# **Pastor's Page**

### **Beloved**—

I'm excited for Lent to begin. Okay, that sounds a bit strange why would I be excited about a season of fasting and repentance (i.e., giving stuff up and

wallowing)? Well, while those practices are a part of Lent, let me tell you some other things that will be happening.

It all starts the day before it starts. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, which happens to coincide with Valentine's Day this year (For that reason, I would not recommend fasting from chocolate, as all the unsold Valentine's Day candy will go on sale on the 15<sup>th</sup>—a day late for starting a chocolate fast. Unless you freeze the chocolate until Easter, but there's another big chocolate holiday—when all the unsold Easter candy hits the sale aisle!). The Tuesday preceding Ash Wednesday is alternately called "Fat Tuesday" or "Mardi Gras". If you're not going to be in New Orleans, plan to attend our FAT TUESDAY PANCAKE FEAST here at the church. Invite coworkers, friends, and family to join you too! It's on February 13<sup>th</sup>, from 5-7pm. Hey—what a great idea for a cheap, pre-Valentine's Day date!

Our Lenten Study will focus on the "I am" statements of Jesus. When Moses encountered God in the burning bush, Moses asked for God's name. "I am" was God's response. In John's Gospel, Jesus utters several "I am" statements that understandably upset the religious leaders who held God's name to be too holy to utter aloud. For example, Jesus said "I am the bread of life" and "I am the resurrection and the life". Our study book is called *The God We Can Know: Exploring the "I am" Sayings of Jesus*, and it will be available soon. Please sign up if you'd like to facilitate and/or participate in this study, which will help you find and form as answer to the most essential question in the Christian faith, "Who do you say I am?"

You may remember that we joined our neighbors at the United Church of Christ for a portion of the Lenten season last year. As a gift and remembrance of our time together, we purchased new, violet paraments for the front of their sanctuary. If you have a chance, please stop by their church and take a look at these beautiful works of art that will enhance their sanctuary.

As we continue our 28-day journey of *Dynamite Prayer*, please continue to lift up the church and your next pastor, and I am also thankful for your prayers for me and wherever my next journey will take Evie and me. Our journey concludes right around the time we will have a prayerful discernment conversation about Children First and its ministry of childcare in our community. Please plan to attend that conversation on Saturday, February 10, at 9:00am.

What an exciting beginning to Lent!

# **Coffee with Pastor John**





## **Lenten Study**

The God We Can Know is a 7-week study designed for the entire congregation to explore the "I am" sayings of Jesus found in the Gospel of John. Perfect for Lent, this series will help you find and form an answer to the most essential question in the Christian faith, "Who do you say I am?"

One by one, Jesus's statements grab our imagination, reveal more about his identity and purpose, and connect us to the God of Moses, who spoke the first



"I am." These significant, yet ordinary images (bread, light, shepherd, vine, and more) give us insightful ways to experience Jesus and point us to a God who wants to be known.

The DVD, filmed on location in the Holy Land, allows you to travel with Rob Fuquay and actually see the places where Jesus stood while disclosing his

true identity, and in what context he spoke each "I Am." The book, DVD/study guide combo, and online support work together to provide one of the most meaningful, transforming initiatives your church can provide for the entire congregation.

Weekly themes include:

- Introduction to "I am" Knowing God
- I am the Bread of Life Knowing God's Satisfaction
- I am the Light of the World Knowing God's Guidance
- I am the Good Shepherd Knowing God's Care
- I am the True Vine Knowing God's Power
- I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life Knowing God's Way
- I am the Resurrection and the Life Knowing God's Possibilities

## **Boy Scout Chili Feed**



## **Dreams for the Future**

There is "seed money" available for new ministries or support for unbudgeted projects at Spearfish UMC. Think parable of five talents, two talents, 1 talent. What could we do to share Christ's stories and love in this area? The Stewardship and Finance

Committee announced that \$3434.12 is available for unbudgeted ministries or projects from the church Investment Fund distribution. All requests are to be submitted in writing by Feb 12 to Mary Tracy in the Finance Office at <u>finance@spearfishumc.org</u> by **Monday, February 12**. The funds are for new ideas, something not in the budget.

The Resolution establishing an investment fund states: "Each year a distribution will be made available to SUMC by the Investment Committee from The Fund. A maximum of 75% of the previous calendar year's earnings shall be available for distribution starting January each year." Because investment returns have been up and down, there has been no distribution some years.

What is God's plan for the future of this church? We can use this to enter into dreaming, prayer, collaboration, more prayer and communication. Consider this, God and the laity lead us into the future. We can't sit back, saying, "This new pastor should bring in lots of children, youth, families!"

Here's Janelle's dream: Starting in the fall, each first Wednesday to hold an open family supper at 5:30 pm. Invite Coop Preschool families, Youth and Family Services families, Children First families and all staff. Conduct a special time 5-5:30 for "littles" (age 2 thru grade 2) with Bible story, songs and prayer. Funds might buy picture books of Bible stories. End with worship at the tables of the same Bible story, songs, prayer.

Expand the use of early release time for school children and youth (most first Wednesdays each month). Set up stations like VBS for music, acting the Bible story, crafts, prayer, hobby station. Can you see the energy? Where are you in this picture? First please pray!

What are some possible next steps?

- 1. Pray for the right new pastor to be appointed to begin July 1, 2024
- 2. Pray for God to reveal a new future or new ways to share Christ's love
- 3. Apply for funds by Feb 12, 2024
- 4. Form a core planning team for your ministry expansion
- 5. Connect with all groups in the church, focus on communication
- 6. Work with the new pastor in July and August to build the kingdom of God.




