscal year. The Parsonage Loan Repayment Fund income for February was \$2,594.00, and there were no expenses. The balance YDT is \$9.498.72 with the next payment of \$4,000.00 due on April 5. In 2018, it was approved by both Stewardship and Finance as well as the Council to use money from this fund up to \$5,000.00 for the fire escape stairs to be built off the parsonage deck. The current bid for the work is \$2,151.98. The Capital Needs Fund expenditures were \$891.52 to replace the folding machine in the church office. The YTD balance is now \$4,069.10 with the sanctuary confidence monitor TV still to be installed and three wireless microphones to be purchased, using Capital Needs money with an estimate of \$2,100. The completion of these projects will just about deplete the Capital Needs Fund which has no source of income for 2019. Mission Giving for February was \$10,078.49 which included funds for the Honduras Mission Team. Mission expenses (distributions) were \$13,125.61.

- ✓ <u>CHILDREN FIRST</u>: The Children First Board approved a 4% increase in child care rates. In alternate years, rates are set for preschool. For summer 2019, children ready for kindergarten will not be included in the Children First preschool. Children First will cooperate with a private program for science enrichment for pre-K through third graders. March will have 3 pay periods, thus affecting finances. February was a good month. There is continued discussion about potential employees who can't afford to work at CF due to minimum wage. UMC members and friends are encouraged to visit Children First. One idea would be to donate a healthy snack for a class during April or May. Call Melissa or contact Scott or Janelle if you are interested.
- ✓ <u>CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILY MINISTRIES</u> <u>REPORT</u>: A new youth council met for the first time this year on February 27th with several youth and adults: Brenda Swanson and Jean Lewers-Brail. Plans were made for the high school lock-in, baked potato dinner and auction, and for doing hospitality after worship. Goals were reviewed, programs were discussed, and up-coming events previewed.
- ✓ <u>STAFF-PARISH REPORT</u>: The Staff-Parish Relations Committee met on Tuesday, March 12. They approved two new positions that will be advertised: Children's Ministry Coordinator and Church Technology Coordinator.

- ✓ **TRUSTEES REPORT:** Trustees met March 6 and approval for funding was given to purchase wireless mic's and install confidence monitor. The sanctuary computer is 98% full and needs to be replaced. The ceiling in hallway of the church was investigated with ice backing up under shingles which will be repaired this spring.
- ✓ WORSHIP REPORT: The committee met on February 27. The committee will find out the contact person on file with CCLI. There was more discussion of ongoing details of tech support and recruiting lay readers and communion helpers. Special Upcoming Services are: Ash Wednesday service; UMW Sunday; Taize services on April 4, 11, 18. Special Easter events will include a Blue Jeans service, a 6:30 a.m. Easter Sunrise service with an Easter Brunch with Kathy Helmer organizing an "egg bake". There will be weekly planning meetings with Scott on Tuesdays.
- Discussion Items...Pastor Scott provided clarification on √ the two new positions: Children's Ministry Coordinator and Church Technology Coordinator. Both with be 10 hours a week or 1/4 time, and the money will be divided equally from the former Music Director position. Some of the duties fulfilled by the Music Directors in the past will be voluntary, divided among about 20 people. There was also discussion about the ice backing up under the shingles, and it was determined that the roof heater may have caused the leaking. Action Items... Release of Capital Needs Funds to upgrade the confidence monitor, remote and three mics was approved. MCCI monies in the amount of \$310.45 to go toward a new computer in the sanctuary was also approved. The remaining cost of the computer (\$1,825) being designed by Greg Diaz is coming from church member gifts marked for the computer replacement. A Benevolence Fund Request for \$650 was also approved. Kirk compiled the SWOT Analysis from the Council Retreat into a chart and this was discussed at length as how to best proceed. Each committee representative will put this on the committee's agenda and discuss it, coming up with a goal for each area and possible strategies for each committee to contribute. The SMART goal format will be utilized.
- ✓ Next Meeting: Wednesday, April 17, 2019 at 7:30 p.m. These meetings are open to everyone
