"Practicing the Basics"

I gained my height early in life, standing my full adult height when I was 15 years old. Living

in a smaller town where every person mattered, it was no surprise that I played a lot of basketball. However, it should also be no surprise that I wasn't very good at it. I loved playing, and I looked really good in the team picture. However, I didn't have the strength, coordination, or technique to really play a lot. I had a couple of really great coaches. Their advice to me was consistently simple: "Scott, practice the basics." I improved a lot over the years, but never had any fancy moves. I worked on running, rebounding, and shooting short shots. Eventually, focusing on basic techniques paid off in my adult years as I continued to play in the communities where I lived. My secret was no secret at all: Practice the basics.

Do not worship any other gods Do not make any idols Do not misuse God's name Keep the sabbath holy

Honour your father & mother Do not murder Do not commit adultery Do not steal Do not lie Do not covet

So, it's going to be a really challenging two months in January and February as now I get to coach you in your faith to practice those basics. In worship, study, and personal devotions, we are going to be focusing on the Ten Commandments. (You can't get much more basic than that!). Although I have preached on the commandments here and there throughout my ministry, I have never focused on a series that covers all of them together.

I'm going to have a lot of fun with this worship

series. It's really easy to roll your eyes at the thought of all those "Thou shalt nots". But these basic Commandments are so much more than all the things we're NOT supposed to do. The Commandments in many ways are in reality a collection of "Here! Try it this way!" When we practice the Christian basics, like the Ten Commandments, what we find is that not just our faith is strengthened, but also our relationships and our communities. So! Here we go into practicing our basics!

By the way, you may have friends, family, and neighbors who are really interested in this. The series starts on January 8-9. Invite them to come worship with you whether that is in-person or online.


Cancer & Care Giving Books Available

Stewardship Drive Update

During the Stewardship & Finance Committee held on December 8, we approved a proposed budget based on the information available at that time. Here is what was shared:

- Total General Fund income: \$467,828
- Total General Fund expenses: \$498,879
- **General Fund Budget Deficit:** \$31,051 This deficit would be \$61,051 without a \$30,000 transfer from reserve funds. Our goal is to minimize the amount that will need to be taken from reserve funds.

These numbers remain about the same as last month's report. Although we have received more pledges which increased the General Fund **Pledged** line item, adjustments were made to decrease the General Fund **Unpledged** line item, thus keeping Total General Fund Income at \$467,828.

We continue to receive pledges, which are appreciated. The more information we have about income, the better we can plan our expenses. Here are the ways in which you can help your church financially:

MISSIONS

Mission of the Month Send Hope



Send Hope has been the "base" for our church's medical mission teams to Honduras for many years. The team can't travel to Honduras again this year because of COVID but Send Hope still needs our help.

Send Hope is located in Puerto Lempira, Honduras, one of the most remote areas of a very poor country. Send Hope is a Methodist nonprofit mission supported entirely by donations. Send Hope is the home of 35-45 children who may have lost their family or may have medical issues needing care. Children receive housing, health care, education, and love.

Send Hope also runs a huge feeding program. Malnourished children and their families can receive food supplements and health care so the children can grow and regain health. Currently the feeding program is supplementing several hundred families as well as providing 2 meals a day to two large mission schools. Send Hope funding has been greatly impacted by COVID, but the needs don't change. Please join our team and help provide care for so many children in Honduras.
