<u>First</u>, a HUGE word of THANKS to all of you who have been participating in our Discipleship Assessments in the last couple weeks. At the time of writing this, I have 171 assessments filled out and on my desk. There are more coming. This is a return rate of just over 80%, which is nothing short of stunning.

#### THANK YOU!

Second, a HUGE word of INVITATION to all of you who would still like to fill out one of Discipleship Assessments. These simple one-page forms are helping us to figure out how folks in our congregation are incorporating some of the basic faith practices into their lives. We have been asking simple questions about worship attendance, use of prayer, Bible usage, serving others and so much more. Every individual and every family who returns these forms is helping me so much as a pastor to understand more and more deeply what is going on in our church and therefore how best to cast vision into our future.

Remember! If you give us an assessment, we have a free CHURCH MUG to share with your family! I really want to hear from our children as well as every generation of our adults.

So.....

What's the next step? What am I going to do with all of this information?

I feel that these assessments have been done in the same way that you would take someone's temperature. They are helping me as a pastor determine where we are so that we can figure out where we want to go in both the immediate and distant future.

The assessments are in the three sections of our church's Vision Statement: Know God. Love God. Serve Others. This is saying how we relate to God with our heads, our hearts, and our hands. So, for instance, there are questions about worship attendance. This is going to help us evaluate more deeply what's going on as we gather each week. It will also guide us in our ongoing "course corrections" as we seek to always make worship more relevant. (I was really surprised by some of the comments just in the first small handful I started to look through. It was immediately evident that I need to make some changes in how I deliver sermons. That's really helpful to know.) We are asking questions about so many things that are common in the lives of Christians, but may not be easy to implement on a day-to-day basis. This info will help us to "put the cookies on the bottom shelf." We are always seeking better ways to present and teach faith, better ways to be more effective.

So, THANK YOU! You are helping to guide your pastor, and I in turn will be more equipped in helping our congregation as we grow!

#### Spring "Walk to Emmaus"

- The Men's Walk will be on April 23-26, 2020 at Lake Poinsett, near Arlington, SD.
- The Women's Walk will be on April 30-May 3 at Lake Poinsett near Arlington, SD.



The Walk to Emmaus is named because the experience is similar to the Bible story in Luke 24:13-34 in which the risen Christ joins the two disciples with who were walking to Emmaus from Jerusalem. By walking with Jesus, reflecting on the scriptures, breaking bread together, and

sharing the resurrection stories, the disciples experienced Christ's presence and their hearts felt a burning within them. It's your opportunity to walk with the Lord.

The program is a 72-hour experience starting at 7:00 pm and ending about 7:00 pm on Sunday evening. There is no "physical walking distance," but a "walk" with others in fellowship, learning and fun. The Walk focuses on God's grace with 15 talks, 10 given by lay persons and 5 by clergy followed by discussion. There are special times of worship, daily celebration of Holy Communion, and the prayers surrounding the weekend.

The aim of Emmaus is to inspire, challenge and equip local Church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, places of work and communities.

#### Council Highlights February 19, 2020

TREASURER'S REPORT: A payment was made on our debt reducing the amount owed to \$180,442.85. For the month of January income for the General Fund is \$30,160.16 and expenses are \$46,258.91. The General Fund ended the month \$16,098.75 in the red, however apportionments were paid since the Prior Years Balance has plenty of money. Income was low for the month and there were three payrolls. The year to date balance is also \$16,098.75 in the red. For January the income for **UMCOC** is \$7,265.00, which is high due to some pre-paid rents paid in 2019 for 2020, and expenses are \$4,794.75 leaving the UMCOC Fund in the black \$2,470.25 for the month and also for the year to date. Income for January for Children First is \$36,490.30 and expenses are \$46,097.36. Children First ended the month in the red \$9,607.36 due to the three payrolls in January. Year to date balance is \$3,894.48 in the black five months into the CF fiscal year. The Debt Retirement/Capital Fund income for January is \$2,900.80. Expenses are \$7,000.00 reflecting the payment on the loan. Year to date balance is \$46,894.34. Mission-giving for January is \$7,119.30. Mission expenses (distributions) were \$19,264.29 with much of this reflecting Honduras expenses. The Missions of the Month were Human Relations for which \$495.00 was given and Honduras VIM for which \$5,934.30 was collected.

- <u>CHILDREN FIRST REPORT:</u> Children First closed on Friday, February 7, because of the number of children and staff that had influenza A & B, strep, and RSV. They are considering what the reimbursement will be for the parents and staff. Children First will be using the Chapman Fund distribution for children scholarships and, if any is remaining, for staff certification and training. Mac and Cheese was served Tuesday, February 4 in UMC Sunday school rooms. January had 3 payrolls, insurance payment, thus \$9607.36 of expenses over income. Next special event at UMC is Friday, March 13 for Donuts with Dads at 7 am.
- <u>CHILDREN/YOUTH/FAMILY MINISTRIES</u>: March teachers are lined up for Children's Church as well as set up. Vacation Bible School will be the first week of June. Curriculum will be Cokesbury Nights of the North Castle. Camp Sunday will be the weekend of April 25/26. A discussion was held about Easter Sunday as well as the Parents Day Out what went well and what to improve.
- <u>HEALTH MINISTRIES</u>: A Health Forum, "Prepare to Care," is set up for April 26 from 3 to 4 p.m. with AARP representatives, Joanna Jones and Sheila Powell. This forum will give people tools on how to best help family and friends who need extra help/care. This is an excellent program. It will be open to the community. All 5 First Aid Kits, throughout the church, have been updated. The Health Ministry section on the church website has been updated. The Emergency Food Bags in the church office have been updated. This is for people who need food immediately and/or cannot travel to Safeway to use a Safeway card.
- <u>MISSIONS</u>: Giving for January -Benevolence Fund \$200; Pastor's Discretionary \$210; Human Relations Day \$495; Solar Oven Project \$100; Hope Center \$100; and the Food Pantry \$80. The January Mission of the Month was Honduras VIM and \$5934 was distributed immediately. The February "Mission of the Month" is Meals on Wheels.

- <u>STAFF/PARISH RELATIONS REPORT:</u> Pastor Scott led a discussion on outcome-based job descriptions. We will rewrite for both full and part time positions. The most current versions of the current job descriptions will be collected and an OBJD template will be developed. This will be done by the April meeting. Then each individual committee member will work with their staff member to complete the details of the OBJD. There was discussion of a possible fundraiser for Barry and his family in coordination with the Worship Committee. The committee will continue looking for adults to help provide substitute help in the nursery.
- STEWARDSHIP/FINANCE REPORT: Peggy presented • the following updated policies which were approved by the Stewardship and Finance board: Pastor Discretionary Fund, Contribution, Benevolence Fund, Safe-Guarding Church Revenue, and the Mission Trip policy. The church received \$982.23 from the Grace Huck Endowment. Scott asked that \$500 of the money be used to cover the part of the cost on the new church mugs. He will be doing a survey in worship in the next few weeks and when the individual turns the survey back in they will receive one of the new mugs. The total cost of the mugs is \$1690. Half the cost (\$845) will be for the survey. The other \$345 Scott will cover with his accountable plan. The rest of the \$846 will come from the Mug Ministry Fund. A motion was made and seconded and approved for the money to be used for Scott's assessment. Karen requested that the remaining Grace Huck Endowment money be used for the Clothe-a-Kid mission. Grace Huck had started the program around 20 years ago and now most of the churches and other organizations in Spearfish support and contribute to it. There are 150 children that are given the money to shop at Wal-Mart before the school year begins for their school clothing. The children must apply and meet a certain criterion to receive the funds. The church hosts an ice cream social as part of the program. A motion was made and seconded and approved for the money to be used for The Clothe a Kid mission
- WORSHIP REPORT: There will be special altar • decorations for Lent and Easter, and the palms are ordered. February 23 is Transfiguration Sunday and Children's Church will stay for service. Assessment forms will be completed with mugs for completed forms. The committee is planning for Lent and Easter: February 26 – Ash Wednesday (Scott); March 5 - Taize (Michelle); March 28-29 (Ideas for fifth Sunday event); April 4-5 (Jews for Jesus guest) - Communion - Palm Sunday; April 9 - Taize for Maundy Thursday (Michelle); April 10 - Good Friday -Church youth will plan and lead service.; April 11 – Lazarus Saturday (Michelle); April 12 - Easter @ Sunrise: (Rod, Annette, others - 6:30 a.m.); Continental breakfast between services ; Gathering: (Colleen – 8:15 a.m. Breakfast – egg bake) Sanctuary: (Colleen and Emma – 10:30 a.m.)
- *Discussion Items*...There were no discussion items for this month.
- Action Items ... There were five policies that were brought from the Stewardship and Finance Committee to the Council for approval. They included the following: Pastor's Discretionary Fund, Benevolence Fund, Contributions, Safeguarding Church Revenue, and Mission Trips. The first four were just updated; however, the last policy was new. Clarence Moshier presented them from Stewardship and

Finance to the Council and made a motion to approve them. The motion carried.

• Learning/Planning...Kirk and Pastor Scott led us in a lengthy discussion of the 5 Spearfish UMC 2020-2022 Goals under the pillars of Family Involvement, Lay Leadership, Outreach, Communication, and Capital Needs. After much discussion, Kirk asked for leaders to take this back to their group meetings and create SMART goals with a strategy designed by their committee to contribute to the fulfillment of the one or more of the goals in the time frame indicated. The council will then discuss in March how best to direct our efforts and work together on any overlapping strategies. Kirk will send a Guideline Sheet to Penny who will email it to all council chairs to work on before the March meeting.

Next Meeting of the Council: March 18, 2020 at 7:30 p.m. These meetings are open to everyone.
