## Pastor's Page "The Obstacle in Our Path"

The

A fable for you: In ancient times, a King had a boulder placed on

a roadway. He then hid himself and watched to see if anyone would move the boulder out of the way. Some of the king's wealthiest merchants and courtiers came by and simply walked around it. Many people loudly blamed the King for not keeping the roads clear, but none of them did anything about getting the stone out of the way. A peasant then came along carrying a load of

vegetables. Upon approaching the boulder, the peasant laid down his burden and tried to push the stone out of the road. After much pushing and straining, he finally succeeded. After the peasant went back to pick up his vegetables, he noticed a purse lying in the road where the boulder had been. The purse contained



many gold coins and a note from the King explaining that the gold was for the person who removed the boulder from the roadway. *Moral of the story:* Every obstacle we come across in life gives us an opportunity to improve our circumstances, and whilst the lazy complain, the others are creating opportunities through their kind hearts, generosity, and willingness to get things done.

There are always obstacles in our path. Not just for me. Not just for you. For all of us there are obstacles. There are ALWAYS huge obstacles for us as a church. This summer we are seeing our roofing project proceed. We are seeing the UMCOC fire suppression project start. We are seeing new challenges in children, youth, and family ministries as we get ready for the fall. We are welcoming new members into the congregation and are actively working to introduce ways for them to engage in the life of the church and grow as disciples of Christ. Sometimes we get discouraged at the obstacles, but it is crucial to remember that it is exactly the obstacles that form us and become our biggest and best opportunities.

This week I was reading an article about Jean Vanier, who in 1964 founded a new way of living for those with developmental disabilities. Father Vanier lived in France and was appalled at the conditions he saw in the state-run mental facilities. The treatment that people received and the respect that they were given was abysmal. With huge obstacles in his road, Vanier went out, bought a house, and invited two men with developmental disabilities to come live with him. He called this house "L'Arche" ("The Ark"), and it became a powerful model for what healthy life based on mutual respect could look like. Today there are over 150 L'Arche communities in 37 countries around the world. The obstacles and challenges still exist, but a pattern and a work-ethic to overcome them has now been established. I love the pattern that has been set.

Jean Vanier gave the world a gift: He imagined communities where people can live in a spirit of mutual learning, dignity, and care. We can see the need for that same gift right here in our Northern Hills. Although Vanier specifically developed this for communities of developmentally disabled friends, we can use the same vision. In the article I was reading ("Designed to Care" by Stephanie Sandberg in the November 2018 Sojourners magazine on page 39), he was asked about the power of forgiveness and living together through conflict and troubles. He answered, "(There is a) very deep vision because it reflects what humanity was like a few thousand years ago. 'My tribe, my way.' The question is how can you break down the walls of tribe that then become the walls of war? We need to break these down and become plains of peace, pleasures where we can meet."

And in this lies the challenge of the church. In the face of obstacle and division, we are called by God to be uniters working for the good of all, transforming the world around us. May it be that you work with Christ to be a uniter this week past the obstacle in the path!

#### **Servant Ministry**

When discussing ministry, one idea that seems to always be present is the significance of servant ministry. This has always been a really hard concept for me to grasp because the word "servant" has negative connotations. I generally think of someone who is almost to the point of enslavement and has no say in what they are doing. Ever since entering into a formal, full-time, ministry position (even if it's just for 10 weeks), my perspective on this particular topic has begun to change. I have been given the opportunity to speak at services, preach, lead studies, and even do pastoral visits on my own. Having experienced these things, I have slowly, but surely, begun perceiving them as acts of service. I am not forced to get up in front of the congregation and preach, I'm choosing to. In this regard, I am making the conscious decision to enter into a position of servanthood. This is what the idea of servant ministry entails.

At the annual conference this year, one thing that was emphasized was the meaning of being sent. Throughout the different meetings and services, the phrase: "Here I am Lord, Send Me" was continually brought forth. The idea behind this, is that you are giving yourself 100% to God, and asking for him to send you where you are needed.

Now I'm not suggesting that everyone should just drop everything and head straight to seminary; but rather reiterating the fact that everyone can serve in some way. Servant ministry doesn't imply that you have to enter into a full-time ministry position. It means that in some way, shape, or form, God uses everyone for good. Serving snacks after worship, participating in studies, donating your time or monetary assets, serving in committees, or even just participation in worship are all ways in which to serve.

I encourage you to think about all the different ways that God is leading you into servanthood. From Matthew 20:28: "Just as the son of man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."Amen.

#### **Summer Music**





be averted if the COVID-19 vaccine was taken. Studies are showing that the people who are being hospitalized and dying are people who have NOT received the COVID-19 vaccine.



the premise behind the Spearfish Clothe-A-Kid project that was started nearly 20 years ago at Spearfish UMC with the goal that all students started school with a positive self-image.

Clothe-A-Kid is a city-wide initiative, supported by churches, businesses and individuals to provide new clothes, school supplies, backpacks and Spartan hoodies to 150 less fortunate Spearfish students. Annually, over \$25,000 must be raised to cover the expense of these items through donations, grants and fundraising. Each student will pick up their supplies and hoodie at UMC, then are given a designated time to shop for their new clothes. The pride in their new things is obvious, and each student can feel they "fit in" on the first day of school.
