Pastor's Page

"Living as an Itinerant Pastor"

"The Lord had said to Abram, 'Leave your country, your people and your father's household and

go to the land I will show you." – Genesis 12: 1

Just this week the announcement has been made that I have been asked to accept an appointment at Rapid City Canyon Lake United Methodist Church. After thought, prayer, and deep conversation, Colleen and I have chosen to accept this appointment. Let me tell you more about the process we use in the United Methodist Church to supply pastors in our congregations.

I am an "itinerant pastor". What this means is that when I was ordained, I took a vow to move to the churches that were to be assigned to me. I iterate from church to church, but never have a membership in any of them. I am a member of the Dakotas Annual Conference, and I therefore I serve the Conference as per their assignment and instruction where and when I am asked. The closest comparison I can give is to the military. When you are a member of the armed forces, in much the same way, you expect to be moved going where and when they tell you. I grew up as a UM pastor's kid, so this is a system that I have lived with my entire life. That fact, however, does not make moves any easier!

A few people have asked if I requested this move. I did not. The Conference initiated the change, inviting me to bring some very specific skills and personality traits to serve at Canyon Lake Church. This is one of the powerful parts of living on the itinerancy. Every UM conference has the ability to identify congregational needs, identify pastoral abilities, and then move needed leadership very quickly and efficiently. This system has allowed us to meet deep and urgent needs in congregations and communities for almost 300 years now. It all originated with John Wesley himself as he assigned the original Methodist circuit riders to their preaching stations in 18th-century England.

UM pastors hear and take very seriously those

words to Abram in Genesis: "Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you."

Upon my acceptance of appointment, the Dakotas Conference immediately began the process for identifying my replacement. Our District Superintendent, Rev. Bob Ruedebusch, will be working hand-in-hand with our Spearfish UMC Staff-Parish Relations Committee, chaired by Paul Pierson, to bring the new pastor on board. My last weekend in the pulpit will be in late June. The new pastor will most likely arrive in early July.

As a strong, healthy, and vibrant congregation, Spearfish UMC has the past history and current ability to thrive through changes and transitions. We are prepared for this, and our ministries will continue smoothly. We will try to keep you updated on new happenings in the weeks to come. May God add the blessing as together we move in transition.

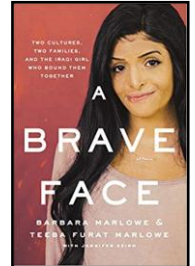

We will be having a Service Weekend over Memorial Day Weekend. On Saturday, May 28 in the afternoon at 3:30 p.m., we will have a seminar coming

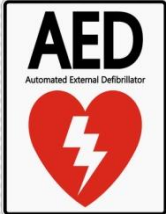
from our new Creation Care Ministry, to explore how our church is planning to move toward a more sustainable existence.

Council Highlights

April 20, 2022

Treasurer's Report

- Kathy Helmer has resigned as treasurer, so Peggy Bosch has agreed to serve until another person is found for the job.
- **Balance Sheet** - The following was pointed out on the Balance Sheet:
 - The current loan balance is \$130,785.69. This loan is paid off at \$7,000/quarter from the Debt Retirement/Capital Fund which is a pledging fund and is therefore replenished every year. The loan is at 2% so there is no reason to pay it off quickly. The balance of the DR/C Fund is \$65,067.85 so there is money to do capital projects as well as make the loan payments.
- **General Fund** – For the month of March income for the General Fund is \$37,383.02 and expenses are \$38,914.81. The ending balance for the month of March is \$1,531.79 in the red with apportionments paid. The year-to-date balance is \$19,183.87.
- **UMCOC Fund** – For March the income for UMCOC is \$4,340.00 and expenses are \$3,541.84. The ending balance for the month of March is \$798.16 in the black. The year-to-date balance is \$2,306.23.
- **Children First** – Income for March for Children First is \$44,268.53 including some grant money, and expenses are \$37,024.47 leaving the CF Fund in the black \$7,244.06 for the seventh month of their fiscal year. The year-to-date balance is \$18,564.56.
- **Debt Retirement/Capital Fund** – The Debt Retirement/Capital Fund income for March is \$2,869.13 and expenses are \$0.00. Balance at the end of March is \$65,067.85.
- **Mission-Giving** – Mission-giving for March is \$5,505.00. Mission expenses (distributions) are \$5,593.86 including \$2,027.21 for Pastor's Discretionary, \$1,140.00 for Ukraine Relief, and \$2,044.00 for Honduras Disaster Relief. The Mission of the Month is the Benevolence Fund to which \$1,426.00 was contributed.

Stewardship & Finance Report

- Staff Parish reported that Katelyn Smith had been hired as Director of Children's Ministry – a 15-hour a week position – and is doing a great job.
- Trustees reported that Farmer Brothers will no longer serve the church's coffee needs because we don't require enough coffee. Coca Cola will provide service

as soon as what is left of the Farmer Brothers coffee runs out.

- The current capital project is redoing the ramp at the west door of the church, but the flat roof on the church that was damaged during the 2019 hailstorm still needs to be replaced so the ramp won't be delt with until the roof is done as work on the roof could possibly damage the ramp.
- UMCOC has had the carpet replaced in two rooms upstairs, but the installation is unsatisfactory. The carpeting will probably be accepted as is with a large discount from the installer.
- Children First has received an ARPA grant of about \$120,000 from the State. They will use part of it to give the parents a month of free tuition. They are about full and are fully staffed.
- The Children First Workday on April 2nd was a great success with about 100 people participating. Parker Louks' brought his baseball team to help.
- NHSOS contacted Peggy Bosch to report that their treasurer had moved away, and they do not have a treasurer right now. They will continue to send minutes of their meeting but were concerned about the quarterly financial reports they are supposed to send. Peggy told them that all S & F really needs is a summary showing income and where it came from, expenses and what the expenses were for, and the balances they always give in their Treasurer's Report in their minutes. She offered to help them set up a simple spreadsheet but has not heard back.
- Pastor Scott reported that church attendance is up above what it was before the COVID pandemic hit.
- S & F voted to give the Bruce M Johnson Endowment distribution of \$2,106.32 to Clothe-A-Kid.
- The new church directory is going to cost about \$2,600. S & F agreed to take the money from the General Fund Prior Year Reserve, however a basket for donations will be on the table when the directories are made available to the congregation.
- A large bequest from Luena Lent will be received by the church. Everything is not settled yet, but the amount will likely be more than \$200,000.
- Terry Prante agreed to be S & F representative to Council since Peggy Bosch cannot attend Council meetings.

Worship & Music

- April 30- May 1: Communion Weekend
- May 7-8: Dan Damon will be performing with a band he is bringing in.
- May 15: We will have Confirmation this weekend along with a time to honor our graduates and also honor the 50+ member group.
- May 21-22: Colleen and Emma will be gone. Scott may be gone, so we may get Jennifer Seder to give one last message before she moves away
- May 28-29 is a fifth Sunday. We will be doing a Service Weekend. We will have one main worship service on Saturday night. On Sunday we will put

together a breakfast with a short worship service and then we will split into teams to do service projects for our church and community.

- We will be meeting again next Wednesday April 27.

Children, Youth and Family Ministries Report

- We are so excited to have Katelyn as our new Children's Ministry Coordinator!
- Children's church continues to flow beautifully!
- A spring family block party is being held at the church on Friday, April 29th and volunteers are needed to help. Just give Katelyn or the church office a call.
- Children's Church will continue through the month of May.
- VBS is being held in August again this year.

Staff Parish Report

- We reviewed the role of our committee as outlined in The Book of Discipline.
- We assigned committee members to staff members as liaisons for staff.
- We discussed staff related issues/achievements.

Children First

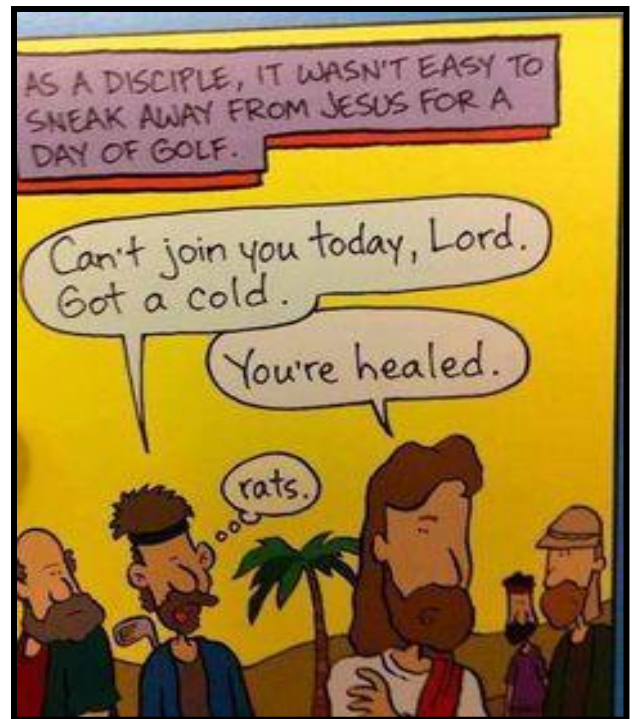
- Workday was held Saturday, April 2 with an estimated 100 volunteers including children and the Legion 164 baseball team.

- Will be purchasing two more microphones as we had a couple break.
- The Online Worship and Online Campus continue to be strong parts of our ministry with Worship staying rather steady and the Campus gaining a little more activity.

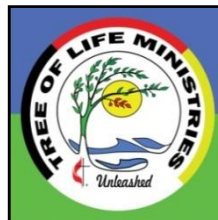

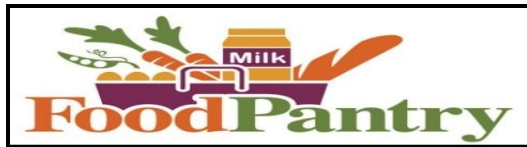
Tree of Life Ministry
