Pastor's Page

In the morning, the Governor led the parade. The same afternoon, I arrived in Spearfish. It was the 4th of July, 2022. Pastor Scott McKirdy had been called to serve at Canyon Lake UMC in Rapid City, and I was to fill

his shoes in preparation for the next pastor at Spearfish United Methodist Church (SUMC). The problem was, Pastor Scott had taken his shoes with him!

Transitional ministry is what takes place between pastors. It's what I've done the past five years or so, and it's been rewarding. As we take a look back at the past two years here in Spearfish, I'd like us to see it through the lenses of transitional ministry, which involves five areas: Heritage, Mission, Community, Leadership, and Future.

Heritage

Over twenty "home gatherings" made it possible for me to introduce myself and to learn about the church and its community. Several participants shared about mission trips they had taken over the years. Others shared about hospitality and kindness. Still others mentioned the variety of worship services at SUMC. While the pandemic and political and denominational anxieties have contributed to some departures, the church remains relatively strong.

Mission

We share in the United Methodist mission: "Creating disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world". Our vision statement is "Know God. Love God. Serve Others." With the help of Pastor Connie Eichinger, we discerned our values:

- Welcoming Fellowship •
- Christ-centered Worship
- Multigenerational Discipleship
- **Overflowing Generosity** •
- **Compassionate Outreach**

These values, along with our Mission and Vision Statements, describe the ongoing ministry of our church. Community

Our church is highly involved in serving the community. In addition to supporting existing ministries, SUMC hosts substance-abuse programs, and provides "Help Fund" cards to help people in need.

Since Spearfish is a college town, I sought to connect to the community through the college football team. I showed up for practices and home games, and even got to travel with the team to two road games! In addition, some of the players helped in moving things around in the sanctuary in preparation for painting.

As mentioned above, the United Methodist Church is undergoing significant conflict, with numerous churches choosing to disaffiliate from the denomination. As an interim pastor, I sought to maintain a compassionate, centrist position, not choosing one side over another.

Leadership

The UMC Book of Discipline was a handy guide over these past two years. We used its direction to firm up who needed to attend the various committee meetings, the responsibilities of each committee, and how meetings should run. With these clarifications, I hope we have made the decision-making process less cumbersome and repetitive. The four main committees: Trustees, Finance, Staff-Parish Relations, and Administrative Council appear to be well-led and operating well. **Future**

I've sent a longer version of this report to Pastor Paul, offering a few suggestions for the church to consider. The first, however, is to get to know Pastor Paul, his wife Brenda, and their children. They will all have joys and challenges as they move into a new community and a new ministry. Please offer to help and be patient as they find their groove.

It has been a quick two years. While I've enjoyed transitional ministry, it has a significant side effect: I get to know really good people, but I don't get to stay with them. Evie and I have thoroughly enjoyed our time here with you. We've fallen in love with you, and with this church. We will miss you, but we look forward to hearing about your next adventures with your new pastor and his family!

Mission of the Month Spearfish Food Pantry



The Spearfish Community Pantry works to fight hunger in Spearfish and St. Onge. In 2023 they served 691 people, with roughly 30% being children. Last year, community members donated a total of 117,000 lbs. of food, which fed about 257 families a month.

The pantry's largest single food donor is the Spearfish Wal-Mart. This past year, they donated 64,706 lbs. of food. Last year, community-based food drives brought in a total of 32,461 lbs. of food. The largest food drive in 2023 was organized by local Boy Scout troops and the Post Office; their efforts brought in 14,950 lbs. of food.

Every month in 2023, the pantry supplemented donated stock by purchasing about \$8,325 worth of food to meet community needs. Those purchases, made from Feeding South Dakota headquarters in Rapid City, rely on monetary donations from community members as well. Pantry beneficiaries don't have to be income qualified. Rather, they can identify themselves and their families as in need of support. Time to sink the canoe again!

There is a small transaction fee of 1.89%.


