"The Big Tent"


I believe in "The Big Tent" when it comes to being part of a church. Our United Methodist Church

has been a Big Tent since its inception. The phrase "Big Tent" refers to having enough space in our church to accommodate differences: differences in theology, differences in race, differences in biblical interpretation, differences in politics, differences in age, differences in economic strata, differences in educational experience.... In short, differences in anything and everything.

I love the vibrancy that happens in a church when we focus not on what could divide us but rather on what unites us: God's saving grace through Jesus Christ.

Typically, this has the potential to be a really dull conversation. We can easily take it for granted that everyone else in the church is pretty much just like me. There are times that we don't think of our church as a Big Tent. It just is what it is filled with the people it is filled with. In this day and age of polarization in our nation and around the globe however, it's really important to remind us all that God has a Big Tent vision.

God does not separate or seek to divide us. God doesn't play that game. Instead, God takes all our differences and blends them together.



The author Henri Nouwen said it like this, "Community is like a large mosaic. Each little piece seems so insignificant. One piece is bright red, another cold blue or dull green, another warm purple, another sharp yellow, another shining gold. Some look precious,

others ordinary. Some look valuable, others worthless. Some look gaudy, others delicate. As individual stones, we can do little with them except compare them and judge their beauty and value. When, however, all these little stones are brought together in one big mosaic portraying the face of Christ, who would ever question the importance of any one of them? If one of them, even the least spectacular one, is missing, the face is incomplete. Together in the one mosaic, each little stone is indispensable and makes a unique contribution to the glory of God. That's community, a fellowship of little people who together make God visible in the world."

I believe in "The Big Tent"... Nouwen's mosaic... as God brings us together with all our differences to form community that is reflective of our unity. In the Gospel according to John, Jesus says, "I came that they all may be one." This is our task. We are here to welcome and build community past our differences into our unity. This is no easy task, but this God calls us to.



Should I Receive the COVID-19 vaccine?

It is very important for people to receive the vaccine. To achieve "herd immunity," which is needed for our lives to really return to normal—experts estimate that 80-85% of Americans may need to be vaccinated against COVID-19. So getting vaccinated helps to protect not just you and your family but also your whole community.

All the COVID-19 vaccines currently available in the US meet the strict safety standards established by the Federal Drug Administration (FDA) and have been found to be highly effective at keeping you from getting COVID-19. (And even if you do contract the virus after

being vaccinated, you're far less likely to get seriously ill.)

Once you get vaccinated, experts advise that you continue to take precautions such as social distancing and wearing a mask when out in public, which are important for reducing the spread of all variants of the Coronavirus, says James Dickerson, PhD, Consumer Reports chief scientific officer. Even though vaccinated people are less likely to contract the virus, it's possible that they could still spread it to others. It is really important to get vaccinated for COVID-19! (*May 2021-Consumer Reports*).


Prayer Requests
