

The Faithfulness of Gardening

There is a great deal of content and imagery around gardening and agriculture in the Biblical Narrative.

Many trees, vines, stalks of grain, seeds, grass, flowers, and fruit find their way into the 66 books of the Bible.

The Lint family does not garden. We have black thumbs and while we are coachable and able to learn new things, we rarely remember to do the things necessary to keep the right plants alive and the weeds away. Yet, one spring my children asked if we could grow pumpkins.

I don't know about you all, but when your kids ask to do something as wholesome as growing pumpkins to carve for Halloween, I wanted to be the kind of parent that says, "Yes." Brenda and I knew our history with anything that could be considered a plant, yet did not want to fail our children in this moment, so we called upon some agricultural experts in our lives and let them know the whole situation. We were told to take our kids to the hardware store and let them pick out their favorite pumpkin seeds and they would take care of the rest.



Days later our Gardening Angel showed up with three 5-gallon buckets, some spades and rakes. She worked with my kids for several hours and used all 15 gallons of

sheep manure to create a garden with 4 mounds and hope for a bountiful harvest.

In the 13th Chapter of Luke, Jesus tells the story of a gardener offering to save a barren fruit tree by digging up the soil around it and adding manure to it so that it will thrive and bear fruit. During this time of Lent we have been working alongside a Book by Rev. Tom Berlin called, "RESTORED: Finding Redemption in Our Mess." Maybe the work of restoration requires the same thing the fruit tree and the pumpkins needed, a little more mess to be made. We look forward to spring and the first flowers

and the seeds that will grow in their seasons. May we do the work now in our own lives, in our families, in our church, community and world to dig deeper stand in the manure and find God's gift of growth in from and through our messes. May the fruit that is produced in its season be a blessing to the world.

By the way, don't forget to water the mounds regularly!

program is for everyone of all ages!



Dakotas Camping for Everyone



The mission of Dakotas Camping is simple: Helping campers and guests to experience Christ, creation and community through camp and retreat ministries. The camps offer a place apart to experience

Christ through study, nature, and the welcome provided to all just as they are. The three Dakota's camps have unique settings to experience creation and be reminded of the importance of creation care. However, the community is what most people remember from camping experiences. This make-shift unit that is created in days can become a lifelong friendship. This experience gives you access to mentors and allows all to be leaders and teachers of Christ's love. This place is where you find acceptance as you are. Lives have been changed by attending our camps. So, what does that mean for me?

- 1. Financially support it. Quite a few years ago the conference made the decision that camps should support themselves instead of relying on apportionment dollars. You can help support one of the camps, or you can give to the general camping fund which oversees all of the camps. You can also donate within Spearfish UMC to provide a week of camp for someone. Camping costs have gone up and some find it difficult to fund themselves. We can make a difference. The church has committed to paying half of the expenses, but you can offer to pay the other half. You can also support a specific project at one of the camps.
- 2. You can volunteer. Many parents work so taking time off to drive to camp is another expense. You can offer to make that commute. You can volunteer as a worker. Small projects are always needing to get done. Cleaning needs to happen. Cooking needs to happen. You can make a difference by asking what is needed and then offering services at every level.
- 3. **You can pray.** Prayers for our leaders, campers, and staff are needed especially during the summer but all year round.
- 4. You can give a space for those campers who

- **attend to tell their story.** Be interested in their adventure and see how a person changed at camp can bring back some of that energy to our church.
- 5. You can be support through letter writing. How amazing would it be if every camper got a letter from someone in their home church with a note saying they are excited for them.
- 6. You can use the camps. Our camps host outside groups as a way to offer Christ to others. This means your quilting retreat can take place at camp. Your family reunion can take place at camp. Your yearly meeting can take place at camp. You can also set up a day-trip to tour and see how much has changed and how amazing it is.
- 7. **You can commit to sending campers.** There are family camps, elementary camps, middle-school camps, high-school camps, adult camps. There is a camp for everyone and if not, maybe you just haven't invented it yet.



BH Foster Parent Association



The Black Hills Foster Parent Association has been around for 50 years. We did not get our 501C3 till 30 years ago.

As an association, our main desire is to encourage foster families. It is not an easy

journey that they have chosen to walk out. Sometimes children come so wounded that it is exhausting.

Classes are provided each month for foster families to obtain credit towards their annual license. Fun activities are provided throughout the year for families to connect and to give them an opportunities to take a little break. School supplies are provided and help with extracurricular activities.

Our main purpose is to provide welcome bags for children when they come into care. Most of the time when they come into care, they come with only the clothes on their back. Often, they come in the middle of the night and that makes it challenging for them and for their new family if they have nothing with them.

In the welcome bags, we provide hygiene items, pajamas, a new outfit, underwear and socks, diapers and wipes, if necessary, and a new toy and book to let them know that they are special. So, we are always in need of items for our bags.


