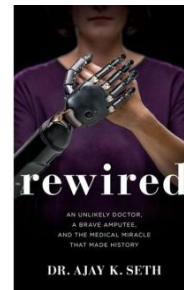

A raccoon bite on the arm doesn't seem that

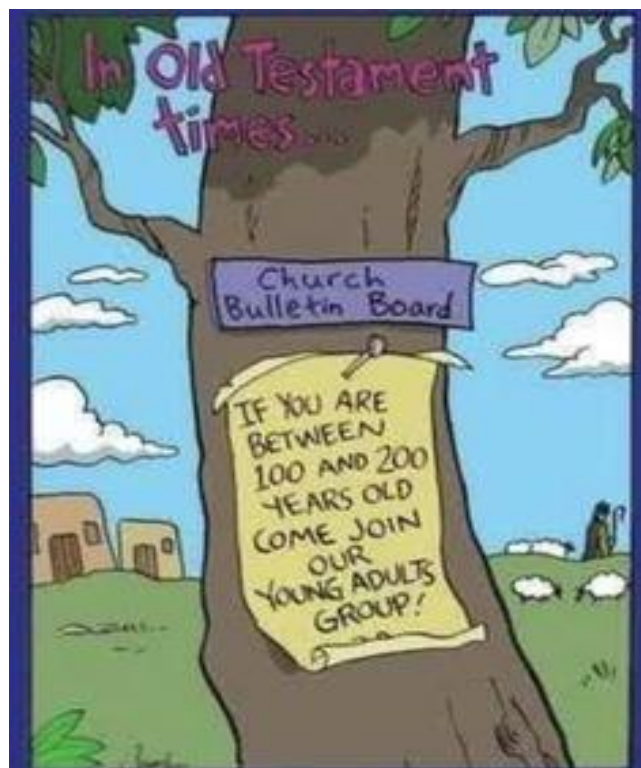
serious, but it soon becomes a life-or-death medical crisis for Melissa Loomis. After days of treatment for recurring infection, it becomes obvious that her arm must be amputated. Dr. Ajay Seth, the son of immigrant parents from India and a local orthopedic surgeon in private practice, performs his first-ever amputation procedure. In the months that follow, divine intervention, combined with Melissa's determination and Dr. Seth's disciplined commitment and dedication to his patients, brings about the opportunity for a medical breakthrough that will potentially transform the lives of amputees around the world.

Council Highlights

July 20, 2022

Members Present

Janelle Jones, Brenda Swanson, John Swanson, Linda Hoxie, Beth Bentley, Colleen McKirdy, Peggy Bosch, Kelvin Lower, Debra Richardson, Pastor John Madvig and Terry Prante.

Our new council chair is Kelvin Lower. He will be the chairperson until the end of 2023.

Treasurer Report – June, 2022 (Peggy Bosch)

- **General Fund** – For the month of June income for the General Fund is \$33,252.09 and expenses are \$33,748.58. Income was down a little but so were expenses. The ending balance for the month of June is \$496.49 in the red with all apportionments paid for the year. The year-to-date balance is \$12,229.88.
- **UMCOC Fund** – For June the income for is \$4,750.00 and expenses are \$5,312.91. The high expense was due to some work on the boiler. The ending balance for June is \$562.91 in the red. The year-to-date balance is \$1,570.09 in the black.
- **Children First** – Income for June is \$120,764.25 including grant money to help with salaries and to cover expenses for April and May (as per ARPA Grant requirements). Expenses are \$89,260.75 including \$50,000.00 that was withdrawn to invest in the CF Dakotas Foundation Account. The CF Fund ended in the black \$30,503.50 for the tenth month of their fiscal year. The balance is \$59,400.38.
- **Debt Retirement/Capital Fund** – The income for June is \$3,025.25 and expenses are \$0.00. Balance at the end of June is \$67,202.82.
- **Mission-Giving** – Mission-giving for June is \$6,121. Mission expenses are \$7,136.71 including \$1,600 for Pastor's Discretionary, \$1,900 for Ukraine Relief and \$1,872 for the Food Pantry.

Stewardship & Finance Report - July 13, 2022 (Peggy Bosch)

- Staff Parish met with Pastor John and discussed the process for bringing in a new pastor.
- Trustees looked at the CF playground and discussed the shade shelter plan that Melissa Raad presented to them that evening at their meeting. They also reviewed a bid received for painting the sanctuary and Fellowship Hall. Evie Madvig had sent an email regarding needs at the parsonage. Trustees will take care of those needs. The biggest item is repairing the deck. Also discussed was the fact that some trees need to be removed around the church building. Tom Brady, a lawyer, has been contacted to review our insurance policies and liabilities, and Trustees will meet soon with Steve Byrd, our insurance broker.
- Children First is getting estimates on the shade shelter and reported that there are some safety issues with the asphalt and the fence. They received another ARPA grant of around \$86,000.

- NHSOS has submitted another financial report and June meeting minutes.
- The Luena Lent Bequest was discussed briefly. One of the Committee members put forth in writing a suggestion for spending the first \$100,000, and others were urged to do the same. Now that we know some of Trustees' plans it is hoped that a decision can be made in the fall as to how to best use the first installment of the money.
 - The process for receiving the rest of the money was explained.
- We will be meeting with Steve Bird for our annual insurance review as soon as it comes in.
- The church has received a rebate from the Conference of \$16,820.01.

Worship & Music (Kevin Nakajima)

- WAMC met on July 6 so that we could help Pastor John get started as smoothly as possible. We will be following the lectionary for the summer.
- Our next meeting will be August 24th at 6pm.

Technology (Kevin Nakajima)

- Online attendance is still steady.

Staff Parish Report (Paul Pierson)

- We had first regular scheduled committee meeting with Pastor John on July 12.
- We focused on laying the foundation for the relationship of SPRC and Pastor John and other staff members.
- We focused on identifying what is most important in this initial period of transition for Pastor John:
 - Staff
 - Congregation (A team is being formed to work on this topic)
 - To start his ministry here, Pastor John would like to do a Bible study with his staff using the book, "Thin Book of Trust".

Children First(Janelle Jones)

- Children First had a holiday July 1, 4, 5. They are having a fun busy summer.
- CF staff continue to monitor entrance to the building by persons seeking assistance, but confused by the term OUTREACH in the name, United Methodist Community Outreach Center.
- CF staff and board will gather Wednesday, July 27, 6 pm at the home of Janelle Jones, 835 W Hill St, #205 to meet Madvig's.

Health Ministry (Linda Hoxie)

- Health Ministry Committee-Health Forum— 'Prepare to Care' will be September 11 at 3 pm in the church library. Most of us are caregivers at some time in our lives. This forum will give information on how we can be effective caregivers now and how we can prepare for this role.
- On October 8 & 9, a diabetic & blood pressure screening will be held after all 3 church services.

Children Youth & Family Ministry (Brenda Swanson)

- Children's church continues this summer once a month. The next class is August 14th.

- VBS is coming soon – August 1—5 from 9 to 11:30 am. Volunteers are still needed, but we have a great team coming together already!
- Summer block party was held July 17th.
 - Lots of great help!
 - Around a dozen children attended and had a good time!
- Youth continue to meet this summer through the middle of August with a break the last two weeks of August.
- Fall kick-off is September 7th.

Congregational Values Discernment Workshop

- Janelle mentioned an opportunity for our church to participate in a workshop focusing on defining 3-5 core values of our church. (these priorities would be selected by those participating in the workshop)
- Janelle explained the procedure to bring the workshop to Spearfish.
- A decision will be made at the August meeting.

Membership Status

- Pastor Scott was informed at annual conference that the church must keep their membership list updated.
- We must engage in the process of a 1st and 2nd reading for membership.
- The 1st reading was done at the June 15 council meeting. The 2nd reading will be at the next charge conference.
 - Members who have not participated in any of the worship services, or in a financial way have been contacted to see if they would like to 1) remain on the roles, 2) transfer membership or 3) withdraw membership.
 - If they have not responded to the letter for both the 1st reading and the 2nd reading, they are automatically withdrawn at the time of the 2nd reading.

Trustees (John Swanson)

- Children First met with the Trustees about building a shade shelter area with sod and a concrete pad. Since the original motion was made and passed, some issues have come up. John Swanson reported that we needed a little more information on what the shelter would look like and who would be building it.
- After some discussion John moved: To approve the building of a shade shelter with a concrete pad on the Children First playground per Trustee's approval of final plan and design. Janelle seconded it and it was unanimously approved.
- Several of the ash trees around the church need to be removed - bids are coming in.
- Three contractors have been contacted about painting the sanctuary and fellowship hall.
- Thomas Brady is reviewing our insurance policies and other areas of the church to see if we are legally protected as we need be.
- Some minor work at the parsonage was approved with bids for the deck being looked at.

Pastor John's Happenings

- One of Pastor John's first priorities is getting to know the congregation. Pastor John explained his idea of a way to communicate and get to know more church members in an efficient way and that is to meet with 10-12 people in a home for small gatherings.
 - A team has been formed from all three services. This team will find people to host small gatherings in homes. Once the host has been found, then the committee will find church members to attend the host's meeting.
 - These meetings are a way for Pastor John to see and listen to more people, identify the needs of the congregation and to be able to focus on a few priorities to accomplish while he ministers here in Spearfish.

Solar Oven Partners

Mission of the Month

Did you know???

- Solar Oven Partners distributes ovens in severe poverty areas in the Dominican Republic and Sierra Leone, working with local partners.
- Solar ovens promote health—solar cooks avoid the eye and lung damage cooking over charcoal or wood often causes.

- Solar ovens save money—cooking with charcoal, gas or wood may cost a large portion of a family’s income. Solar cooking frees money for better food, school, medical care, etc.
- Solar ovens protect the environment by preventing the destruction of forests in order to obtain wood or create charcoal for cooking.

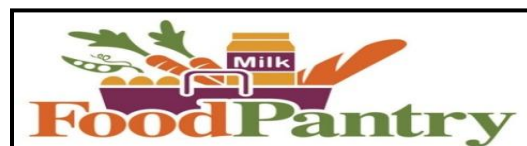


Solar oven recipients are required to attend 2 days of class to practice cooking this new way and learn care of the ovens. They also pay a small portion of the cost of their oven so the ovens are valued and used properly.

One of the 3 workshops where volunteers make solar oven parts is now located in Open Heart UMC in Rapid City. Small groups from our church have been working in the Rapid City workshop making reflector parts, and we will continue to organize more groups in the future.

Solar oven distribution, halted by the COVID pandemic, has resumed in the Dominican Republic and the demand for ovens continues to increase. Please become involved with your donations in August and with your volunteer time in the new reflector workshop in Rapid City.
