Pondering Prayerfully with the Pastor Paul

Acts 10:1-36

I have heard many people complain about "young people" or "this generation" or some other reference to people not as mature as

they are. The complaints often have to do with work ethic or care for others and often mention smart phones and intentional isolation. I wonder how many of these people who make such comments have made the effort to spend time listening and sharing life and stories with those they complain about.

The story of Cornelius and Peter found in the 10th chapter of Acts is one of the theme scriptures for this summer's camp curriculum and I was blessed to walk alongside some of those young people of this generation as we learned about this interesting and challenging story. In between long hikes in the beautiful Black Hills, intense (yet friendly and encouraging toward "old people" trying our best) games of volleyball, delicious meals, and teambuilding, we learned about what it meant for us to listen to God and let God's dreams challenge us to change the world. None who experienced the way this group rallied together to stain fences, decks, and cabins would ever believe that these amazing disciples didn't want to work. None who sat and listened to their explanations of the ways they felt God calling them to create more just systems, stand up for those who feel silenced, or put their time and energy in healing the division of our current world would dare to claim that even one of these children of God didn't care about others.

After walking with a group that spent a week together learning how to be in relationship with others who thought and felt differently while challenging and encouraging each other to live lives that make a difference with a God who loves them and fills them with the gifts and power to serve well, I spent a few days with another group of those "young people," of "this generation." The new youth leaders of your Conference Council on Youth Ministries are taking the mantel and trusting God to use them to inspire and guide others on


their spiritual journeys. I rejoice that "this generation" of "young people" are already leading and allowing God to move them in ways that will change the Church and transform the world.

We may not always understand what you say or want to follow what you do as you follow Jesus because it is uncomfortable or weird, but God clearly is calling and using you and what God calls clean I will not call unclean. Go with God to turn the world upside down.

We often find comfort in our own perspective on pretty much everything. Trying to understand what others see and experience can seem like either a waste of time or impossible to accomplish so we don't try.

about each of us, how we relate to others, and what it means to tell stories or the story.

While we each have something to bring to this conversation we will first be listening to voices from various tribes and nations who will open the scriptures to us in a unique and beautiful way. Along this Spirit Walk, we will be challenged and will be invited to see the world from a different perspective or even many different perspectives.

discussing the material and ideas of this book along with the Biblical texts that are lifted up in each chapter.

prayer, quiet reflection and meditative singing. Center your spirit, heart, and mind. Enjoy the quiet. Refresh your soul.




Children First Update
