#### **Pastor's Page**

Beloved.

It's hard to believe, but this will be my penultimate (second-to-last) monthly contribution to the Trumpeter. At this moment, the immediate future is uncertain, but

God's presence and participation in that future is guaranteed. Here's how things stand at the moment (as I understand them):

- Pastor Paul Lint, who has been appointed to be the next pastor at Spearfish United Methodist, continues to serve at the Wesley Acres Camp and Retreat Center as they interview candidates to take his place there.
- When they've hired a new director for Wesley • Acres, they will implement a transition process there which will include a date for Pastor Paul. his wife Brenda, and their children to move to Spearfish.
- Evie and I are continuing our search for where God has planned for us to serve. At this time, we are hoping that we will land somewhere in the Chicago area. Our son Nathan attends North Park University in Chicago, and we have relatives in Chicago and others easily accessible from Chicago.
- At present, our plan is to be flexible so that there can be a smooth pastoral transition.

As my mother used to say, that's "about as clear as mud", but it's what I'm able to pass along at this time. We will let you know as these events start to come into focus.

Considering what I've just said, it's appropriate that the Revised Common Lectionary (from which pastors can get ideas for preaching texts) features the Book of Acts this month. With the celebration of Pentecost in our worship services on May 18-19, it's a good time to reflect on the unpredictable and delightful work of the Holy Spirit. After Jesus' resurrection and ascension, the promised Spirit arrives to equip and expel the early believers into mission. What had been a predominantly Jewish expression of faith moves beyond its borders and boundaries to include and pursue new followers from

unexpected places and backgrounds. Ancient Scriptures are rediscovered, reframed, and repurposed to accommodate new peoples and new practices. Baptism replaces circumcision as the mark of inclusion into the community. Change happens and is met with varying degrees of joy and resistance. Like the deck at the parsonage, it's as though everything is being torn down in order to be rebuilt!

I would like to ask each of you to consider how you might more actively participate in our worship services. Can you sign up to read Scripture, greet people at the doors, help serve communion, or provide and serve refreshments after our worship services? Signup sheets are usually available in the front lobby or the fellowship hall.

If you're an online worshipper, please consider the nice Spring-into-Summer weather as yet another personal invitation to join us in person. We'd love to see you!

He and his wife ranch south of Beulah and have 3 children, Lauen in Seattle, Owen attending Michigan State University and Hayes a senior at Sundance High School.


His vision for the church is a vibrant, active congregation spreading the gospel to our community.

The Miracle Offering will be divided among these recipients:

**31:8 Project**: 31:8 Project's mission is to equip and challenge society to proactively address issues regarding human trafficking. Based in Bismarck, North Dakota, 31:8 offers informative seminars, conducts research, and creates curriculum applicable to all levels of education and forms of human trafficking. Donation support activities like the Bakken Human Trafficking Summit, mentorships for survivors of human trafficking, and the Demand Reduction Program—an education partnership designed to reduce recidivism.

**Abbott House's Bridges Therapeutic Foster Care:** In 2013-2014 supporters of Abbot House came together to build Bridges Therapeutic Foster Homes in Mitchell, SD,

so young girls could grow up with a family and a home. Today, there are 10 therapeutic foster homes serving, boys and girls, in Mitchell, Rapid City and Sioux Falls. **Recovery Ministry:** Through recovery ministries, people are building their relationship with Christ, and shaping a path to healthy living with those around them. Funds will be granted to United Methodist churches in the Dakotas Conference engaged in recovery ministry. **Clergy Sustentation Fund:** A special fund has been set up to assist clergy with direct financial support when a desperate need does arise. The Clergy Sustentation Fund is a means to tangibly care for our clergy and families in a time of need. Your gifts become signs of hope and grace in difficult times.

lack of funds and can't open until sufficient funds are available. Usually, 10-20 people a week come in for
