

During the first weekend of each month, our congregation celebrates the sacrament of Holy Communion. We share the body and blood of Jesus

United Methodist Churches are Connectional

United Methodist Churches are connectional which means we support the mission and ministries of this district, Dakotas Conference, Episcopal area (ND, SD, MN), North Central Jurisdiction and General Conference. Examples include

support for three camps in the Dakotas as well as Africa University. Global mission projects include Volunteers in Mission (VIM).

Because we are a connectional church, the appointive cabinet, which consists of Bishop Lanette Plambeck and four district superintendents, discern, seek and decide on the best pastor for each church. Spearfish UMC was named as a "clear open" to inform clergy that our church would be ready for a new pastor July 1, 2024. The new pastor and spouse have been introduced to the Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC). An introductory video was shown in worship February 18.

Each month, the UM Churches contribute to the Dakotas Conference a specific percentage of general fund

income to support what we do together as a connectional denomination. Over the years, that "tithing" of our general fund has been decreased due to votes held at Dakotas Annual Conference: 16%, 15%, 14% down to 13.5% for 2024. Because the projected income of SUMC is \$30,000 below anticipated expenses, Council decided to delay payment of apportionments the first months of this year. About \$5,000 was not submitted for apportionments during January to meet the 13.5% obligation.

Income was high in January 2024 because some donations are made for the year. Normal expenses include staff salaries, utilities, and upkeep. Snow removal bills are sometimes high and a quarterly bill for insurance was paid in February.


Considering the \$30,000 income gap, one idea to increase donations is to hold special events during the year. The first two events brought in net income of about \$730 & \$1,000. It seems like at that rate of return, SUMC needs 30 special events (at the rate of \$1,000 each).

How do we meet this need? First, prayers for God's guidance, then a spirit of generosity and hope. All that we have is a gift from God. How can we give to the work of God?

Mission of the Month

Tree of Life



Tree of Life ministry is located on the Rosebud reservation in Mission, South Dakota. That reservation has more than 50% of the population living below the poverty level. Working through staff and volunteers from all over the

USA, Tree of Life addresses poverty issues by:

1. Warm Welcome Feeding Program – more than 200 families are fed a nourishing meal 4 days a week – over 52,000 meals last year! They also distribute donated grocery items, 1,5000,000 pounds last year through their food pantry.

2. **Tree of Life Thrift Store** sells new and used clothing and household goods at low cost so families can afford decent clothing.



- 3. **Tree of Life and Volunteer Teams** repair about 50 houses a year. Those who live in tribal owned housing are not allowed to do repairs themselves, and may wait years for requested repairs, but Tree of Life teams are allowed to do badly needed repairs with tribal permission.
- 4. **Interaction With Christian Volunteers** and mission teams from all over the USA demonstrates the caring of others to those in poverty.
