"Faith without action is dead." -James 2: 26

As followers of Christ, we have a part to play in this world. St. Teresa of Avalon centuries ago said, "Christ has no body now on earth but yours, no hands but yours, no feet but yours, Yours are the eyes through which Christ's compassion to the world looks out; Yours are the feet with which he is to go about doing good; Yours are the hands with which he is to bless [people] now."

Council Highlights January 19, 2022

Stewardship & Finance: Clyde Smith agreed to serve and was unanimously elected. Peggy Bosch, outgoing treasurer, introduced Kathy Helmer as the new treasurer.

Staff Parish reported that all employees both of the church and Children First were very grateful for the large Christmas bonuses.

Trustees projects in the works are a large TV screen for the Fellowship Hall and carpeting two rooms upstairs in the UMCOC building. Redoing the wheelchair ramp on the west side of the church building, upgrading the coffee area in the Fellowship Hall, and painting the sanctuary are future projects. Ron Borgman has agreed to serve as UMCOC Manager of Tenants. Barry Penn manages the physical part of the building.

Children First has several cases of COVID and influenza, however they are continuing to operate except for the three-year-olds room.

December 2021 Treasurer's Report:

Balance Sheet – No major changes.

General Fund – For the month of December income for the General Fund is \$47,464.14 and expenses are \$42,495.71. There were three payrolls in December. The ending balance for the month of December is \$4,968.43 in the black with apportionments paid. The year-to-date balance is \$6,252.12 in the black with the government grant received earlier this year included. All apportionments for the year 2021 were paid.

UMCOC Fund – For December the income for UMCOC is \$1,780.00 and expenses are \$5,665.58. This leaves the UMCOC Fund in the red \$3,885.58 for the month and with a year-to-date balance of \$1,955.64 in the black, the government grant included. There are three rooms upstairs that are still unoccupied, but the Fire Suppression System is complete and new carpet is being installed in two of the rooms so the rooms can then be rented.

Children First – Income for December for Children First is \$45,543.47 including some COVID grant money and expenses are \$54,294.99 leaving the CF Fund in the red \$8,751.52 for the fourth month of their fiscal year. CF also had three payrolls in December. The

year-to-date balance is \$1,573.89 in the black.

Debt Retirement/Capital Fund – The Debt Retirement/Capital Fund income for December is \$3,579.37 and expenses are \$536.58 for touch-ups on the UMCOC north door and on the Fire Suppression project. Balance at the end of December is \$63,641.45. A payment on the loan will be made in January.

Mission-Giving – Mission-giving for December is \$10,067.25 with most of the money coming from the Christmas Eve services for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. Mission expenses (distributions) are \$3,463.50 including \$2,175.00 for Pastor's Discretionary. The mission of the month is Northern Hills Sources of Support for which \$605.00 was collected and sent to NHSOS.

Children First: Children First has had continued health challenges with Omicron variant of COVID and influenza A. This is affecting kids, families and staff. Please pray for health and hope for the future.

United Methodist Women: We meet September through May. There are other special meetings like Mission u and also a local Retreat in July. This year we have 3 woman attending Assembly 2022 in May in Orlando Florida. Colleen McKirdy, Emma McKirdy-Wilsey and Debra Richardson. Colleen and Emma are going in person, and Debra is attending virtually. Spearfish UMW is trying to figure out a way to help the 2 ladies with the cost of the flight and motel room. Their fee to attend is covered by our UMW Dakota Conference.

United Methodist Men: UMM continue to meet @ 8:00 am for a breakfast meeting and devotions on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month. I urge all men of our church to attend and contribute at these breakfast fellowship meetings. Bill Lundgren is our Secretary/Treasurer and we are still seeking a Vice-President.

Health Ministry: The Caring Meal Ministry had a busy month in Dec. (20 meals were delivered to homes). We appreciate the volunteers who have helped. Each committee member continues to send a monthly greeting/card to 2-3 people who are limited in getting out.

Pastor's Report for January:

Pastor's Discretionary Fund (PDF) 2021 wrap up. Serving a total of 468 individuals, the breakdown is as follows:

On Safeway Cards: Food – \$6,775.00; Gas – \$12,275.00; Medications – \$1,050.00. Total Safeway Cards: \$20,100.00

Other Resources: Motels / Lodging - \$1,619.84; Cleaning Supplies - \$75.00; Phone Card - \$50.00;

Car Parts -\$27.17. Total Other -\$1,772.01

PDF 2021 Total: \$21, 872,01

Attendance: Surprisingly, we are almost back to our pre-pandemic numbers for attendance. The three live worship services are lower in number, but this is made up for in the online worship figures. We will typically have 50 - 80 in attendance online. Christmas Eve was amazing with 307 in-person and 139 online for a total of 446.

Leadership Discernment Workshop: Spearfish is hosting, and I am co-teaching two annual conference sessions of a workshop aimed at discerning roles in leadership. With fifteen participating, this class is specifically aimed at identifying and training local church leadership. It is giving me deeper ideas of our own local leadership training.


