Pastor's Page "Time to Celebrate!"

In the last nine years Spearfish United Methodist has hosted seven interns. Six of them were Dakotas Conference Elisha

Interns and one was a seminary intern. An Elisha Intern is a college student who is exploring a call to ministry and needs to see what it means to serve in a real, live, local church over the space of ten weeks (three months) during the summer. A seminary intern is a student earning a master of divinity degree who needs practical application of their skills in preparation for the next steps toward ministry over the space of a nine month school year. We have been an intern-home for Emma, Cody, Sasha, Emily, Davis, Alex, and Hannah.



SUMC has also had a wonderful hand in raising its own members into forms of ministry. We are the church-home for Carrie who served as an Elisha Intern in another congregation and now actively works with our nursery. We are the

church-home for Jordan who is now serving as a United Methodist pastor in Sioux Falls.

The commonality every single one of them holds is that they are taking their next steps toward the ministries that God is calling them to, be it inside a United Methodist Church or outside the church in the communities in which they live. And this church has had a loving hand in these lives.

And now it is time to celebrate!

What happens after an internship exploring ministry? If you wish to take the next step toward being ordained, this means going to seminary. This fall THREE of our interns will go to seminary! Hannah Andres will return online for her fourth and final year through Claremont School of Theology. The school is in

California, but she will be finishing her degree work here in Spearfish. Both Davis Anderson and Alex Hunnes will be starting their first year in seminary at Perkins School of Theology in Dallas, Texas. It is a long, hard, and joyful journey that they begin.

What happens after you finish seminary? You enter into local church ministry and begin the process of ordination. On Friday, June 11, Jordan Louks will be ordained into the Dakotas Annual Conference being held up in Bismarck. He is currently serving at First UMC in Sioux Falls. The next week Emily Rettinghouse will be ordained into the Mountain Sky Conference (Montana, Wyoming, Colorado, Utah). She is currently serving at Cody UMC in Cody, WY.

It's time to celebrate! THREE in seminary, and TWO in ordination! We will be setting out cards for you to sign for all of them. We will be sharing the online links to watch both of the ordination services. Dear SUMC, it is time to celebrate!

Changing Times in the UMC

From Pastor Scott: We are now beginning to share more details about the future of our United Methodist Church as a denomination. For years there has been tension building inside our global church over stands on sexuality. This has finally created a moment in time when our larger denomination is breaking into different groups. On the conservative side, the Global United Church (GMC) has now been formed as a break-away denomination. On May 1, the GMC launched the new

denomination. On the liberal side, a smaller denomination formed just over a year ago to form the Liberation Methodist Movement (LMM).



Here are some of the things that we know and can share:

- 1) The United Methodist Church will definitely face a splitting.
- 2) The divide originates around LGBTQ issues, but moves to other pragmatic and theological issues

- as well. (The election and functioning of bishops, for instance.)
- 3) Processes are in progress to enable an orderly and amicable plan to enable this divide.
- 4) This does affect churches around the world, since the United Methodist Church is a global denomination.
- 5) We do have a process currently for churches to disaffiliate from the greater UMC as a denomination but it can quickly become difficult and expensive for local congregations.
- 6) The next scheduled General Conference will be in 2024. At this global meeting, deeper details will be worked out. This conference was originally scheduled to be held in 2020, but the pandemic forced its postponement not once but twice. The issue of postponement deals with the reality that COVID moves at different speeds in different parts of the world AND that obtaining passports and visas is a slow and difficult process for this meeting.
- 7) At our 2024 General Conference, one of the framework documents that will be proposed is a plan known as the "Protocol of Reconciliation and Grace through Separation". (You can actually Google this.)
- 8) The GMC leadership decided that they would prefer not to wait another two years, so initiated the new launch this year.
- 9) Only churches that specifically decide and vote to become GMC (or LMM) will leave the greater denomination.
- 10) In a very recent legal ruling, it was announced that annual conferences as a whole may not disaffiliate from the denomination. The congregations that leave will need to form their own new conferences.

There will be more information coming in the months and years ahead. For right now, Spearfish UMC simply continues life as we always have, focusing on the needs of our local communities and making the grace of Jesus Christ a reality in our church. If you have questions, please don't hesitate to get hold of me!



Council Highlights May 18, 2022

Pastor's Report (Pastor Scott)

- Our new pastor is Rev. John Madvig, who has now been introduced to our Staff-Parish Relations Committee.
- The annual conference is coming up in June.

<u>Treasurer Report</u>- April 2022(Peggy Bosch)

- **Balance Sheet** The current loan balance is \$124,439.62. A payment was made April 5th to our lender.
- **General Fund** For the month of April income for the General Fund is \$34,639.13 and expenses are \$34,726.69. The ending balance for the month of April is \$87.56 in the red with apportionments paid. The year-to-date balance is \$19,096.31.
- **UMCOC Fund** For April, the income for UMCOC is \$4,335.00 and expenses are \$2,922.02. The ending

- balance for the month of April is \$1,412.98 in the black. The year-to-date balance is \$3,719.21. Two of three previously empty rooms are now rented.
- Children First Income for April for Children First is \$50,934.38 including grant money to help with salaries and grant money to offset the tuition break for parents, and expenses are \$44,813.03 leaving the CF Fund in the black \$6,121.35 for the eighth month of their fiscal year. The year-to-date balance is \$24,685.91.
- **Debt Retirement/Capital Fund** The Debt Retirement/Capital Fund income for April is \$2,806.66 and expenses are \$7,000.00. Balance at the end of April is \$60,874.51.

Stewardship & Finance Report - May 1, 2022 (Peggy Bosch)

- Trustees reported that the following projects need to be done sometime:
 - 1. The ramp on the west side of the church needs to be replaced with a cement ramp.
 - 2. Some cement work also needs to be done on the east side of the church.
 - 3. The sanctuary needs to be painted.
 - 4. The parking lot needs resurfacing.


