Pastor's Page

"What are you working for?"

The thought occurs to me that as your pastor I don't explain myself a

whole lot. It may be helpful for you to understand a little bit more about how I work and function as a pastor here in Spearfish. What I say to you here today may seem obvious, but I think it helpful to share.

I watch people. I love to watch people. I love to watch people make a difference in this church, community and world. And I try to be one of those people who strives to make a difference. When I am watching others, I am asking the question, "What are you working for?"

Realize that I am asking this with the full realization that there is an opposite question: "What are you working against?"

Of course, the two questions are simply two sides of the same coin. Throughout human history, people have worked against and for things in all kinds of ways. Financially, we work against poverty and for wealth. Emotionally, we work against chaos and for stability. Politically, we work against one idea and for another. Spiritually? Spiritually, we work against sin / evil and for God's presence / salvation.

Some focus more of their energy on working against things. It's really important to stand against the things in this world you believe are wrong. I have a whole list of things that I work against, BUT...as your pastor, I choose to focus the vast amount of my energy on working FOR things. I absolutely believe that sin needs to be named and confronted as we work against it, but I find it to be working for the good to be much more powerful.

What are you working for? Here's my plan: I don't focus on what I can't do; I focus on what I can. I don't focus on what can't happen; I focus on what can. I don't focus on the negative; I will almost always focus on the positive. I don't focus on the fear that can confront us day in and day out; I focus on the living power of love

that is greater than that fear. I try not to focus on the failure which happens in all our lives; I focus on what steps come next after the failure.

Through the years, some have thought that positivity as a chosen focus is missing the point. After all, there is so much to be afraid of and angry about; I should put my energy into confronting fear and anger. I've tried that. I find it futile and exhausting. Instead I choose to channel the power of Jesus Christ that lies in the fruits of the Spirit. In Galatians 5:22-23 I claim "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." Those are the qualities in life that fuel and drive me.

It may make a difference to you in the future to know that I as your pastor am seeking to make a difference right here and now with you.


If you have not had any training on how to use an AED, we encourage you to go to Google and watch the demonstration.

Spring "Walk to Emmaus"

- The Men's Walk will be on April 23-26, 2020 at Lake Poinsett, near Arlington, SD.
- **The Women's Walk** will be on April 30-May 3 at Lake Poinsett near Arlington, SD.



The Walk to Emmaus is named because the experience is similar to the Bible story in Luke 24:13-34 in which the risen Christ joins the two disciples with who were walking to Emmaus from Jerusalem. By walking with Jesus, reflecting on the scriptures, breaking bread together, and

sharing the resurrection stories, the disciples experienced

Christ's presence and their hearts felt a burning within them. It's your opportunity to walk with the Lord.

The program is a 72-hour experience starting at 7:00 pm and ending about 7:00 pm on Sunday evening. There is no "physical walking distance," but a "walk" with others in fellowship, learning and fun. The Walk focuses on God's grace with 15 talks, 10 given by lay persons and 5 by clergy followed by discussion. There are special times of worship, daily celebration of Holy Communion, and the prayers surrounding the weekend.

The aim of Emmaus is to inspire, challenge and equip local Church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, places of work and communities.

Council Highlights January 15, 2020

Treasurer's Report: For December income for the **General Fund** was \$53,366.47, and expenses were \$42,929.59. The General Fund ended the month \$10,436.88 in the black. The year to date (and therefore year-end) balance was \$18,713.96 in the black with all apportionments paid for 2019. Income for the year exceeded that from last year by \$2,085.28. For December, the income for UMCOC was \$3,335.00, and expenses were \$6,982.49, leaving the **UMCOC** Fund in the red \$3,647.49 for the month but in the black \$9,889.04 for the yearend balance. Income for December for Children First was \$41,291.97, and expenses were \$32,615.84. Children First ended the month in the black \$8,676.13. Year to date balance is \$13,501.84 four months into the CF fiscal year. The **Debt** Retirement/Capital Fund income for December was \$3,930, and expenses were \$0.00. The year-end balance is \$50,993.54. Mission-giving for December was \$20,758.00. Much of this was due either to participant payments on the Honduras Mission Trip or to the Christmas Eve Pastor's Discretionary offering. **Mission** expenses (distributions) were \$10.898.68 with much of this reflecting Honduras expenses. Pastor's Discretionary Fund was the Mission of the Month and received \$10,021.70 in donations.

CHILDREN FIRST: The Children First budget began September 2019 and was revised to adjust some salaries and a few other areas. There was a recent expenditure to improve Wi-Fi in classrooms, partly funded by SUMC Investment earnings of \$776. There have also been recent donations and a Joan Follette memorial for a total of about \$4000. Children First wants to thank everyone who pledged to CF for 2020 for a total of \$12,800. December was profitable with fewer days for fewer employees; January has 3 pay periods. The Children First Board wishes to add a room so that infants and young toddlers can be separated.

<u>HEALTH MINISTRIES:</u> We are planning to have a Health Forum, "Prepare to Care" in the Spring. This will be given by Sheila Powell and Joanna Jones. This forum will give

information on how to best help your family/friends in need of extra help/care. (This was planned on Oct. 20, 2019 but was cancelled due to an early winter storm). We will be updating the Health Ministry Website. An AED Training planned again in 2020. It is working well. The green light in the AED box shows it is "ready." Orvette checks the green light monthly so we know it is adequately charged. We are checking First Aid boxes every 2-3 months. There are 5 in the church. The Diabetic Screening and Blood Pressure Screening is planned for April or May. When the "Green Prayer Request Cards" are received, they are forwarded to Congregational Ministry Team for prayer. Our committee will continue to promote "prayer opportunities" in the church. Prayers being offered for the Honduras Mission Team (Jan. 12-Jan.24 and Feb. 1-Feb. 13.) We have received a set of new books entitled May I Walk You Home. This book offers courage and comfort for caregivers of the very ill. We are offering it to the congregation. The "Promoting Vision Support" group that meets the second Monday, at 3:00 P.M. at the Hickory House is being led by Candy Larsen. The monthly Communion Prayer Station volunteers list has been updated.

<u>STAFF/PARISH RELATIONS REPORT:</u> The only item to report thus far is that while Barry recuperates, his wife will cover the high points, but he may not be able to do heavy lifting for a while.

TRUSTEES REPORT: Trustees did not meet in January; our last meeting December 4th. There will be an insurance increase in coverage for UMCOC due to the new heating boiler being valued at \$150,000.00. The Trustees are checking with our insurance agent. There was discussion on the flame repair on the south side of the church because it is very dull at night after \$2,000.00 plus on repairs. We are working on suggestions for our Security Team.

WORSHIP REPORT: Many thanks to the following: Michelle for the Taize services and for Christmas Eve 7:30 service; Colleen and Emma for the Noon and 5:00 Christmas Eve services, and for Amahl in January; Kathy for planning and serving the Christmas Eve lunch; and Scott and Kevin for their dedication to each and every service and event (including movie night). We are still working to involve more lay readers, communion servers, and service helpers of all kinds. We have appreciated the new readers but still need to be able to handle services when Scott is away without anyone being overwhelmed. Planning for Lent and Easter is in process, with the following events planned with those taking a leadership role listed: February 26 Ash Wednesday: Scott; Taize services – Michelle; Maundy Thursday April 9 – 7:00 p.m.; April 5 – Palm Sunday - Colleen, Emma; April 11 - Lazarus Saturday -Michelle – 5:30 p.m.; April 12 – Easter--Sunrise – Rod, Annette, others – 6:30 a.m.; Gathering – Colleen – 8:15 a.m.; Breakfast – egg bake?; Sanctuary – Colleen and Emma – 10:30

Discussion Items: The policies being brought to council from Stewardship and Finance are not ready. Peggy will send copies to all later, and they will be ready for discussion at next month's meeting.

Action Items: Peggy Bosch brought forth a motion for approval of a \$750 Benevolence Fund request from Stewardship and Finance. This was for a member with hardship in dealing with serious health concerns. The motion carried. Peggy brought the UMCOC Budget for discussion. Peggy Bosch made a motion to approve the budget, and it was seconded by John Kissack. The motion carried. Next, a revised Children First budget was brought after it became an option for pledges. Janelle Jones made a motion to approve the revised budget, and Peggy Bosch seconded it. The motion carried.

Learning/Planning: Kirk led the Council in a discussion of the five pillars and the goals. Colleen brought a goal from the Outreach subcommittee, and other areas were discussed as well. The following goals are being considered for each pillar, and in February the Council will approve the goals as well as form strategies to accomplish each goal.

- Family Involvement: Our church will increase family engagement through community involvement.
- Lay Leadership: Our church will expand and revamp Discipleship opportunities.
- Outreach: Our church will be an active member of our local and world communities that cares in tangible ways for both church and community members.
- Communication: Our church staff, administrative council, committees, and small groups will communicate information, needs, and celebrations with the church body through printed and spoken avenues and social media.
- Capital Needs: Our church will identify and prioritize long term needs and wants.

Next Meeting: Wednesday, February 19, 2020 at 7:30 p.m. These meetings are open to everyone.
