"Lost in Translation?"

I have been thinking lately about the life of the church and how it connects with the life of our surrounding community. One simple thought that I had was this: In the same way that I cannot imagine a life WITHOUT Jesus Christ, there are many within our community who cannot imagine their life WITH Jesus Christ. So, how do we effectively translate Jesus into the lives of others who don't know him?

One of the most important things that we can be doing as followers of Jesus Christ is to take what we know through Scripture and worship and translate it into the lives of other people in ways that can be understood and appreciated. Too often our well-intentioned actions and desires are lost in translation to the community around us. When we know and love Christ, we want to be able to share this love with people all around us. But it doesn't always come off in the right way.

St. Francis is reported to have said, "Share the gospel of Jesus Christ at all times. If necessary, use words."

What are some of the ways that we can be sharing Christ's love as we effectively translate faith into the lives of others? Here are some ways that I would love for you to think about and incorporate in your daily living:

- **No hypocrisy.** There is no space in our lives as we interact with others for saying one thing and doing another.
- **Truth always.** Falling into little white lies is far too easy for all of us.
- **No judging.** There will always be those in our communities who live differently than we do.
- **Gratitude always.** It is incredibly important to our faith and the faith of others to consistently be living in a spirit of thanks.
- **Choose joy.** Joy in our life can be seen by others. Cultivate it. Radiate it.
- **Live with hope.** In a day and age where there is so much chaos and fear, your presence of hope can change lives.

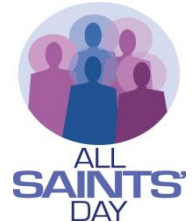

Participation Opportunities

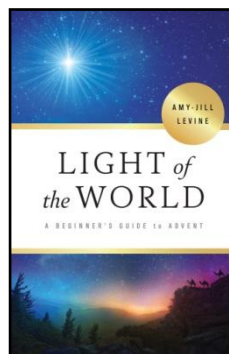
All Saints Day this Weekend

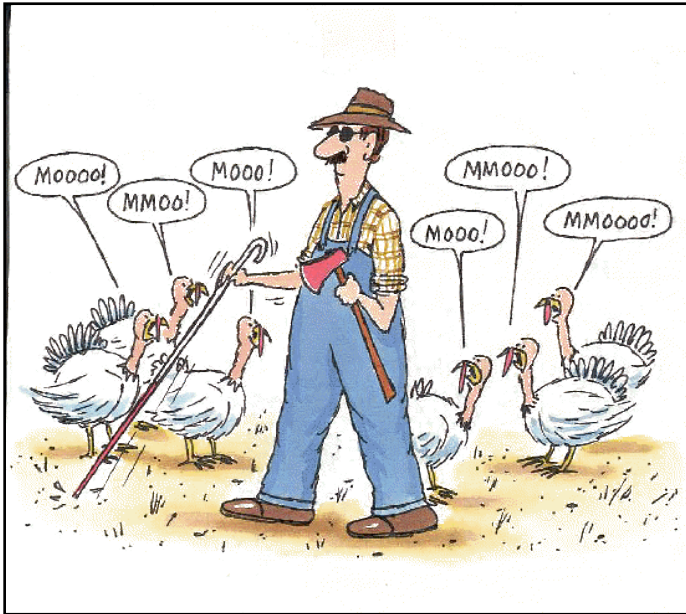


- **Communion Prayer stations:** The first Sunday of each month, when we share communion, there is an opportunity for prayer at the Communion Prayer stations: personal prayers, prayers for family/friends, prayers of Thanksgiving, other.
- **Prayer prior to surgery:** Pastor Scott and Congregational Care Members (CCM) are available to pray for you at the hospital before surgery or during a time of illness. You may call the church office (642-3457) to let us know about your hospitalization or illness. Also, you may call the church office to request prayers for any reason. These requests will be forwarded to the prayer team and Pastor Scott. There is so much power in prayer!
- **Sanctuary:** The sanctuary and alter are available for prayer during the day and ½ hour prior to the weekend church services. The office door is open from 8:30 A.M.-noon and 1:00 – 5:30 p.m.
- **Prayer Quilts and Prayer Calendar:** These are given out when there is an illness/hospitalization. Remember to tie the knot with a prayer and sign up to pray for that person. It means so much to the person who receives the quilt and calendar; knowing that people are praying for them and they care.
- **Prayer list in church bulletin:** Look at the weekly prayer list and pray for these people in need during the week. What a wonderful opportunity to serve your church from your home.
- **Monthly Church Prayer:** Can be e-mailed or mailed. Call church office if you would like to receive this monthly prayer. (Presently 400+ people are receiving this prayer). NOTE: A post card copy of the monthly prayer is in the sign- in book in the church pews. Feel free to take a copy and put it on your counter as a reminder to pray for our church.
- **Green Prayer Card:** A green prayer card is in the front of each pew. If you have a prayer concern/need you may write it on the card and place it in the

offering plate or return it to the church office. Pastor Scott and the prayer team will offer prayer.

Council Highlights
October 16, 2019

- ✓ **TREASURER’S REPORT:** General Fund income for the month of September is \$36,389.36 and expenses are \$33,191.23. The General Fund ended the month \$3,198.13 in the black. The year to date balance is \$8,011.58 in the black with all apportionments paid through September. The income for UMCOC is \$6,105.00, and expenses are \$6,151.00, leaving the UMCOC Fund in the red \$46.00 for the month of September but still in the black \$10,232.73 for the YTD balance. Children First income for September is \$35,843.05, and expenses are \$32,521.10. Children First ended September in the black \$3,321.95. Year to date balance is also \$3,321.95 as September is the beginning of the CF fiscal year. The Debt Retirement/Capital Fund income for September is \$3,203.63. Expenses are \$51,174.09, reflecting more payments on the UMCOC Heating Upgrade project. Year to date balance is \$31,073.42. Mission-Giving for September was \$2,254. Mission expenses (distributions) were \$2,165.55. The last payment to our Elisha Intern is reflected in the expenses. Children First was the Mission of the Month and received \$2,655.00 in donations.
- ✓ **CHILDREN FIRST:** The Montessori staff training was held on October 14 with breakfast provided by CF board. Mac & Cheese Day was held on October 15. The CF

office was painted on Grubby Sunday and new carpet was added. The CF board goal is to increase wages. Minimum wage goes up again from \$9.10 to \$9.30/hr. Thank you for mission of the month support. This is important because CF is owned and operated by Spearfish United Methodist Church.

- ✓ **MEMORIALS REPORT:** There were no new memorials funded since last month. Dyan Nagel did meet with the new finance person to clarify and compare our bookkeeping. Dyan also revamped the memorial documentation forms to streamline information. The committee is currently seeking a third member to join.
- ✓ **STAFF/PARISH RELATIONS REPORT:** SPRC met on Tuesday, Oct.8 and worked on next year's budget and our staff evaluation process.
- ✓ **TRUSTEES REPORT:** Trustees did not meet in October but did find 2 tables from Wal-Mart that we are purchasing for Church Sunday School Children.
- ✓ **WORSHIP REPORT:** The committee reviewed the planning for World Communion Sunday. There was also a discussion of how to develop more lay leaders in worship services: candle lighters; readers, and communion servers. Michelle Jennings recruits lay assistants for the Blue Jeans Services very effectively. Her quiet way of contacting and encouraging people is a good model. Advent planning includes the book study, *Light of the World: A Beginner’s Guide to Advent* by Amy-Jill Levine. Taizé services will be on December 5, 12, and 19. The children’s program will take place at the 8:15 a.m. service on December 15. There will be a performance of *Amahl and the Night Visitors* at SUMC on January 11 and 12. The CCLI license fee has been paid for the year.
- ✓ **YOUTH MINISTRY REPORT:** Youth continue to meet regularly on Wednesday nights. Sunday school for youth has started meeting for Coffee and Current Events as they apply to our faith. Confirmation classes continue monthly. Beginning in October at Canyon Lake UMC, area youth will gather at a central location for special worship, activities & small group time each quarter of the year. Youth Rummage sale is coming up Saturday, October 19th. Trunk or treat will be held Sunday, October 27th and all church folks are invited to take part in this community outreach event. Youth shopped for Christmas shoeboxes for reservation kids. DakYouth, the conference youth event in Aberdeen, is coming up November 8-10.
- ✓ **Discussion Items...** Pastor Scott shared the idea of a narrative budget that he learned about through his classes. Using the example, a joint office effort with Mary Tracy, Pastor Scott, and Orvette Stepper worked to develop a narrative budget for Spearfish UMC. Having a second Charge Conference in December at our own church was discussed. Plans will be firmed up at the November Council meeting.
- ✓ **Action Items. . .** There were no action items.
- ✓ **Learning/Planning. . .** Kirk asked for committees to report on their progress on the goals. Pastor Scott from the Lay Leadership Committee shared that they had four ideas.
 - **First**, the plan is to implement Discipleship Pathway immediately. This will take the place of the

Membership classes and is part of Pastor Scott's Leadership certification.

- **Secondly**, they would like to implement a parallel course geared toward youth that will revamp the confirmation program.
- **Third**, a suggestion was made to revamp Wednesday evenings at our church.
- **Fourth**, expanding Children's Church into Saturday night service. Janelle reported on the progress of the Family Involvement Committee. The idea was a strategy of quarterly events. For example, have a family event once a quarter such as Valentine Night Out with either babysitting for parents to have a date night or design a family event at the church for all ages; Vacation Bible School would be the focus of the next quarter; Fall Kick Off would be the third quarter; and Christmas Eve service focusing on children or a Shopping Day with kids or babysitting so that parents can shop. There was a question as to whether a weekly Wednesday night could become a Game Night. Another idea was to host a public forum on early childhood education. A suggestion was "No Small Matter" which was recommended. It was also suggested to bring in a trainer for families, educators, child care staff, and legislators. Kirk asked about certification of Children First through the state department's standards. He mentioned that other preschools had been contacted, such as Little Jackets. The Outreach Committee and the Capital Needs Committee will work on getting goals for the November meeting.

Bishop's Thanksgiving Offering to Assist Farmers and Ranchers



So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.
Isaiah 41:10 CEB

As Dakotans, we are blessed to live in and be stewards of some of the most productive land in the world. Yet, during this growing season we have seen an unprecedented number of stressors that are impacting our farmers and ranchers and those that support the agricultural industry. A wet spring delayed planting, the

wet fall is delaying harvest and depressing yields. Some producers are facing drought, others have been flooded, the markets are volatile for crops and livestock.

An increasing number of farmers and ranchers and their families are filled with despair as they deal with the lack of production and depressed markets. Farm income continues to decline; an average loss of 10-12% since 2012. Family farms and ranches that have been part of a lineage for a century or more are now in jeopardy of being lost. The cumulative impact of these multiple stressors is manifested in increases in fatal farm accidents, abuse of drugs and alcohol, and suicides. Our friends are in need of support through encouragement, prayer, and professional assistance.

So, I appeal to each of our 250 congregations in the Dakotas Conference to join together through our annual Thanksgiving offering to help support our friends and neighbors who produce our food and fiber. We have an opportunity to be a blessing to those who produce so many of our blessings. We have an opportunity to give a tangible expression to the promise God made to the people of God.

Our offering will be utilized to partner with Lutheran Social Services in North Dakota and Avera Behavioral Health in South Dakota. Our plan is to provide services to farmers and ranchers at no costs or at reduced costs.

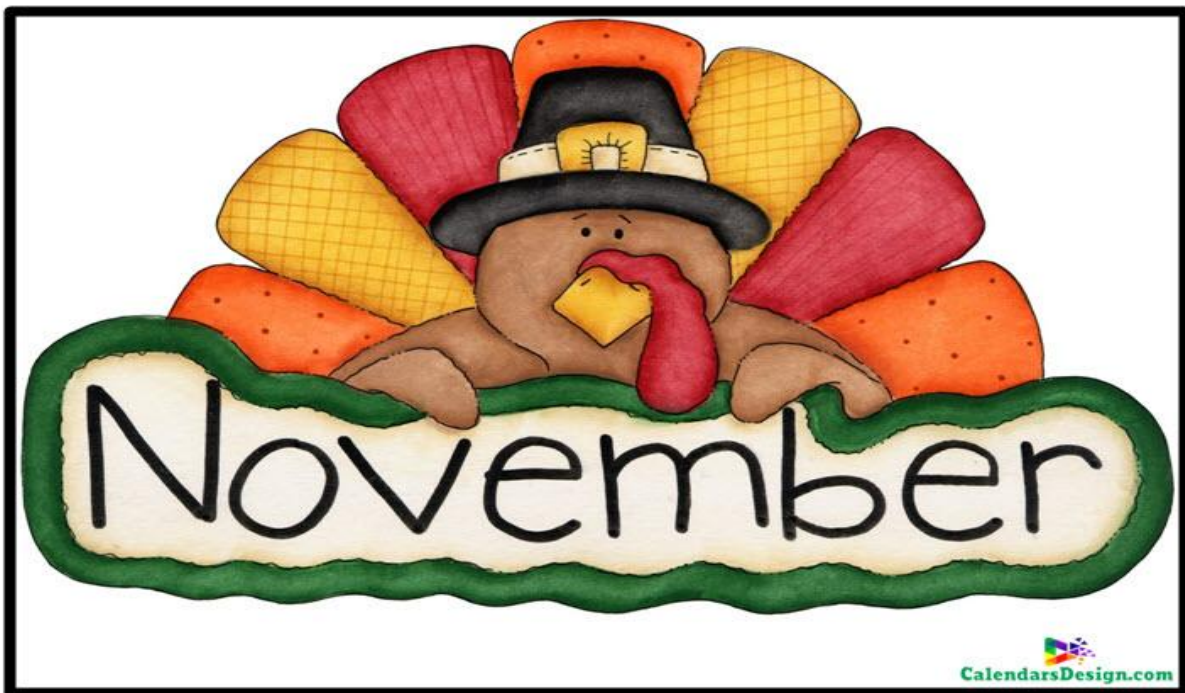
