held on Sept. 16 and Riley Chrisman gave devotions. Both meetings had 10 men in attendance.


The group will hold breakfast and devotions again on Saturday, Oct. 7 & 21 at 8:00 AM. All men are welcome to attend.

Council Highlights September 19, 2023

Discussion/Action Items:

Methodist Men reported they will no longer recycle aluminum cans (low recycle prices, high fuel costs, lots of

garbage to sort out).

Church attendance and financial giving trends over the past two years were reviewed. In 2022, attendance averaged 200 from Jan to July, 160-170 from July to Sept and then returned to about 200. In 2023, attendance averaged 200 from Jan to May and has dropped to 150. So the summer drop off was earlier than last year and slightly larger. We will watch if church attendance doesn't come back in September. For the year, the congregation has had five deaths and four withdrawn or transferred memberships. From May through July, total giving averaged about \$35,000. August giving was almost \$24,000. Hoping this was a one-time blip.

Opened for discussion the Finance committee's decision to reduce the apportionment payments from 14% to 12%.

Over the past couple of years Children First has selffunded a couple of building/lot improvements: notably the shade structure and now the asphalt playground repair. Some guidelines may be helpful in future situations. The Task Force will include this issue as they develop organizational recommendations.

Signage at UMCOC – (see Trustees report below). Discussion on possible options to remove the signage. Trustees will revisit but they are pursuing installing a new door camera system.

Parsonage – The Trustees have had preliminary discussions on the keeping or selling the parsonage. Council members discussed the pros and cons. Trustees will have further deliberations with some more solid data.

UMC/CF Task Force report. Several meetings have been held. Background on CF history and operational finances, current concerns and possible solutions have been discussed. A written memorandum of understanding is targeted for Jan 2024 with the Task Force work completed by July 2024.

Bulletin insert for the October pledge drive was shared with council for input as this item was developed after the Finance meeting. The insert was approved with some minor editing.

Motion made to add Kelvin Lower and Collen McKirdy to the Nominations committee and remove Janelle Jones. Seconded and passed.

Values – Discussion on value adjectives: Worship – Spiritual, True and Acceptable Outreach – Intergenerational, Boundless, Loving Youth & Children/Child Development – Multi-generational Discipleship, Intergenerational Discipleship Fellowship – Welcoming Generous Stewardship

A small group will work on the Values and return with ideas at the next meeting.

• With the General Fund >\$50,00 in the red, it was approved to reduce apportionment payments to 12% from 14%.

August Treasurer's Report Balance Sheet

About \$40,000 was transferred from the money market account to the checking account to cover insurance payments and other upcoming expenses. As of September 10th, the Parsonage Repair Fund received \$8,260 and spent \$4,304. Money collected for the church boiler repair totaled \$6,440. An account was added for CF playground asphalt repair.

General Fund

For the month of August, total income was \$31,986. Total expenses were \$49,094 which resulted in the month ending \$17,107 in the red. Year to date the General Fund is in the red \$51,598. This month's deficit was due in part to the quarterly insurance payment of \$18,633.

<u>UMCOC</u>

The income for UMCOC was \$6,100 and expenses were \$8,022. The month ended in the red \$1,922. The year-to-date balance is in the red \$749. This month's deficit was due to the insurance payment of \$5,027.

Debt/Capital

We received \$4,000 in donations. Of this, \$1200 was given for parsonage repair. The year to date balance is \$54,264. Of these funds, up to \$17,000 will be needed to replace the pumps and fittings for the church boiler.

Children First

Children First August income totaled \$35,282 and expenses were \$52,739. Children First ended August in the red \$17,456. This was due in part to an insurance payment of \$10,807. The year to date balance ended in the red \$13,096. This was the last month of their fiscal year and the negative year end value will be offset from the prior year fund balance.

Mission-Giving

Mission giving for August totaled \$2,415 and we distributed \$4,180. Mission of the Month was Solar Ovens which received \$1,470. For the month, the UMC Help fund collected \$300 and distributed \$2,175. Activity from the Help Fund will be suspended in order to replenish the account.

Trustees Report

Church: Boiler still waiting for parts to come in. Approved a stainless-steel cart for a temporary place for the coffee machine to set on.

Parsonage: Approved a glue down LVP flooring for the parsonage. Will need help moving furniture around when it is installed. By using this method if we have another flood the floor will not need to be removed. Started initial discussion of what would be done if the parsonage was sold. Pro's and con's.

UMCOC: Found part to fix chemical pump ourselves. Genes lock shop provided bid for camera and three tablets to view who is at entrance door to let in. Bid is \$835. We are in favor of installing it. Discussion of signage removal was held. Motion was made to remove signage, but after reviewing council minutes discussion didn't follow guidance. We will revisit it. We also received word from Steve Byrd regarding Kelvin removing signage from chimney. We would not be covered by insurance for liability if something happens, or if something were damaged. He recommends that we would use a licensed bonded contractor to do this.

Missions Committee

The following donations were given for mission projects in August 2023:

Our Mission of the Month for September is the Children First Scholarship Fund.

Children First Report

Children First is state licensed, high-quality care and standards, well trained staff, Montessori focused. Fall enrollment—82 children, increased tuition for all levels of care.

Staff—4 new staff members, total 24 employees due to hours available to work & adding waddler room; starting wage \$14/hour. Ratio 1 to 5 for three rooms, less if new babies.

Finances—income for August tuition and pledges equals only wages of \$35,000. Room reimbursement is \$3500/mo. New insurance rate increase, paid over \$12,000 for first quarter. Curriculum, supplies, snacks, training all increasing costs. Ended the year 8-31-23 close to even, using Covid and other grants (\$30,000) and previous year funds (\$28,000). Annual budget for Children First about \$650,000.

Summary of Children First Board discussion of expectations for CF and UMC:

- 1. Respect and kindness
- 2. Clear open communication, working to understand as more important than to be understood
- 3. Desire for building manager or single contact person for UMCOC
- 4. Increased understanding of services operating at UMCOC and the distinction between the building and Children First

The challenge—How can we at UMC be part of the solution regarding the national crisis to provide early childhood education here in Spearfish? Issues include not enough centers or home sites, waiting lists, quality of care, affordability for families, rising costs and low wages. Do we view Children First as a ministry serving this community or a business that needs to pay its way?

The above facts are from the CF staff, the observations are mine and those expressed by the CF Board. The CF Task Force plans to report to Council and Charge Conference this fall. Respectfully submitted, Janelle Jones
