## **Genesis to Revelation**

Welcome to the season of Pentecost (aka the season after Pentecost)! We began by celebrating the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on all people, fulfilling the prophecy of

Joel and the promise of Jesus. The first Sunday in June is Trinity Sunday, and we'll be starting a worship series on the book of Genesis that will take us through almost the entirety of the summer months.

Genesis is a wonderful storybook that begins by telling us about a God who is unlike other gods—a God who willingly and wonderingly creates good things by speaking them into existence. The Creation cooperates with its Creator to become a beautiful, bountiful paradise with Adam and Eve as its co-rulers and caretakers. Much is to be learned about who we are and who God is. Next, the story rapidly transports us to the journey of a family destined to become the nation of Israel—God's nation of priests who will bless others out of the blessings they receive. Their names are familiar: Abraham and Sarah, Isaac and Rebekah, Jacob and his twelve sons. Their adventures of faith and foibles of failure take up the vast remainder of the book.

At nearly the same time, the Tuesday morning (online) bible study will shift gears from the weighty book of Romans to the elusive, illustrative book of Revelation. If you've struggled to make sense of the numerous, disturbing, and apocalyptic images scattered throughout John's visions, this is the study for you! Many studies in this wonderful book get so captivated by the fascinating trees that they miss the beauty of the forest. Together, we'll discover some themes that hold the book together, and then we will begin to see the meaning of the various pieces from the perspective of the whole.

So, take the challenge – join us as we read and study all the way from Genesis through Revelation! Contact Rod Garnett

## Honduras Mission Team Update

Medical team members from 5 Dakotas UMC churches worked in rural Honduras for 2 weeks in March, our first team since COVID. Thanks to much help and organization from our host, Send Hope, we were able to provide basic medical/dental care to about 1800 children and adults in that rural area. One of the issues we saw when we were in Honduras was that there was no rain during the "rainy season", so people were very concerned about crops and water supplies.

As feared, this week we received notice that the Send Hope well has gone dry, as well as most of the wells in the area. Imagine a home caring for about 40 children and teens with no water! Currently they are "making do" by running a hose from the missionary's house across the road, but a new deeper, different type of well is urgently needed to meet the needs of the kids at Send Hope and the neighborhood houses. But there is good news. Thanks to donations from current and former mission team members, \$2500 was sent to start the well fund moving. And thanks to YOU, who donated so generously to cinnamon roll fundraisers, we have requested funds from Honduras team reserves to complete the well costs and provide a water supply that neighbors can access. This isn't our "usual" medical team project, but what a blessing to provide clean healthy water to help Send Hope continue to care for so many.

#### **Skin Cancer Awareness**

Summer is just around the corner. The Health Ministry Committee wants our congregation to be aware of the symptoms of skin cancer and ways to prevent it. SYMPTOMS OF SKIN CANCER MAY INCLUDE:

- A new spot on the skin
- Changes in the size, shape, or color of an existing spot
- A spot that is itchy or painful
- A non-healing sore that bleeds or develops a crust
- A red or skin-colored shiny bump on the top of the skin

• A red rough or scaly spot that you can feel HOW CAN YOU REDUCE THE RISK OF SKIN CANCER?

- Avoid sun exposure between 10:00 AM and 2 PM
- Wear protective clothing: Long -sleeved shirts, pants, wide-brimmed hats



- Generously apply a broad-spectrum waterresistant sunscreen with a Sun Protection Factor (SPF) of 30 or more to all exposed skin.
- Avoid tanning beds

It is important to contact your Health Care Provider if you notice any of the above symptoms of skin cancer. The Health Ministry Committee promotes a healthy congregation!

#### Council Highlights May 16, 2023

#### **Benevolence Fund**

• The Stewardship and Finance Committee approved the request for funds to help a person with travel and hotel expenses to Mayo Clinic. The next step is for the Administrative Council to approve the request which we did with a unanimous vote.

#### Lay Member of Annual Conference

• Colleen McKirdy was approved as the substitute lay member of Annual Conference.

#### **Missions Fund Request**

- Ron Borgman attended the council meeting to inform us about a situation in Honduras.
  - The place where they go for their mission trip each year is having a drought and their well has run dry. This well serves an orphanage and other places in the village. The village is asking for financial help to dig a deeper well or a new well – whichever is needed.
  - Ron asked permission to use the Honduras Mission Fund money to help them with their well. The amount requested was \$2,400. This was approved by Council.

#### <u>Pursuing God's Will Together – Book Study –</u> Chapter 5 Discussion

- Using the questions on pages 105-106 of our book, the council members discussed the essential values that we want to emphasize at Council. The 4 essential values we agreed on are:
  - Christ-Centered
  - Respect
  - o Trust
  - o Service

#### Sound System

• Kevin reported that the UCC is having an outdoor worship service this summer and is wondering if they could borrow our sound system for it. We all agreed that would be fine but suggested that they pay Kevin for his time.

#### **Committee Reports**

#### <u>Stewardship & Finance Committee Report, May 2023</u> (Keith Haiar)

#### **Discussion Highlights:**

- We have reapplied for the federal Employee Retention Credit program. Process may take 6-9 months.
- Pastor John spoke about the five types of fundraising from the book Giving and Stewardship by Callahan.
- Review of the restricted funds and some dormant accounts.

#### April Treasurer's Report

#### **Balance Sheet – General Fund**

For the month of April, total income was \$47,529 and total expenses were \$41,635. Donations were up for the month averaging about \$8k per week compared to \$6k per week for March. The month of April ended in the black \$5,893 leaving the General Fund year to date in the red of \$14,990. However, this includes a quarterly transfer of \$6,500 from the Rebate fund.

#### UMCOC

The income for UMCOC was \$5,430 and expenses were \$5,630 ending the month \$200 in the red. The YTD balance is now \$837 in the red.

#### **Debt/Capital**

We received \$2,435 in donations, up slightly from last month. We made another quarterly loan payment bringing the YTD balance for the fund to \$51,839.

#### **Children First**

April income for Children First was \$45,128 and expenses were \$41,220. Children First ended April \$3,907 in the black and YTD in the black \$28,192.

#### **Mission-Giving**

Mission giving for April was \$3,365. We gave out \$2,470, Mission of the Month was the Help Fund (\$2,135).

#### <u>UMM</u> (Bill Lundgren)

- The Spearfish United Methodist Men meet on the first and third Saturday at 8:00 am for breakfast and devotions. Church members and non-members are welcome. Attendance is usually 12-15 men.
- Financial support for our organization comes from the collection of aluminum cans and offerings collected at the breakfast. The total amount collected this year from the cans is \$261.10 and \$416.00 from offerings. The nonprofit organizations that we supported were the following:
  - American Legion Teener Youth Baseball - \$200.00
  - Methodist Youth Florida Trip \$300.00
  - Church of Christ Paraments Gift -\$200.00
- The Methodist Men also helped the Spearfish Food Pantry, which included picking up food and delivering food to the pantry.

#### Children First (Janelle Jones)

- "Waddler" room is nearly ready and has a lead teacher. Many donated materials and hours went into this effort.
- Tuition was set for 2023-24 school year which starts Sept 1 with 3% increase for preschool and 5% for daycare.
- Fence and sandbox have been repaired. Insurance check has been received. Replacement toys were ordered.

#### Trustees (John Swanson)

• The deck is patched. We are going to propose a total deck replacement. We are asking two of the businesses that provided previous bids to bid a new deck.

- Robotics club made a presentation on what they do and are interested in renting room ten upstairs at UMCOC. They were there last year also.
- A work order has been signed to install the valve on the storage tank for the boiler at UMCOC. It has been shut down for the summer. Climate Control will prepare it for the summer.
- Room two is moving along in its preparations for occupation.
- Trustees welcome anyone to make presentations to our committee before the business meeting begins. Then trustees will meet for its business meeting.

#### CYFM Report (Brenda Swanson)

- Sunday school is about to wrap up for the regular season on Sunday, May 21<sup>st</sup>. Join us for Sundae Sunday between services as we celebrate!
- VBS will be in August. Volunteers will be needed.
- Graduates were recognized and students were confirmed on Mother's Day.
- Youth end-of-year event will be May 17<sup>th</sup>.

## Good Shepherd Clinic has New Executive Director

The Good Shepherd Clinic (GSC) Board of Directors is pleased to announce the hiring of Chris Davis as its first Executive Director. Since opening its doors in February 2009, GSC has been entirely organized and run by dedicated volunteers. The board feels that due to the clinic's growth and community needs, it was time to hire an Executive Director to oversee the clinic's services and programs and have one designated individual for the community and volunteers to contact.

Chris has volunteered with GSC for 11 years, serving as the Eligibility Team Leader, PR/Marketing Chair, Board of Directors member and secretary, and has been instrumental in updating and maintaining by-laws, policies, procedures, and other organization paperwork. She has a medical background and over 20 years of experience working with non-profit organizations. Chris began her position on May 1.

Board President, Dr. Lou Hogrefe says, "Good Shepherd Clinic is blessed to have Chris Davis as its first Executive Director. She will bring value to Good Shepherd Clinic and the people we serve."






