"Tis the Season"

Halloween is barely behind us. It seems like radio stations began their "24-hour Christmas music" programming even before we had a chance to say "trick-or-treat." Can't we at least get the chocolates eaten

before we have to move into the next season? Speaking of chocolates, I went to Safeway looking for deals on post-Halloween candy only to find the bins refilled with the red and green wrappers of the Christmas candy season. Bah, humbug!

Yes, the season is upon us. The season of invitations. Invitations like "save big money on your holiday shopping," "great deals this holiday season," and "buy all your holiday gifts in one place." You see, even the retailers know that something is coming. One of their

Christmas Shoeboxes

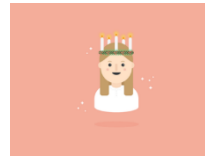
We will be accepting Christmas shoeboxes for Tree of Life Reservation until December 7th.

Council Highlights November 16, 2022

Stewardship & Finance Report, November 2022

S & F met November 9, 2022. A moment of silence and prayer was held to honor Terry Prante who died suddenly

due to a freak accident.

Committee Reports were as follows:

- Trustees said work on the concrete ramp on the west side of the church building and the sidewalk on the east side has been completed. The repair of the flat roof which was damaged in the hail storm of 2019 is partly, but not completely, done.
- UMCOC had to replace the sump pump for the boiler.

Peggy made a motion that the money for the sump pump (about \$1,300) be taken from the Capital Fund. Clarence seconded. Motion passed.

- Children First has completed the new shade shelter. The shelter was built with a high ceiling so that the church van could park under it when there is a chance of hail. There is still a hiring problem at CF but basically all is going well in the classroom. Since UMCOC does not have a building manager the tenants have been coming to Melissa when they need something. This is not an acceptable situation since Melissa is very busy with the management of CF. A revised CF Budget for 2022-2023 was presented

Clarence made a motion to accept the revised CF Budget. Peggy seconded. Motion passed.

We received a nice Thank You note from NHSOS for the financial support the church gave them while they were becoming an independent community organization.

Mary gave a report on the pledging for 2023. So far pledging is below last year's final figures but cards are still coming in. Reminder cards will be sent out later in the week.

Peggy said that she has resigned as Treasurer effective at the end of 2022.

Peggy prepared a statement on the financial situation of the SUMC organization that will go in the Announcements this weekend. (Later Janelle Jones volunteered to present a verbal statement for the three services.)

Peggy was invited to the Staff Parish meeting the previous night to update SPR on the General Fund financial situation. Staff Parish want to give staff 10% raises and stated that they will present this proposal to Council which meets after this meeting. Peggy presented a GF Budget showing best guess for income and requests from all the Committees including a 10% raise for staff from Staff Parish. The deficit would be nearly \$100,000.

Discussion followed with the general consensus being that, although everyone would like to give staff a 10% raise, the church cannot afford to do so at this time. A 5% raise was considered to be more reasonable. Peggy said that even though SPR would not be at the S & F meeting but would go directly to Council with their proposal this did not mean that S & F can't have input. Peggy made note of all the comments by members of S & F regarding the 10% raise and will pass these comments

on to Council when they meet after this meeting.

October 2022 Treasurer's Report

Balance Sheet – Updates for our investment for the third quarter show on the October Balance Sheet. All lost money.

General Fund – For the month of October income for the General Fund is \$31,615.46 and expenses are \$33,575.27. The ending balance for the month of October is \$1,959.81 in the red with all apportionments paid for the year. The year-to-date balance is \$29,716.41 in the red. October was slightly better than September for income. Let's hope the trend continues for November and December!

UMCOC Fund – For October the income for UMCOC is \$4,355.00 and expenses are \$3,039.15. The ending balance for the month of October is \$1,315.85 in the black. The year-to-date balance is \$2,356.11 in the red.

Children First – Income for October for Children First is \$43,329.77 including grant money to help with salaries. Expenses are \$41,001.79. The CF Fund ended the second month of their fiscal year in the black \$2,327.98. The year-to-date balance is \$9,540.09.

Debt Retirement/Capital Fund – The Debt Retirement/Capital Fund income for October is \$3,290.85 and expenses are \$9,856.00. A payment of \$7,000.00 was made to our lender and \$2,856.00 was spent on the cement handicap ramp at the west entrance of the church and to repair the sidewalk at the office entrance. Balance at the end of October is \$61,829.70.

Mission-Giving – Mission-giving for October is \$1,830.00. Mission expenses (distributions) are \$8,355.00 including \$1,625.00 for Pastor's Discretionary and \$5,535.00 for Honduras VIM. The Mission of the Month is the Hope Center for which \$720.00 was collected and distributed.

It's Not Too Late to Get a Flu Shot!

Many people think that if they have not had their flu shot by the end of November, it is too late to get it. That is not true! The Department of Health recommends vaccination to prevent influenza even in January and February. Peak season for influenza is usually the middle of February. Right now, in South Dakota, we are seeing many people with influenza and they are very sick. More than half the states have high or very high levels of flu. Many people get the flu even in March and April. Flu season has started in South Dakota. Many people have had to be hospitalized.

Target populations for the flu shot are: children aged 6-59 months, pregnant women, persons aged 50 and older, persons who live with or care for those at high risk, health care providers. Anyone who wants to prevent getting the flu should get a flu shot.

The new COVID-19 booster has new variants in it to help protect people. One of those new variants is causing people to be very sick, as that variant was not in the original COVID-19 vaccine.

The CDC (Communicable Disease Center) recently updated the COVID-19 booster for ages 5 and older that completed their primary series, (the first 2 doses of COVID-19) or received their last booster at least 2 months ago.

As a community and nation, vaccine and booster dose rates need to increase. Evidence shows that those vaccinated and boosted continue to be more protected against severe disease, hospitalization, and death. Talk to your health care provider if you have questions. Consider getting the flu and COVID-19 vaccines.

You can receive the new COVID-19 booster and the annual flu shot at the same time. They can be given together-one in each arm.
