"The flu shot is more important than ever before."



Have you had your annual flu shot? If not, it is time. October is a great month to get a flu shot, as it covers you through flu season. Getting a flu shot can greatly reduce your risk of getting the flu and helps prevent you from spreading it, which is especially important during a pandemic.

Flu is a contagious disease. It usually spreads between Sept. and May. Each year thousands of Americans die from the flu, and many more are hospitalized.

Who should get the flu shot: The Communicable Disease Center (CDC) recommends everyone 6 months of age and older get vaccinated every flu season. The vaccine is considered to be "very safe." It is also recommended for pregnant women. It takes about 2 weeks for protection to develop after vaccination.

It is recommended that people over 65 years get the "high-dose flu vaccine." (It provides a higher degree of protection, as older people have decreased immune systems.) If you have questions regarding getting a flu vaccine, talk with your health care provider. (You may get the flu vaccine at local pharmacies and from your physician's office).

If you have never had the flu and don't see the reason for the vaccine, this is the year to start. More people getting the flu shot means fewer people who need to be hospitalized for flu. Save the hospital beds for the ill Covid-19 patients!

Physical distancing, mask wearing, and hand-washing will all help to prevent influenza, but the flu vaccine is THE MOST IMPORTANT! You will help protect your family and community when you get the flu shot.

Council Highlights

September 16, 2020

- ✓ **Treasurer's Report:** The checking account is low, but Mary transferred money on September 1 from the Money Market to the Checking Account. Mary is just now working with our banker, Tom Deis, to do the final reckoning on the PPP loan. It appears that SUMC will be forgiven the entire loan. For the month of August income for the **General Fund** is \$31,981.62, and expenses are \$33,809.39. The ending balance for the month of August is \$1,827.77 in the red with apportionments paid. The year to date balance is \$17,654.71. An insurance payment was made in August. For August the income for **UMCOC** is \$5,080.00, and expenses are \$4,461.46. This leaves the **UMCOC** Fund in the black \$618.54 for the month and in the black \$8,586.44 for the year to date balance. **UMCOC** pays part of the insurance payment. Income for August for **Children First** is \$21,089.60. Expenses are \$31,579.61. **Children First** ended the month in the red \$10,490.01, but in the black \$2,137.74 for the year to date balance which is also the balance for the end of the CF fiscal year. August was expected to be a difficult month financially as CF deals with the effect COVID 19 has had on them. CF pays part of the insurance payment, also. The **Debt Retirement / Capital Fund** income for August is \$3,127.64. There were no expenses for August. Year to date balance is \$56,905.67. **Mission-giving** for August is \$6,845.00 with Clothe-

A-Kid receiving \$4,775.00 and Pastor's Discretionary Fund receiving \$1,420.00. **Mission expenses** (distributions) are \$8,841.87 including \$4,877.23 used for Clothe-A-Kid, \$1,200.00 for Elisha Intern salary, and distributions from the Pastor's Discretionary Fund of \$1,775.00.

- ✓ **Children First:** Children First is the September Mission of the Month. CF started the fall term on September 1 with specific guidelines. Some ages have lower enrollment. Staff costs are higher due to staff to student ratio, keeping ages separated and other COVID demands. As CF ended a fiscal year, extra income from those who pledged to CF (\$12,000), unpledged funds (\$21,000) and a special COVID donation (\$22,000) kept CF in operation. End of year balance was \$2137.74. PPP loan for COVID relief added \$52,000 to CF income. This helped to keep staff employed while closed. The new budget has been approved.
- ✓ **Children Youth and Family Ministries:** Online Children's Church has started. They watch a Bible story together and do a small activity. They are looking to make it hands on and looking to add things such as Scott creating a Children's Sermon to watch. It was decided to remain online for the rest of the calendar year. The Youth have officially started weekly meetings, but they will be outside for as long as possible. Vacation Bible School only had two attendees, so they will use the same curriculum again next year.
- ✓ **Health Ministries:** Presently they are not meeting. Hopefully the Coronavirus will be controlled better in the near future. We continue on with our established programs and have started the card ministry.
- ✓ **Memorials:** There was no actual meeting, but two memorial plaques were ordered and mounted for Cliff Rusch and Gae Koski.
- ✓ **Missions:** The September Mission of the Month is Children First. Because their scholarship fund is not in need, they requested that we give to their general fund. Mission gifts during the month of August are as follows: Benevolence Fund, \$225; Pastor's Discretionary, \$1420; Solar Oven Partners, \$125; Clothe-a-Kid, \$4775; Food Pantry, \$90; and LaGonave Alive, \$210.
- ✓ **Stewardship and Finance Report:** A Motion made, seconded, and passed to give S & F blessing to Council's decision to send the Conference \$5,000 plus whatever additional was collected for Dakotas Camps. Charge Conference will be held Wednesday, October 21, 2020. Barry Penn's wife, Jodi, will fill in for Barry who will likely have shoulder surgery on October 5. The Security Team met with Gene's lock shop for getting a quote for interior and exterior

cameras. The Team is also looking into creating a medical team in the event of a medical emergency during services. The PPP Loan helped all three entities, but especially helped Children First retain their staff so they could reopen with staff in place. The COVID Financial Task Force has dissolved after completing its task of monitoring church finances April through August. For the fall and beyond S & F will continue to monitor church finances closely. Scott will be leading the Stewardship Campaign using the “Enough” series. He has a timeline worked out for the various letters and presentations and will ask for S & F help as he needs it. Commitment Weekend will be the last weekend of October. A new van has been donated to the church.

- ✓ **Trustees:** Trustees have hired Lowe's Roofing to do the flat roof of UMCOC and the flat parts of the church roof which were damaged by hail. The shingling and the rest of the work due to the hail damage will be done by Tuff Storm Solutions. They can do all the work needed for the parsonage this fall, also the stucco on the church. The church and UMCOC roof projects will not take place until next summer. The new insurance policy is being reviewed by Mark Tracy of Trustees and others.
- ✓ **UMCOC:** The Covid-19 recommendations presented and approved at last month's council meeting are posted at the North entry to building. Faucet repairs were requested and completed. Children First is functioning as normal for time of year. Youth and Family Services plan on using multi-purpose room for yearly screenings yet this fall virus screening in their upstairs office area in the past. Summit Church doing home schooling outside during the month of September, as described to Ron Borgman. Spearfish Community Action continues to function per Covid-19 status of delivering commodities outside to clients. September 28th is the day the boiler will be fired for the heating season. An engineer from Sioux Falls will be here to complete that task.
- ✓ **Worship:** We have not held group meetings during the pandemic months. Members of the committee along with worship team members and volunteers from the congregation have made extraordinary efforts to create communal worship opportunities online and in person. The committee has discussed ways to adjust to the recent surge of Covid cases in our county and state, and ways to anticipate changes as autumn continues. We especially appreciate the hard work of the following people: Scott McKirdy, Kevin Nakajima, and the worship teams led by Michelle Jennings, Colleen McKirdy, and Emma McKirdy-Wilsey.

✓ **Youth Council:** Youth met outdoors through the summer months, and the September youth meetings will be outdoors or offsite. We welcomed 5 new youth at our first September gathering. An outdoor movie night is scheduled for Sept. 25, weather permitting and if the screen arrives. Everyone is welcome. The fall rummage sale is scheduled for October 10th. Covid policies will be in place for sale and set up, including masks and sanitation. We are sorry to lose Jean Lewers-Brail as our special friend to youth and a mentor in youth ministry. Thank you to her and her family for the memorial in her name being donated to the youth! Church members who would be willing to serve a youth meal on a Wednesday can contact Brenda.

Discussion Items. . . It was decided to go month by month as to whether to meet in person or by Zoom and also to keep the time flexible. For October, Council will meet by Zoom at 7:00 on October 21.

Action Items. . . There were no Action items.

Learning/Planning. . . Scott reminded us that last year under the leadership of Kirk Easton Council developed 5 pillars with goals listed under each as future endeavors of Spearfish United Methodist Church. The pillars are Family Involvement, Lay Leadership, Outreach, Communication, and Capital Needs. The pillars and goals are now ready to be implemented. Connie Hubbard and Scott have worked together to create a Google Document on the pillars and goals which Connie will send to each Committee Chair to present to their committee at the committee's next meeting.


A Letter of Thanks
