The

"Abundance in the Dust"

It was 1936. My grandmother sat on the front steps of my mother's home in East Grand Forks, Minnesota. Most times of the year, they lived a hundred yards from the Red River of the North. Every year during the spring, before the dikes were built, they lived as an island in the Red as the river rose surrounding their house and filling their basement. But there was no water anywhere near the front steps that day as Grandma just sat and cried. It was July. There was no garden harvest yet. The canned goods down on the basement shelves was running low. The small paycheck my grandfather tried to bring home each week was gone. There was nothing.

And Grandma sat on the front steps surrounded by dust weeping.

But that's not the end of the story. I always marveled when she would tell this small piece of living history because she told it rarely, and she told it carefully. As she sat there with her head in her hands, a small



breeze blew down the street. Out of the corner of her eye, Grandma detected motion. Looking over, half buried in the dust, was a \$5 bill. The breeze caused it to wave at her.

As it caught her eye, it also caught her heart. \$5 was a huge amount of money in East Grand Forks, Minnesota in those days. Grandma always believed that God somehow always provides.

Joy. Gratitude. Abundance.

These are the words I call us to in our church, in our families, and in our communities. These are not easy times, especially for those who have lost their income and their independence. But these are not times of scarcity.

There is JOY in the midst of our days if we will only realize it.

There is GRATITUDE in the midst of our difficulties if we will only exercise it.


There is ABUNDANCE in the midst of our shortages if we will only recognize and then claim it. Joy. Gratitude. Abundance.

But these are gifts that are not just given to us. They are also gifts that we give to others. How is it today that you are seeing others in your daily living who are short on joy, stingy with gratitude, and short on an abundance mentality? It won't cost you a thing to share with them.



COVID 19 Financial Task Force

During this time of COVID 19 restrictions and economic impact, a COVID Financial Task Force (CFTF) has been formed to support our finance department in making economic decisions for Spearfish United Methodist Church (SUMC), Children First (CF), and United Methodist Outreach Center (UMCOC). This ten person task force is comprised of representatives from our finance department, Children First, UMCOC, and members at large. Our purpose is to maintain financial solvency for each of these three entities between, at a minimum, April through August. We will review income and expenses and determine how to best pay expenses so that when we are able to reopen program doors, we are ready.

The CFTF appreciates the generosity that has been shown from the congregation and we ask for your continued financial support and prayers as we look forward and plan for the future.

Reflections on Children First

I am a cheerleader for Children First, the best early learning option in Spearfish, in my opinion. I am Janelle Jones, chairperson of CF Board. Spearfish UMC owns and operates CF. I am proud to say as a church "We are Children First."

Children First has a staff of 20 who have been off the job since March 16 when schools closed. Thank you to many who give to CF with pledges or special gifts. The donations of \$25 Safeway cards for the staff netted two for each CF employee. Thank you to all donors. These are still a welcome way to help.

As we experience this pandemic, some of us received \$1200 from the federal government but spend less. Currently I do not go to the coffee shop at 7 a.m. or dinner with friends, or shop as often, or drive as much or travel out of town. I will give that \$1200 to CF. Please consider an extra gift to the church or any charity if you can.

Expenses exceed income for CF. Examples include reimbursement to families for half of March tuition (some go to kindergarten and others may never return), uncertainty about when to reopen, summer income low or lacking, and rent to UMCOC. What about continued wages for a staff of 20? What might change in western SD with tourist season and Biker Rally?

Thank you to Mary Tracy, UMC financial assistant, and others who helped secure a forgivable loan from the CARES Act, primarily to pay 8 weeks of wages for CF and UMC.

CF Board makes decisions regarding school calendar, when to close, tuition rates, staff wages, etc. Normal pay has been granted to the 20 employees since mid March with the forgivable loan covering mid April until mid June. In the past, unprecedented closures happened when the new boiler/asbestos work was done and for one day due to influenza spreading at CF.

CF director Melissa Raad does an excellent job of managing income and expenses. Most of us don't tear paper napkins in half to save money. She and Sarah Hazledine plan for staff hours to meet the requirements of being a state licensed facility. The funds are wellmanaged. The staff is well trained with mandated annual training. There is very low turnover. We value the staff of Children First.

I am asking for your prayers and your generosity so that Children First is strong and stable whenever it reopens. We recognize that if CF opens this summer, participation and income will probably be lower than normal. Thank you for your support of Children First.

Without smashing the cans we get about \$18 for a pickup load.

Council Highlights April 15, 2020

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Foundation investments √ have been updated. Those investments are tied to the stock market so, of course, all went down. For the month of March, income for the General Fund was \$38,574.09, and expenses were \$35,909.00. The General Fund ended the month \$2,665.09 in the black with apportionments paid. The year to date balance is \$8,657.13 in the red due to a financially terrible January. So, the catch-up continued for March. For March the income for UMCOC was \$5,075.00, and expenses were \$4,207.48, leaving the UMCOC Fund in the black \$867.52 for the month and in the black \$3,322.70 for the year to date balance. Income for March for Children First was \$44,305.63, and expenses were \$33,208.43. Children First ended the month in the black \$11,097.20. Year to date balance is \$29,123.29 in the black seven months into the CF fiscal year. CF has not yet refunded any tuition to the parents for March. The Debt Retirement/Capital Fund income for March was \$3,809.06, and expenses were \$0.00. Year to date balance is \$54,252.14. Mission-giving for March was \$9,216.09, mostly due to a large contribution to Pastor's Discretionary. Mission expenses (distributions) were

\$7,461.09. The Mission of the Month was UMCOR for which the offering was \$505.00.

- ✓ CHILDREN FIRST REPORT: Children First closed on Friday, March 13, 2020 due to COVID-19. However, Children First is paying staff 100% of wages. The Children First Board requested a waiver of April rent to UMCOC. UMC and Children First applied for a small business loan from the CARES act. Safeway cards were donated to all 20 Children First staff. Several staff members delivered Easter baskets to all CF families, including a book for each CF child. The books were purchased from the Dakotas Conference breakthrough grant. This grant also funds Mac and Cheese at the church and Donuts with Dads, which was held March 13. Please pray for staff, families, and CF board.
- CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILY MINISTRIES <u>REPORT</u>: Katie Clark has been creating a home package that has activities that parents can lead with their kids. Katie is looking into maybe trying a face to face interaction with Children's Church via Zoom or Facebook live. Brainstorming ideas right now but will see what happens.
- ✓ MISSIONS REPORT: The Committee has decided to not publicize the April and May scheduled "Missions of the Month" and instead encourage people to give to local programs that are helping people during this crazy time. The following programs have been lifted up in the Trumpeter – Pastor's Discretionary Fund (Safeway cards), Spearfish Strong Community United (Studio 621), United Way of the Black Hills, and the Spearfish Food Pantry.
- ✓ STEWARDSHIP AND FINANCE REPORT: The Stewardship and Finance Committee held their monthly meeting via Zoom in April. Committee reports were given, but there is not much activity going on. Under new business, it was voted on and approved to form a Church Task Force to look at the impact of COVID-19 on the church finances. The committee will consist of around 10 people to represent all sectors of the church (Trustees, UMCOC, Council, Children First, and Staff Parish). Chris Davis will be the chair of this committee. Peggy Bosch has created a 5-month projection of expenditures for each of the church units (SUMC, UMCOC, CF). There is a projected shortfall that the Task Force will need to address. Mary Tracy has applied for a CARES ACT loan/grant of \$101,530 to cover roughly 2.5 months of staff salaries. She is working with a local bank to complete the SBA paperwork.
- ✓ UNITED METHODIST WOMEN REPORT: Connie Swander-Ericsson is group emailing members on a weekly basis. Many are responding with encouragement and fun ideas to help keep busy. Nothing comes close to seeing others in person but we're grateful for modern technology.
- ✓ WORSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT: Many thanks to Scott McKirdy, Colleen McKirdy, Emma McKirdy-Wilsey, Connie Hubbard, Michelle Jennings, and Kevin Nakajima for preparing our online worship services these past three weekends. This has required planning and preparation and then the lengthy process of recording and uploading the video to the church website. Members of the Worship Committee have met online to discuss ways to support Pastor McKirdy as he leads us in worship each week. More online resources are being developed to draw us together during this time of physical distancing.

- ✓ YOUTH COUNCIL REPORT: The Youth continue to meet on Zoom on a weekly basis. Confirmation class met last month via Zoom. Brenda Swanson continues to work from home in keeping our youth connected. Note cards are being sent to encourage our youth. Text messages are also sent with notes of encouragement.
- Discussion Items. . . Connie Hubbard brought up that as we \checkmark move back into discussion of the 5 Pillars that we be sure to assess any goal accomplishment that we have. Connie Hubbard then asked the Council if all committees had a current job description. Chris Davis felt it would be a good idea for committees to revamp what they do. Pastor Scott shared that the Trustees would be electing a new chair in the near future as their co-chairs need to step back from that for a bit. On Wednesday, April 22, a Task Force, headed by Chris Davis, will meet to look into ways to pay bills through August. The Spearfish UMC church staff and the Children First staff are currently being paid at 100%. Mary Tracy has applied for a Care Loan through Pioneer Bank in the amount of \$100,000. If this is used for salaries and utilities only, it can turn into a grant rather than a loan. according to Tom Dies at Pioneer Bank. It is currently looking favorable. Linda Hoxie felt that being able to get your church pledge changed to online was a positive thing. Pastor Scott asked for the Council to spread the news to give feedback on worship so that they can keep improving. Kevin Nakajima shared that there will be an extra license with CCLI in order to be able to stream music online.

Action Items. . . There were no Action Items. Learning/Planning. . . Postponed until another meeting. Next Meeting of the Council: May 20, 2020

More are a part of the Tree of Life Ministry in Mission, SD on the Rosebud Reservation which serves several of the poorest counties in the United States. There are three areas of Ministry supported by the Dakotas Conference of the United Methodist Church: Tree of Life Thrift Store, construction/home repair, and the Warm Welcome Center. Warm Welcome operates as a cooperative store. Each guest that enters pays \$1.06 which entitles the guest to a gift of whatever the co-op has for the day (crackers, fruit, vegetables, etc.) and a hot meal of breakfast or lunch in the dining area.

Tree of Life began to renovate the Warm Welcome Kitchen area to separate the kitchen and dining area thus making it secure for the kitchen staff. Even with the kitchen closed for renovation, they continue feeding from a house. During the Coronavirus, the school has been preparing 5,000 meals a day. In addition to the 5,000 meals, they also provide for their many senior citizens. Your generous offerings during May will encourage the community served by the Tree of Life ministry.
