## **Pastor's Page**

#### Beloved—

The New Year will soon be behind us. You're probably thinking January 1st, but I'm thinking December 3<sup>rd</sup>. Confused? Perhaps we're thinking of two

different calendars. We're all familiar with calendars that begin in January and end in December. And yes, the start of that new year is coming soon. But are you also familiar with the Christian Calendar? That's the one that includes the major Christian holidays of Christmas and Easter. "Yes," you might be thinking, "I'm familiar with those days—because that's when someone else might be occupying my pew, and I have to find a new place to sit." While that may be true, there's more to the Christian Calendar than Christmas and Easter.

The Christian Calendar begins with Advent. Which leads, naturally, to the question, "What's the date of Advent?" I can tell you that the first day of Advent is always on a Sunday, but the date varies from one year to the next. Here's how to calculate the date: Find Christmas (always on December 25th) and count backward four Sundays. That's the first Sunday of Advent. This was a bit complicated last year, as Christmas was on a Sunday. Did Christmas count as one of the four Sundays? Good question, but the answer is No—it's the four Sundays before Christmas. This year is the opposite extreme: Sunday the 24th (Christmas Eve) is the first Sunday before Christmas and is, therefore, the 4th Sunday of Advent. Are you still confused? Perhaps some color is needed.

You've probably noticed, in some churches, that there are colored banners, tablecloths, and assorted decorations that follow patterns of color. Here's a brief, general description of the seasons of the Christian Calendar and their associated colors:

- Advent blue or violet
- Christmas white or gold
- Epiphany green
- Lent violet
- Good Friday black

- Easter white or gold
- Pentecost Sunday red
- Pentecost green

While Advent always comprises the four Sundays before Christmas, several of the other seasons can vary in length in order to accommodate the dates of Easter and Christmas.

The Christian Calendar and its associated colors are ways for the Church to mark the passing of time and, as is especially emphasized during Advent, the coming of Jesus Christ.

Here are a few questions to guide your Advent Season:

- How am I sensing the presence of Christ?
- Where (in my life, in my community, and in the world) is Christ needed most?
- What is a way I can embody Christ to someone (and who is that someone)?

Happy New Year, a Blessed Advent, and a Merry Christmas!

## Council Highlights November 21, 2023

#### **Motions**

- Christmas CD
  - Kevin asked the Council to approve the making of a Christmas CD. Several musicians in the church will be working on the CD to sell with the profits going to UMC. An anonymous donor will cover the original costs involved.
  - Beth made the motion to approve the CD, Keith seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

#### **Discussion Items**

- Fundraising / Online Presence / Attendance
  - Keith suggested that the church needs to look at fundraising in a different way. UMC must tap into un-pledged monies. Along with our fundraising drive in October, UMC should be thinking of ideas throughout the year to raise money for the general fund. He suggested that more than one committee needs to be involved in

- this effort and would like the Administrative Council to help lead the way.
- The church is looking at a \$60,000 deficit for the 2024 calendar year so we will need to generate a lot of income throughout the year. We also need to close the gap on this year's budget.
- Attendance is down and this is a key factor as to why we are looking at a deficit. Keith suggested paying more attention to attendance and monitoring membership more closely.
- Another suggestion is to tap into the on-line audience. UMC averages 100 on-line participants each week. This makes up one-third of our congregation. Kevin will investigate ways to provide an on-line donation QR Code or link.
- Jeanette commented that this issue of fundraising needs to involve the whole congregation with Pastor John's leadership and each committee working together for solutions and a common goal.
- One idea was a brainstorming session on a Sunday afternoon.

 Children First board, and Sarah Hazledine presented request for a washer, dryer and signage removal at UMCOC. They left before the budget at UMCOC could be discussed.

- Motion to purchase pumps for boiler but postpone work since it currently isn't leaking. Approved

#### **Parsonage**

- John and Evie compiled a short list of things needing attention.
- Trim work completed.
- Heating, motion to put in sensor system and thermostat to control basement heating by Climate Control. Approved

#### **UMCOC**

- Motion to approve washer, dryer installation through Children First funding at their request. Approved
- Motion to remove all signage with UMCOC logo from building with Children First funding. Children First offered to fund this project. Approved
- Drainpipe installation on boiler blow by valve needs to be installed. Climate Control will be contacted.
- Motion to install security camera system for upstairs tenants. Approved
- Motion to have a paid property manager for UMCOC. Approved
- Motion to accept 5 percent rent increase budget

alternative presented in collaboration with church treasurer. Approved

#### Women in Faith (Debra Richardson)

- Current membership is low.
- It is difficult for our women to serve on funeral teams. Our current membership is aging with health issues preventing abilities to complete tasks for large gatherings.

## **Stewardship & Finance Committee Report** (Keith Haiar)

S&F met on November 7th. Discussion highlights:

- Approved revised UMCOC budget from Trustees
- Reviewed Fall Pledge Drive
- Reviewed Draft General Fund budget
- Discussed online website, use, and donations
- Requested input from Staff/Parish on Young Life progress and recommendation for next year

#### October Treasurer's Report – Balance Sheet General Fund

For the month of October, total income was \$37,024. Total expenses were \$30,104 which resulted in the month ending \$6,919 in the black. However, the General Fund year to date is in the red \$40,386. Unpledged income was above the past several months.

#### **UMCOC**

The income for UMCOC was \$5,595 and expenses were \$2,842. The month ended in the black \$2,752. The year-to-date balance is in the black \$4,883.

#### **Debt/Capital**

We received \$12,561 in donations. The majority (\$9,800) of this was for parsonage repair and boiler repair. The quarterly loan payment of \$7000 was made bringing the YTD available balance for the fund to \$70,976. However approximately \$20,000 of this will be needed for the boiler repair.

#### **Children First**

Children First October income totaled \$44,141 and expenses were \$50,194. Children First ended October in the red \$6,052 and year to date in the red \$3,587.

#### **Mission-Giving**

Mission giving for October totaled \$1,787. We distributed \$2,445. Ingathering Kits received \$2,785. For the month, the UMC Help fund collected \$727 and distributed \$1,425.

#### **Artemis House**

Artemis House serves those affected by domestic violence in Butte, Harding, and Lawrence counties in South Dakota. Services include a 42-person emergency shelter for people made homeless due to recent domestic violence. Additionally, advocates man a 24-hour hotline, organize support groups, provide personal advocacy through filing protection orders and identifying affordable housing.
