

## **Prayerfully Pondering with Pastor Paul**

### **Belonging**

*Luke 19: 1-26*

There are times in our lives that we are reminded over and over that we do not “fit in.” Whether it is a memory from your time in school or rejection of someone you were interested in dating or repeated job applications and interviews that ended without an offer, you have felt unwanted or unworthy.

Often, we do not consciously recognize our deep desire to belong, but there are reminders to us that make it bubble closer to the surface. Anniversaries of a loss, seeing people who used to be friends having a good time without you, or holidays often highlight feelings of loneliness and isolation.

People want to be seen, heard, and valued and we as the Church are uniquely equipped to provide such community. In the reading from Luke, we are reminded of the gift that is Belonging.

The story of Zaccheus can open our eyes to ways that our distrust, anger, and frustration can set up barriers for people to feel like they can be a part of the saving and transforming love of Jesus. When we see people as part of our community rather than a problem, hear the hopes and dreams of a person, and value each individual as a gift from God with skills, knowledge, experience, and passions, lives can be transformed.

What I really appreciate about the reading from Luke is that the parable of the investors directly follows the story of Zaccheus offering to reinvest his money back into the people he had harmed. We are reminded that as we recognize our place and value to God, we are invited to use our time, our attention, our skills, our stories, our property, our ideas all as investments of what God has entrusted to us.

You belong ... we belong ... make sure others know that each person belongs!

## Trustee Goals for 2026



As we all know, our home requires routine maintenance to keep it safe, secure, and comfortable. A few examples: heating and air conditioning, plumbing, electrical, windows, painting, landscape, and driveway maintenance. The Spearfish UMC is no different than our home. This maintenance falls under the responsibility of the Board of Trustees (BOT).

Much like with our own homes, sometimes certain tasks and maintenance items must be placed on hold due to lack of time or lack of funds. Our church home is in need of a little TLC (tender loving care) and with your help of prayers, gifts, and services, we can begin to tackle some of the things on the "to-do list". Here are some items on the list:

- A fresh coat of paint for the basement
- Continued maintenance and TLC for the Memorial Garden and CEC grounds
- Maintenance and TLC for the parsonage and landscape and grounds, including retaining walls and paint on the west side of the parsonage

If you are interested and able to help with any of these tasks, please let the church office or myself know. We would love your assistance!

We anticipate holding a spring clean-up day in April for both the church and the parsonage, which is another great opportunity to lend a helping hand! We will announce the date for this soon.

Additionally, the BOT would like to establish and budget for a yearly HVAC fund to cover larger, anticipated expenses, such as the boilers, the air conditioning units, and parking lot asphalt. The asphalt replacement estimates are over \$200,000. We replaced one of three boilers in 2025 for \$23,000. Any financial contribution to these funds would be much appreciated. And to those who have already contributed, Thank You!

The Trustees do what we can with our time and talent and we owe these folks, along with anyone that serves on a committee or as a volunteer, our utmost gratitude. Thank you for your prayers and your time, talent, and gifts!
