

How Do We Hear Music?

I have long been fascinated by the strange reality that we all sense things differently. Why do some people see the difference between Tiffany Blue and Medium Turquoise and others think that they both might

be green? I am not even talking about those who have literal color blindness and see certain colors as shades of grey while others see bright red or green. Having a large family I am still surprised by taste buds and the ways people actually sense different "notes" in various foods. Our brains process temperature changes and textures that we touch in different ways. I can not smell skunks while others are overwhelmed by their scent.

This is part of what brings me to wonder about music. There are biological differences in how much we hear compared to other creatures and that range and nuance changes with age or training or damage to our hearing. There are some people who have better than average hearing in one range of notes but much less in other ranges. Each of these realities impacts how people hear music. There are many more cultural and regional differences as well. We are often raised to like certain things or dislike certain things, but often that is one of the first ways we rebel, and we choose music that our parents think is noise.

But you may be asking after two paragraphs what this has to do with our faith or the Church. For many people, worship is directly impacted by the "type" of music that is involved in the worship. What I like may be too loud and "obnoxious"

for you to feel like you are worshiping, and what you like may be too "lofty" for someone else. Some care deeply about the words, while others don't even know what they are saying.

All of this could lead us to only encounter music and worship in the ways that "work for us." Yet, I would challenge us to do the opposite. Encounter the powerful music of this world and ask people how this music impacts them. Allow your love for music to help you to explain to others the beauty of the music and the gift that

God has given in that music. Like in most things, we should explore and share rather than hide in our comfort zones. We all can be blessed by opening ourselves to hear differently (or sense in other ways as well). God can bless us through country music, rap music, the harpsicord, and in music that I have never even heard of.



Dear Congregation:



We have some great news and some not-so-great news. The great news is that, due to a government program left over from the COVID years, the SUMC organization has received about \$116,000. This is basically a payroll tax refund because SUMC retained all employees in

the COVID year 2020. The company who did all the work to verify our eligibility to the government was paid 15% of the total. This left about \$35,000 for the church, about \$62,000 for Children First, and about \$2,000 for the Carr Education Center, based on the 2020 payrolls of each entity. Regarding the church's share of \$35,000 the Stewardship & Finance Committee, with an eye on the future, decided to invest \$20,000 of this money. That leaves \$15,000 for current needs for the church.

Now for the not-so-great news – the church needs a new boiler, cost about \$23,000. We have \$15,000 from the COVID money. Trustees and Stewardship & Finance will use the Trustee Emergency Reserve for the other \$8,000. The new boiler will not be an emergency until about October, however we need to get started on the project now since it takes time to get parts and build a boiler in the church basement. Taking \$8,000 from our Emergency Reserve will almost completely use up that fund. We may need emergency money for some situation in the future, so the Reserve needs to be replenished as soon as possible. Will you help? If you feel called to help replenish the church Emergency Reserve, please make your check out to the church and indicate "Emergency Reserve" in the memo spot. As always, we are grateful for your support of your church. Thank you. Stewardship & Finance Committee



This month it will be **Sunday, June 15 at 5pm** and will feature Spanakopita. Please join us or contact Kevin Nakajima for more information.


United Women in Faith (UWF)

Mission of the Month Solar Oven Partners (SOP)

Our Mission of the month for June is Solar Oven Partners. SOP started in the Dakotas UMC conference

some 20+ years ago to address the deforestation and health issues from cooking with charcoal and wood in poor countries. Wood/charcoal smoke is damaging to lungs and eyes, as well as quite expensive. In addition, water or milk can be pasteurized in the same oven.

SOP now manufactures oven components in the

Dakotas and places solar ovens in the Dominican Republic, Sierra Leone in Africa, and the Navajo and Hopi reservations in New Mexico. Participants attend 2 days of



seminars where they learn how to assemble and care for their solar oven, and practice cooking local food with this new method. The oven they take home includes 2 pots with lids, a bread pan, utensils, water pasteurizing indicator, potholders, cookbook with local recipes in local language, etc. Participants do pay a small percentage of the cost of the ovens as well as attending classes so they can use the oven effectively.

SOP now builds oven components in 4 places in the



Dakotas. The closest is Open Heart UMC in Rapid City, where Spearfish members have worked in the reflector workshop.

Interested? How can you get involved??? Teams to the Navajo nation in New

Mexico, Dominican Republic and Sierra Leone are forming for this summer and fall. Others of you may help by sewing potholders or utensil bags needed for the next shipment, and volunteers are needed at all the workshops.


