Pastor's Page

"A New Season"

A few years ago, I talked with my dad about our favorite seasons. Dad said he liked all the seasons for various reasons, but if he had to choose a favorite, it would be Fall. In addition to the pleasant weather and

the beauty of the trees, the heat and the bugs of summer are—for the most part—gone. I like Fall too, but I would

add football to my list of reasons. I've been a lifelong fan of the Minnesota Vikings, but what I have really enjoyed is being involved with local football teams. Beginning as a



youth pastor in California and then continuing later in Michigan, I was invited to serve as an unofficial chaplain for the local high school teams. At first this was limited to leading the team in a pre-game recitation of the Lord's Prayer (after which some players occasionally added blasphemous references to the opposing team). One coach had me share inspirational stories from the Bible, like David & Goliath, or the "team" concepts that can be found in 1 Corinthians 12. Later, I served as a sort of "life coach" (Evie's term) and was given the opportunity each week with the boys to unfold a vision for what it means to become a man. Before moving to Spearfish from Omaha, I even helped coach the defensive line at the freshman level. Most recently, I have become involved with the Yellowjackets football program at Black Hills State.

I also enjoy being on the sidelines during games, encouraging the boys and reminding them to be gentlemen on and off the field. Some of them have been great examples for the team and others! After one game, a couple of supporters from an opposing team wrote a letter to the local paper about *our* exemplary sportsmanship on *their* field. In another game, our boys huddled for prayer when an opposing player was injured on a play and being attended to on the field. This was amazing to observe. After a moment, the buzzing crowd

became silent. Then, one of the coaches on the other side of the field saw our boys and encouraged his team to take a knee as well. The boys had learned that their opponent was not their enemy.

A Season of Life, by Jeffrey Marx, is one of the best books I've read about the potential for coaches to make a significant impact in the lives of young men. Marx had been a ball-boy for the Baltimore Colts prior to his career as a writer, and the book began as a journey to find some of the players he grew to know. It focuses on the post-football life of former Colt, Joe Ehrmann, an assistant coach at Gilman High School – and an ordained minister. Along with head coach "Biff" Poggi and all the coaches at Gilman, Ehrmann's coaching philosophy is all about loving the boys on the team and teaching them to love one another, as well as making a difference in the community. Here's a story that captures the spirit of their shared mission:

...[A] woman casually asked Biff how things were going for the team. How successful did he think the boys were going to be?

"I have no idea... I won't really know how successful they're gonna be till they come back to visit in twenty years," Biff said. "Then I'll be able to see what kind of husbands they are. I'll be able to see what kind of fathers they are. I'll see what they're doing in the community."

It's probably true in other sports as well, but I've found the environment around a football team to be conducive to teaching lessons about life. The Yellowjackets are 3-0 at the time I'm writing this article, and I am proud of those guys!

Themes of fatherhood and becoming a man are interwoven into the pages of *Season of Life*. Some of the boys at Gilman struggled with absent and/or unavailable fathers, a reality found at any high school or college today, and another reason why I enjoy passing life lessons to the guys on the team. Jeffrey Marx shares about his relationship with his own father, and about a book that he asked to borrow from Ehrmann. It's called *Questions for My Father*, and Vincent Staniforth wrote it after the death of his father. It's full of questions he never got to ask, but the questions have been redemptive for a number of

father-son relationships since its publication. I picked up the book a couple of years ago, and my dad and I were working through it a few years back. When I attended a funeral for a parishioner's step-father, I heard his sons share stories about their dad, and I took the book back off the shelf. "What's your favorite season?" was the most recent question. The next one would be a bit deeper: "How did you deal with your dad's death?" I am fortunate to be able to share these questions and to have a dad who is still around, and still willing to share his open and honest answers with me.

A Halloween Reminder



I've always been a fan of Halloween, first for masking up as a kid and collecting candy, and then as an adult for the leftovers after the kids have finished their rounds. That's why we always get the good stuff! Some folks prefer to turn out

the lights and ignore the doorbell while sitting in the dark, but I want to encourage all of us to see this as the one time each year that the young families and kids of our neighborhood come to visit! I bring this up because a recurring theme at the 20+ home gathering events I've attended is the desire to see young families at our church. Now I don't expect you to be outside preaching, or even handing out religious tracts but, be generous, and be present!

A couple of years in Omaha, we invited another couple or two to our home, where we camped out in the driveway with the grill going and hotdogs to pass out to the visiting families. Another year we pitched in with those same families and passed out FULL size (not FUN size) candy bars. Kids (especially big ones like me) remember that! Let's be there and be gracious with our young guests this Halloween!


Spearfish UMC Facilities Update

This is an update from the Trustees and the Stewardship & Finance Committee on plans for repairs, maintenance, and improvements planned for our church. The Trustees have created the following capital plan:

- Painting and wood repair in the sanctuary/fellowship hall. The church expanded the sanctuary 27 years ago and added the fellowship hall. This is the first time the walls and woodwork will be repaired and repainted.
 - Cost: \$58,000
- Timeframe: About 3 months. Opportunity: Funds are currently available, but any additional assistance from the congregation will be

appreciated. Donations for this project may be marked "sanctuary painting". Volunteers will be needed to prepare the spaces for the upcoming work.

- Removal and replacement of the severely rusted,
- steel handicap ramp at the west entrance with a concrete ramp. In addition, a small section of sidewalk by the church office will be replaced.
 - o Cost: \$2.500
- Removal of four dead/dying trees on church property.
 - o Cost: \$6,000
- Refurbishment/relighting of the Cross and Flame logo on the south side of the church building.
 - o Cost: \$1700

Free Diabetic Screening Oct. 8 & 9, 2022

More than half of the US population has diabetes or prediabetes, according to a study by the **American Medical Association. About 7 million**

Americans have undiagnosed diabetes.

People with Diabetes can have some of the following symptoms:

- Frequent urination
- Excessive thirst
- Unexplained weight loss
- Extreme hunger
- Tingling or numbness in hands or feet
- Feeling tired
- Sores that are slow to heal
- More infections than usual.
- Blurred vision

The screenings will be offered the following dates/times:

- Saturday, Oct. 8 6:30 P.M.- Following the Blue Jeans service
- Sunday, Oct. 9 10:00 A.M.- Following the Gathering. service
- Sunday, Oct. 9 11:30 A.M. Following the Sanctuary service.

We will also be doing a blood pressure screening.

The Health Ministries Committee encourages you to participate in the Diabetic Screening. Many people have Diabetes and do not even know it, as oftentimes there are no symptoms. Even children can get Diabetes. We are seeing an increase in teenagers. Early diagnosis and early treatment are keys in preventing long term complications from Diabetes!


Dinah's Book Club

The Dakotas Conference Youth will travel and attend as a large group.


The cost for each individual will be \$2,000 and includes: airfare, mission work opportunities, conference registration, most meals, a fun day and the accommodations for the week.

August 2022 Treasurer's Report (Peggy Bosch)

- **Balance Sheet** Nothing new.
- General Fund For the month of August income for the General Fund is \$27,758.85 and expenses are \$47,815.85. It was a very tough month for the General Fund as income was down and there were large insurance payments due. The ending balance for the month of August is \$20,057.00 in the red with all apportionments paid for the year. The year-to-date balance is \$18,485.02 in the red. Income is likely to recover now that Fall has arrived, however there are some large expenses coming up.
- UMCOC Fund For August the income for UMCOC is \$4,105.00 and expenses are \$10,183.98. UMCOC also had a rough month due to large insurance payments. The ending balance for the month of August is \$6,078.98 in the red. The year-to-date balance is \$5,467.14 in the red.
- Children First Income for August for Children First is \$71,896.34 including grant money to help with salaries and to cover expenses for August (as per ARPA Grant requirements). Expenses are \$51,025.06 including insurance payments. The CF Fund ended the last month of their fiscal year in the black \$20,871.28. The year-end balance is \$103,528.02 in the black.
- **Debt Retirement/Capital Fund** The Debt Retirement/Capital Fund income for August is \$3,390.00 and expenses are \$0.00. Balance at the end of August is \$66,737.34.
- **Mission-Giving** Mission-giving for August is \$5,570.00. Mission expenses (distributions) are \$6,225.00 including \$1,750.00 for Pastor's Discretionary. The Mission of the Month is Solar

Oven Partners to which \$870.00 was contributed and sent to the Conference.

Stewardship & Finance Report - September 2022 (Peggy Bosch)

- S & F approved approximately \$10,200 for the ramp/office entrance, Cross & Flame, and tree removal/trimming projects.
- S & F approved approximately \$60,000 for the sanctuary/fellowship hall painting and wood refurbishment.
- S & F approved the Children First Budget for 2022-2023.
- S & F approved a final payment of \$19,184.89 be released to NHSOS.
- S & F approved the rewritten Benevolence Fund and Pastor's Discretionary Policies.
- S & F approved the distribution of the Luena Lent Bequest: \$10,000 for Mission, \$25,000 for Youth and Children, \$56,052.04 plus a small investment fund of about \$5,000 for SUMC needs.

- Children First (CF) began a new school year and a new fiscal year with a major waiting list, but there is ongoing shortage of staff.
- Thank you for mission of the month support for outdoor play areas. The concrete pad was donated by Ainsworth Benning Construction in preparation for the new shade shelter.

- Worship and Music met on August and worked on ironing out the transition from 8:15 to 9:00.
- John will be continuing between the lectionary and UMC Discipleship Ministries Series for the known future.
- John will be out of the pulpit October 8-9.

United Methodist Men (Perry Hansen)

• The men met on September 17th. for their breakfast/devotional meeting. They voted to contribute \$500 to the Pastors Discretionary Fund. Will meet in October on the 1 & 15.

Flu shot/COVID-19 booster IMPORTANT!

Influenza, also called "the Flu," is a potentially serious viral disease that can make people of any age ill. Many parents are unaware that children are at a high risk to get the flu. The American Academy of Pediatrics

advises the flu shot for all children older than 6 months, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends it for all adults.

The CDC recommends that people are vaccinated for flu, by the end of October, to ensure they are fully vaccinated for the influenza season.

The new COVID-19 booster is recommended for anyone 12 and older. The timing of receiving the new COVID-19 vaccine can be dependent on when you last had COVID-19 and if or when you last had your COVID-19 vaccine or booster. If you have any questions about when or if you should get the COVID-19 booster, talk to your health care provider.

It is best to have a flu shot and NEW COVID-19 booster to help protect you against influenza and COVID-19. Both vaccines can be given at the same time (one in each arm).

The benefits of the vaccines can help to prevent families from becoming very ill with these viruses. COVID-19 is still spreading widely and hospitalization rates in older adults have increased since spring. Many studies have shown that people who have had the flu and COVID-19 vaccines are less ill and less likely to be hospitalized or die.

MISSIONS

Hope Center

The HOPE Center is a drop-in day center which offers unduplicated, unique, and crucial services in the community for those living in poverty and without homes. The primary objective of the HOPE Center is to establish relationships with the disadvantaged in the community,



provide an environment of respect and encouragement, and to be a constant in the lives of those who oftentimes lack stability and consistency.

The services offered by the HOPE Center include a mail center, a telephone/messaging center, and a storage facility for short- and long-term storage, as well as important documents. The HOPE Center offers daily devotion every morning, along with opportunities for group prayer and individual prayer time. It provides advocacy for clients, a mentoring program for people living in poverty, free haircuts, and a free laundry facility in the building. The HOPE Center aims to be a trusted source of support by being a safe and stable environment for guests, as well as by filling gaps in services to those in the community who are living in poverty and without homes.
